Rules and Regulations

Please read carefully.

RESPONSIBILITY

No responsibility will be accepted by the Pinto Horse Association of NSW Inc. or Hawkesbury Showground, or anybody concerned with the show for loss or damage to persons or property. All persons exhibiting are subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Pinto Horse Association of NSW Inc. Any person giving misleading information or making false statements concerning any entry may be disqualified.

JUDGES

Judges may be altered should circumstances change. No discussion will be entered into.

JUDGES DECISION

The decision of the judge is final in all events.

BEHAVIOUR OF EXHIBITORS

Any person who in the opinion of the Show Committee or a judge is found to be abusive to any exhibit or exhibitor, judge or Show Official or spectator may be asked to remove themselves and their exhibits from the grounds of K-Ranch Arena immediately. No discussion will be entered into. Any horse who in the opinion of the Judge/Steward/Ringmaster or committee member, that is behaving in a dangerous or uncontrollable manner will be asked to leave the ring immediately.

SWABBING

The Committee reserves the right to swab any horse.

AGE OF HORSES

Age of all horses is calculated from 1 August. All ridden and driven horses must be three years of age and over.

REGISTRATION AND MEMBERSHIP

All horses must be either foal recorded, if under the age of three years, or adult registered if 3 years of age and over with a state Pinto Association. Registration certificates and numbers must be allocated prior to the show; no horse will be eligible to compete as pending. **All exhibitors must be financial members of the applicable State Pinto Association.** All classes where the rider or handler is judged (eg rider classes, handler classes, sporting events, youth events) **may only be entered by a financial member of a state Pinto Association.** Insurance declarations must be signed and completed otherwise entries will not be accepted.

BROOD MARES

Brood mares must have a foal at foot, or the exhibitor must produce a current Veterinary Certificate or a positive pregnancy test, or must be visibly in foal (at the discretion of the judge). Brood Mares are not eligible to compete in any other classes other than Best Presented, Best Marked, Progeny Groups, Double and Single Registered, and Ridden Classes, if less than six months in foal. The winner of the led Brood Mare class is eligible to compete for Supreme Led Mare of Show.

FOALS

No foal under three months of age may be shown without its dam. All foals must be led in a halter and are not to be let run free. Entries to foal classes will only be accepted if the original relevant State certificate of foal identification or permanent registration is presented to the Show Secretary at the time of entry.

STALLIONS

Stallions must be under control at all times. Stallions three years and over must be shown in a halter and chain or bridle and bit. All colts and stallions must be handled at all times by a person eighteen years of age and over. There will be no exceptions to these requirements. No colts or stallions may compete in Youth Classes or any other class for competitors under the age of eighteen years.

VETERAN

Veterans must be 15yrs or over and may also compete in appropriate sex/height class over 4 years

HEIGHT MEASURING & IDENTIFICATION

All horses must be identified. All horses must be measured, unless they are over 5yrs old and either hold a current EA or Hack Council measuring certificate OR were over 5yrs and measured at the 2023 National Pinto Championships. Exhibitors are encouraged to send in a copy of current height certificates with their entries. Junior horses must be entered under the height of their dam, unless they already exceed that height. Please note: It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to notify the Show Secretary immediately if an exhibit needs to be transferred to a different class or classes.

EXHIBIT NUMBERS

Numbers will be allocated for both individual horse classes and rider/handler classes. The catalogue will specify the number to be displayed by the exhibitor in each class, please ensure the correct number is used in all classes.

PROTESTS

Any protest must be lodged in writing to the Show Secretary within 30 minutes of the event and be accompanied by \$200. A refund of this fee will be made should the protest be upheld, otherwise it will be forfeited.

CHANGES AND DIVISION OF CLASSES

The Committee reserves the right to delete, cancel or alter any event. Classes may be divided or combined according to entries. The Committee reserves the right to change the ring in which an event has been listed at any time.

SUITABLE ATTIRE/HELMETS

All competitors must be suitably attired. No attire bearing the name or logo of any exhibitor stud may be worn while competing in any event. Competitors in ridden events must wear a helmet conforming to the current ASA standard or better with the exception of competitors eighteen(18) years of age and over in Western events or Working Stock Horse events, where HSAA regulations for attire will apply. Helmets and properly fitting riding boots must be worn whilst riding any horse at any time on the grounds of K-Ranch Arena. Sporting competitors must wear riding boots and a helmet conforming to the current ASA standard. A western saddle must be used in Western Pleasure events. In Best Presented and Handler classes gloves and a hat must be worn. Exhibitors in led classes must wear enclosed, leather shoes or boots. It is unacceptable for junior handlers and riders to wear long boots, short boots should be worn for all classes and gloves should be worn for Junior Handler classes.

TINY TOTS & LEAD-LINE RIDER CLASSES

Riders in these classes must wear properly fitting riding boots or a similar boot with heel, a properly fitted helmet conforming to the current ASA standard or better, with a chin strap, and be led from a leading rein. Riders competing in these classes are ineligible to compete in any other ridden class, with the exception of Fancy Dress events.

FANCY DRESS

All competitors riding in Fancy Dress classes must wear a properly fitted helmet conforming to the current ASA standard or better and riding boots or similar heeled boots. No workout will be given.

NOVICE HORSE OR RIDER

For the purposes of this show, a Novice horse or rider is defined as one who has not won a first ribbon in a Pinto/Open Ridden or Rider Class at any State Show, National Show, Coloured Spectacular or Royal Show. Novice horses must be ridden in a snaffle bit. Whips, spurs and drop nosebands are acceptable. Winners of Novice Stallion, mare and gelding eligible for Best Novice/Newcomer of Show

NEWCOMER

A Newcomer hack is one that has not been shown under saddle, (this includes dressage) prior to the 1st of January in its first year of being shown. Once shown under saddle, such horse ceases to be a Newcomer on the 31st of December that same year. All horses in Newcomer classes shall be shown in a snaffle bit. Winners of Newcomer Stallion, mare and gelding eligible for Best Novice/Newcomer of Show

PLEASURE CLASSES

Pleasure Pony/Hack/Galloway - no whips, spurs, drop nosebands or martingales may be used. Jointed snaffle bits only.

YEARLING AND TWO YEAR OLD SWEEPSTAKES

These classes are open to yearling colts, fillies or geldings and two year old colts, fillies and geldings respectively. All entry fees for this class will be placed into the prize pool and be divided accordingly.

SNAFFLE BIT MATURITY

This class is open to three, four and five year old stallions, mares and geldings. All entry fees for this class will be placed into the prize pool and be divided accordingly. Horses entered in this class must be ridden in a snaffle bit. Whips, spurs and drop nosebands are acceptable.

Prize pool: 1st: 50% 2nd: 30% 3rd: 20%

ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

On-line entries and postal entries will NOT BE ACCEPTED unless they are accompanied by a photocopy of both sides of the horse's registration certificate, and any other registrations held if entering an exhibit in double-registered classes. Exhibitors are encouraged to enclose a photocopy of any current height certificate and insurance waiver form posted to PO Box 96, Austral NSW 2179.

Incorrect paperwork will be returned and a fee of \$20 will be charged. If you are unsure of anything please contact us before you send in your entry to avoid this fee.

Please contact us if you are unsure about anything in this program. All entries will be acknowledged in way of receipt.

REFUND OF ENTRY FEES

No entry fee will be refunded after the closing date of entries.

ENTRIES ON THE DAY

Only entries for sporting classes will be accepted on the day, provided the horse is already entered in other classes, . You WILL NOT be able to enter any other class on the day.

STABLING AND CAMPING

Stabling and camping are available at Hawkesbury showground for the duration of the show and must be arranged by contacting Hawkesbury showground info@hawkesburyshow.com.au

INSURANCE

All exhibitors, handlers and riders must either be a financial Member of the Pinto Horse Association of NSW Inc, Arabian Horse Society of Australia (AHSA) or an Affiliate of the AHSA and **MUST** complete an insurance waiver form. Photocopies of AHSA, or Affiliate AHSA membership must be provided with entries if you are not a member of the Pinto Horse Association of NSW Inc.

OR

Any exhibitor, handler or rider who does not meet one of these conditions must pay an insurance levy of \$13.00 in order that insurance cover be provided for that person for the duration of the National Pinto Championships 2025. Non -member insurance waiver **MUST be signed**.

Exhibitors should note that any person providing false or misleading information with respect to insurance cover will be held personally liable in the event of a claim.

WESTERN CLASSES – all Western classes will be judged under HSAA rules please familiarize yourself with these rules prior to entry. Correct attire and tack must be worn.

DEFINITIONS

WESTERN PLEASURE – **Western tack and attire mandatory, senior horses must be bitted and ridden one handed**

All riding for Western Pleasure classes is done with almost no contact with the Bit. The horse is obedient to the lightest lift or touch of the rein against the neck and contact with the leg and seat. All the critical attributes of the Western Pleasure horse should be present for those entering the Hunter and Trail classes. Horses that will do well should be soft travelling, although the Hunter class will require more contact. Class requirements are: Mandatory to go around the arena both ways at a walk, a jog, a lope. You may be asked to change direction from the halt, walk or jog only. You must back up when asked to. An extended jog may be asked for.

TRAIL – Western tack and attire mandatory (except introductory class)

Trail is an arena event, but it is directly related to riding on bush trails. It confirms the suitability of the horse as a pleasurable, adaptable trail horse. Obstacles are used to simulate situations that may be out in a paddock or in rough country. It is not designed to be an obstacle course but a test of obedience and style. The primary object of a trail class is to show the horse's ability to get from one point to another safely and swiftly – no matter what obstacles are present. The Trail class is a practical part of riding. For this event you are looking for a horse that is going to be safe and alert. It should not be timid or over-reactive, and not 'switched off' either (that is, noticing nothing). The horse must negotiate obstacles smoothly and efficiently. If a horse can pick its way through a course, rather than being completely controlled by a rider, it will be given credit. A good Trail horse is one that has a kind, giving attitude, is careful, willing and quiet. The horse is asked to jog and lope as it would on the trail ride. It is asked to walk, jog or lope from one obstacle to another as well as over obstacles such as poles. There is a minimum of six obstacles, three of which are mandatory. The mandatory obstacles are (1) crossing over of four poles, (2) opening and closing a gate and (3) obstacle requiring a back through. This back-through may be parallel poles in an 'L', 'V' or 'U' shape; it may be a straight or similar shaped obstacle where the horse must back through poles, around cones or around drums or pot plants. The course builder may make up another three other non-mandatory obstacles to add to the course. In Trail events, you require from your horse, attention, cooperation and coordination. Ultimately, you are demonstrating a high degree of training. The horse must give the rider complete control of its body. The rider must have the ability to put the horse wherever it is asked to be put. The obstacles are simply the means to demonstrate this ability. To perform well, the rider must, first of all, have the ability to perform the actual physical actions without the obstacles, and then, with the introduction of the obstacles, show that the horse is aware of each, and that it is obedient to the rider while retaining attention and alertness. You must be able to ask your horse to place its feet where you want them to be, to move its quarter and front end separately, to back up, to side pass and to hold correctly as requested. The advantage of the Trail event is that it is something everybody can do. As you train and progress with time and patience, you will be able to try more difficult courses and classes. A horse may not be a natural trail horse to begin with but can become really competitive. Obviously, there are 'natural' horses that will take a lot less work, but Trail is an event that everybody can try and in which they can accomplish a great deal. There is much self-satisfaction in it, as it provides an opportunity to score individually. In Trail events you are able to see your score sheet at the end of the class to gauge how you fared in the opinion of the judge. There is a reasonable amount of consistency throughout the judging, as the standards are set so that you can gauge how you are improving and how you are accomplishing your manoeuvres.

LED TRAIL Western tack and attire mandatory (If you enter led trail you cannot enter the ridden trail with the same horse.)

Led Trail will be judged in the manner of the ridden trail event.

HUNTER UNDER SADDLE – English tack and attire must have plain brow band

The Hunter Under Saddle class aims to show the horse's movements between jumps and is often called 'English' showing because hacking gear is used. It is appropriate to wear tweed (rather than dressage gear which, however, is still acceptable) as the look is more 'hunt' than formal as in the case of Show Hack classes. The Hunter Under Saddle horse must travel longer but still very evenly, rhythmically and calmly. The seat is more active, the stirrups shorter as for hunting. The pace is

ground covering, the gait flat and smooth. The horse will have a far longer stride and as a result, be travelling faster, but it is the length of stride rather than the speed which will be judged. Mandatory class requirements are walk, trot and canter each way around the arena on the rail. Reverse is asked for only from halt, walk, trot. A back-up is required. An extended trot or hand gallop can be requested.

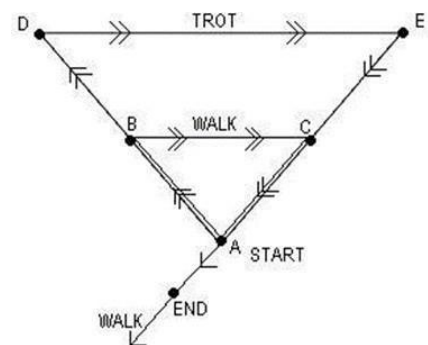
HUNTER HACK English tack and attire must have plain brow band

In Hunter Hack classes, the horse actually takes the jumps representing those on a hunt field. This tests the collection, calmness, obedience, and ability of the horse as a Hunter Hack. The Hunter Hack event has two phases. The first phase consists of two jumps. The jumps may be 2' but are more usually 2'9". The standard of the competition and the age of the horses competing influences jumping heights. After the first phase the finalists will be selected. These will be the horses with no jumping faults and horses with few jumping faults. The finalists are then asked to go on to the 'rail'(arena) to do flatwork 'along the rail'. In rail work they perform in the same style as in the Hunter Under Saddle event. The Hunter Hack horse progresses from the Hunter Under Saddle horse in that it jumps and is asked to do so in a flowing, consistent style. It must respond kindly and easily to the rider's aids, go forward and hold its collection. Jumps in Hunter Hack are meant to be taken with the horse maintaining a steady rhythm before, during and after the jump. The horse should travel cleanly in front and be rounded over the fence. Roundness, collection, softness, with consistent stride and gait are essential between and over the jumps for this event.

HUNTER IN HAND

Handlers must wear plain black or white polo shirt and black pants and Joggers. Jodphurs and long black boots or short elastic sided boots and gaiters can be worn with a polo shirt. No jacket or hat to be worn.

Horses will be judged individually on the triangle following a posted order. The horses will approach the judging arena and set up for inspection (ie with all four legs of the horse visible by the judge standing on either side of the horse). At the Judge's request, the horse will then walk a small triangle ABCA. At A the horse will continue on at a trot following the large triangle ADEA, trotting past A to end. At the completion of the judging the handler will lead the horse away from the judging arena, as that horse leaves the next one will promptly enter the judging arena. When all horses in the class have completed the triangle, they may be lined up for the judge to place or walk in a large circle around the judge before placing.



BRIDLE PATH HACK

The horse should move with a rounder outline, hindquarter well under to achieve plenty of impulsion and resulting in the poll being carried much higher. Paces should be balanced with cadence, and the horse should move forward with ease and smoothness. Horses should be obedient, have bright expression and should respond willingly with light contact. Transition should be smooth and flow. The head position should be slightly in front of, or on, the vertical.

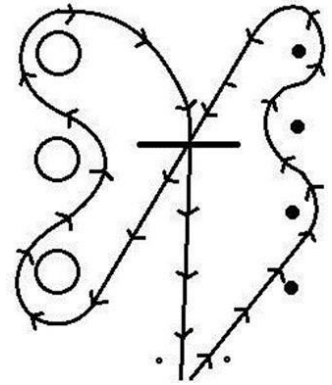
SHOWMANSHIP

The showmanship class will be judged strictly on the exhibitor's ability to show the horse at halter. The horse is merely a prop to demonstrate the ability and preparation of the exhibitor. The ideal showmanship performance consists of a poised, confident, neatly attired competitor leading a well groomed and well conditioned horse. The exhibitor quickly and efficiently performs the requested pattern with promptness, smoothness and precision. Patterns are designed to test the handler's ability to effectively present a horse to the judge.

SCUDDA HO

Course: Start on left-hand side of first peg, and then bend alternately. Turn extreme, peg to the left. Jump bounce jump. Turn first barrel to the right, then bend alternately. Turn extreme, barrel to the right Jump bounce jump. Back through finishing pegs.

Elimination: Knocking down or breaking any obstacle. Error of course. Knocking down start/finish pegs. Fall of horse or Rider.



SHOW HORSE CHALLENGE

This class is for horses 3 years old and over on 1st August, 2025. Horse & Rider/Handler combination will be judged as both led and saddle horses over two phases including Manners & Paces, Conformation, Saddlery & Attire. Scores from each phase will be tallied to give an overall winner. One horse/rider combination only.

CLASS DESCRIPTION

This class will be judged over two days, Saturday after the led sweepstakes phase one will be judged for conformation, manners and paces, saddlery and attire. Sunday after the snaffle bit maturity the ridden workout, manners paces saddlery & attire will be judged.

To be judged as Open Ridden Hack Class.

Horses are to be presented, groomed & ridden as open hack – English Riding Attire, Gloves, Weymouth, Pelham or Snaffle Bridles, Rosettes or English Plaits and English Saddle essential.

Hacking Canes, Riding Crops and/or Spurs optional. NO

DRESSAGE WHIPS permitted

This class will be adjudicated by three judges.

Grand Champion and Runner up awards.

Ribbons for top 10 depending on number of entries.

Ridden Workout

Walk to judges, halt, present for inspection.

Walk out to left, commence trot, turn right, extend trot across, then pick up right canter lead, commence three loop serpentine at canter with two lead changes of your choice. At the completion of the serpentine extend canter across, return to canter turning right then back through the paces to halt in front of judges, rein back three paces then walk to the end of the exhibitor line up.

MOST VERSATILE PINTO

We have reintroduced the Most Versatile Pinto High Point Award, there is no fee, however you must nominate, one horse one rider applies, whilst other riders may use the horse only classes where the horse is ridden by the nominated rider count.

This award is designed to highlight the Versatility of our Pinto, the horse that is competitive over a variety of disciplines, eg) dressage, hacking, trail etc.

Entrants must compete over the entire three days of the show in a range of nominated classes. By using a combination of nominated classes it shows the true versatility of our breed while putting everyone on a level playing field.

The winner will be the horse and rider combination who have gained the most points at the completion of the Sunday events.

You will need to nominate which classes you wish to go towards this award at the time of entries close date.

Rules

- One handler/rider must be nominated per horse
- Points will be awarded as follows:

First - 6 points

Second - 5 points

Third - 4 points

Fourth - 3 points

Fifth - 2 points

Sixth - 1 point

- The following Friday classes count. A minimum of two of the following classes must be entered, however you may enter all if you wish :
 - One Dressage test
 - One Trail (excluding introductory trail)
 - Bridle Path Hack OR Hunter Hack
 - Hunter Under Saddle
 - Western Pleasure OR Working Stockhorse
 - Harness

The following Saturday classes count:

- Best Marked Overo/Sabino OR Tobiano/Tobero
- Led age/height class
- 2 Sporting classes which need to be pre entered as many as you like **however only your highest two placings will count** - not entered on the day

- The following Sunday classes count:
 - Ridden age/height class
 - One ridden hack class
- In the event of a tie the horse with the highest place in the relevant halter class will be used. In the event there is still a tied combination the highest placed combination in the relevant ridden age class will be used.
- Rider and handler classes do not count
- No points will be given for Champion, Reserve, Best of Show or Supremes will be counted.

HIGH POINT WESTERN HORSE

As there are no championships awarded in the western riding section of the show there will be a High Point Western Horse Award, the following Friday classes count towards this Award:

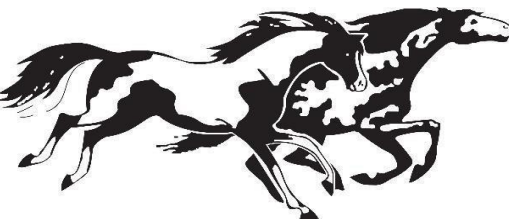

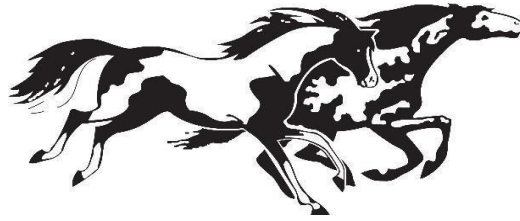
