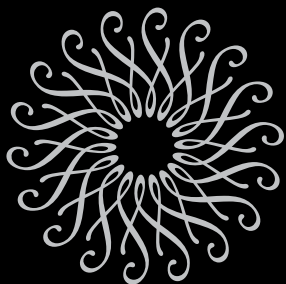

Auction begins at 7 pm



Engage in a live auction of bonsai trees, provided by participating vendors, nurseries, Longwood Gardens, and The Kennett Collection. A portion of the proceeds supports local nonprofit bonsai clubs.

Auction bidder registration begins June 27 at 12 pm and lasts until 6:45 pm. All bidders are required to provide a credit card and identification for registration. All registered bidders will be given a bidder number paddle with which to bid during the auction. Bids will not be accepted from any bidder that does not display a bidder number paddle.

At the end of the auction or at any time during the auction, a bidder may return their number paddle and pay for any tree(s) they have purchased. Payment may be made in cash or by credit card, with a 15% buyer's premium added to all cash transactions and an 18% buyer's premium added to all credit card transactions. Upon payment, buyers will receive a completed tree release form from the cashier for the specific tree number they purchased. This release form will provide instructions for pick-up.

Access to the auction is free with Gardens Admission.



1. Jade
Portulacaria afra

Age: 18 years

Years in training: 16

Size: (H) 10 inches, (W) 28 inches, (D) 10 inches

Container: South Korea

Notes: Originally started in 2008.

2. Cork-bark Chinese Elm
Ulmus parvifolia 'Suberosa'

Age: Approximately 30 years

Years in training: 25

Size: (H) 33 inches, (W) 27 inches, (D) 24 inches

Container: Japanese, Tokoname-ware

Notes: Started from young cuttings of Cork-bark Chinese elms which were grouped together to form a clump. Now a couple of decades later they have all fused together. The rough bark is especially appreciated in winter.

3. Shimpaku Juniper Itoigowa

Notes: Very well-developed Shimpaku

4. Trident Maple
Acer buergerianum

Age: Approximately 40 years

Years in training: 35

Size: (H) 27 inches, (W) 29 inches, (D) 26 inches

Container: Chinese

Notes: Started from a young container-grown seedling which had a hollow under the base. Student in South Carolina bought a native stone for the base. Unfortunately the stone color is not the best because it matches the bark. Several small seedling Trident maples were inarched grafted to the trunk base to appear as roots clinging to a rock. The rock is in there, but you must search for it.

6. Koto Hime Japanese Maple
Acer palmatum 'Koto Hime'

Age: Approximately 50 years

Years in training: 50

Size: (H) 34 inches, (W) 19 inches, (D) 19 inches

Container: American, Joseph Godwin, for Yuji Yoshimura

Notes: Started from a cutting rooted in 1970 and completely container-grown and -trained. The mature bark is grey and shows the age of this bonsai. It is in a rather unusual form with the low branch crossing, but not touching the trunk. Can be appreciated from many front views. An excellent and distinctive focal point raises the level of elegant beauty.

Magnolia stellata

Container: Chinese

Notes: Reliably blooms each spring. Last repotted in 2024.

8. Mugo Pine
Pinus mugo

Age: Approximately 40 years

Years in training: 35

Size: (H) 30 inches, (W) 26 inches, (D) 25 inches

Container: Japanese Tokoname-ware

Notes: Developed from a young container-grown nursery stock seedling. Originally created in an informal upright style, then a large prominent branch was removed to develop this tree in the literati style. It is an accomplishment to keep the trunk in the same diameter for over 30 years. The rough flaky bark adds beauty and the feeling of age to this elegant design.

10. Daruma Dwarf Ezo Spruce
Picea jezoensis 'Daruma'

Age: 56 years

Years in training: 56

Size: (H) 20 inches, (W) 26 inches, (D) 21 inches

Container: Japanese, Tokoname-ware, handmade for this bonsai by Gyozan

Notes: Ezo spruce bonsai in the United States are rare. Even more difficult to find are dwarf (yatsubusa) cultivars. There are many different cultivars and 'Daruma' is one of the finest. Developed from a rooted cutting in 1970 and has been completely container-grown for 56 years. This bonsai has been widely displayed and is well-known.

12. American Larch
Larix laricina

Container: Japanese, Tokoname-ware

Notes: Collected north of Toronto, Ontario, Canada in 1980. Trained in the forest style with connected roots all one tree, sinuous style. Incorrectly called "raft style", however, the original trunk is not in a straight line. Movement and depth are creative by the curved trunk. Originally developed in a deeper container while developing the canopy.

14. Colorado Blue Spruce *Picea pungens*

Age: 150+ years

Size: (H) 30 inches, (W) 30 inches, (D) 34 inches

Container: Chinese

Notes: Collected in Colorado in September 2017 by Todd Schlafer. Grown in a large plastic training pot for two years until 2019 when I shaped it.

15. European Beech *Fagus sylvatica*

Age: 35+ years

Years in training: 10+

Size: (H) 30 inches, (W) 31 inches, (D) 27 inches

Container: American slab, unknown origin

Notes: This forest planting was created from individual trees grown for many years separately. Purchased from Bill Valvanis in 2020 and developed since then.

16. Mugo Pine *Pinus mugo*

Age: Approximately 50 years

Years in training: 40

Size: (H) 32 inches, (W) 45 inches, (D) 34 inches

Container: Chinese

Notes: Developed from common nursery stock over 40 years ago. It was selected because of the short straight needles. Originally planted on a huge stone, which I could not lift. Now, I can't even lift it in the container. The heavy contorted base makes an excellent focal point for the well-tapered aged trunk.

17. Blackthorn
Prunus spinosa

Age: 25+ years

Size: (H) 26 inches, (W) 28 inches, (D) 20 inches

Container: Contemporary Chinese

Notes: Blackthorn produce small flowers in the late spring and have clumps of black berries in the fall.

18. Kishu Sargent Juniper
Juniperus chinensis var. *sargentii*
'Kishu'

Age: 45+ years

Years in training: 45

Size: (H) 8 inches, (W) 8 inches, (D) 13 inches

Container: Japanese, Tokoname-ware

Notes: This is an old, well-trained bonsai of the 'Kishu' cultivar of Sargent juniper. It was already an established bonsai when 'Kishu' was introduced to the general bonsai world. Originally trained in the semi-cascade style, then let the tree do its own thing. Easy to maintain in the high-quality deep container. Started from a cutting grown in Los Angeles, California.

20. Wild Crabapple *Malus* spp.

Age: 60+ years

Years in training: 40

Size: (H) 45 inches, (W) 45 inches, (D) 34 inches

Container: Chinese

Notes: Collected in Rochester, New York, by Joseph Noga who developed the beautiful clump style bonsai. Reliable bloomer in mid-spring with white fragrant flowers. Usually every other year it produces numerous small apples, which actually look like miniature apples. Turns clear yellow in October/November.

21. Japanese Black Pine *Pinus thunbergii*

Age: 40+ years

Years in training: 40+

Size: (H) 40 inches, (W) 27 inches, (D) 24 inches

Container: Antique Chinese pot, over 200 years old

Notes: This cascade Japanese Black Pine was grown from a seedling by Bill Valvanis for over 35 years; the tree was purchased in 2020 and has been in development since. It was shown at the 2025 MidAtlantic Bonsai Societies show and won the Best in Show award. It was also selected and displayed at the 9th US National Bonsai Exhibition.

22. Japanese Flowering Cherry *Prunus incisa* 'Kojo No Mai'

Age: Approximately 15 years

Years in training: 7

Size: (H) 21 inches, (W) 37 inches, (D) 28 inches

Container: American, Michael Hagedorn, retired artist and now a bonsai teacher

Notes: Developed from a four-foot-tall nursery plant originally used for a flower show display. Also called Little Twist cherry because of the zigzag branching. Flowers profusely in early spring with pink blossoms becoming white when mature. Sometimes forms small purple fruit.

Notes: Imported from Japan two years ago

24. Red Dragon Contorted Filbert *Corylus avellana* 'Red Dragon'

Age: Approximately 25 years

Years in training: 10

Size: (H) 22 inches, (W) 31 inches, (D) 20 inches

Container: Japanese container, Tokoname-ware from the Reiho Kiln

Notes: The Red Dragon contorted filbert is a unique plant with the small dark-maroon leaves which are very attractive when emerging in spring. This cultivar is a mutation of the Harry Lauder's walking stick which maintains the beautiful cork screw branches as the original, but only in miniature form. This clump style bonsai has two good viewing sides which comes in helpful in displays. The yellow container contrasts well with the red foliage. Usually blossoms in spring with long catkin flowers. Developed from an uncommon cultivar of a popular nursery plant.
