UNION TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS April 1, 2025 MEETING MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Union Township Supervisors was held at the Union Township Building located at 125 Sycamore Lane, Julian, Pennsylvania and was called to order by Chair Nick Taylor at 7:00 PM. Attendees included Nick Taylor, Tammy Hanscom, Michael MacNamara, Renee Swancer, Secretary/Treasurer, Solicitor Jeff Stover. Also attending were Denny Ripka, Terry Robinson, Brad Page, and Laura and Mike Reese.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. MacNamara mentioned he passed along to FNB the request to have the bank account interest at 4%.

FINANCIAL

No financials were presented due to bank statement unavailability.

MONTHLY REPORTS

 Fire company oversight committee. Ms. Hanscom reported that wing night was successful. Thermal imaging cameras were approved to purchase. Additional pagers were purchased. She reported Chief Keith Russell said that Union Township Supervisors want to amend the fire company agreement, but there have been no discussions with the fire company regarding this request. Ms. Hanscom stated that any discussions from the Supervisors would need to be generated from thru a Union Township Board meeting and reported back to the fire company thru her as a representative. Mr. MacNamara said he had a discussion with Mr. Russell, but it originated because of ISO ratings for Union Township and how it could be improved. Mr. MacNamara said the Union Township Planning Commission reviewed years ago the fire company service contracts and the existing service contract would expire soon and maybe there should be discussion regarding the contract. It was mentioned that dry hydrants throughout the Township would help with the ISO rating. Discussion centered around millage versus use rate and would a different computation rate benefit municipalities. Boggs Township is the largest contributor to the current arrangement. Ms. Hanscom stated that any municipality wanting to change the existing agreement would need to have unanimous approval of all parties. Mr. Taylor wondered if a usage rate versus a millage rate be beneficial to Union Township. After a lot of discussion among the board members, the solicitor was to draft a letter to the municipalities to see if a work session could occur. Mr. MacNamara made a motion to ask the municipalities to schedule a meeting. Mr. Taylor seconded the motion. Motion carried. Ms. Hanscom opposed.

An additional part-time road crew was discussed. Additional crew will be needed, and a retired Penn DOT worker is available to work. The solicitor stated advertising is not necessary. It was agreed to pay \$20.85 for an hourly rate and that Mr. Taylor could hire the person outside a meeting. Mr. MacNamara made the motion for Mr. Taylor to hire the employee at a rate of \$20.85/hr. if found acceptable after the interview. Mr. Taylor seconded the motion. Motion carried.
