April in Paris is a song composed by Vernon Duke with lyrics by E. Y. Harburg in 1932 for the Broadway musical Walk A Little Faster. It has been performed by many artists, including Count Basie, Frank Sinatra, Billie Holiday, and Dawn Upshaw. Here it is joined with another perennial favorite, One O'Clock Jump, a jazz standard written in 1937 by Count Basie. It was the theme song of the Count Basie Orchestra used it to close each of their concerts for a half century. These tunes have been re-orchestrated and arranged for symphony orchestra by Victor Vanacore.

This arrangement is completely out of the box attesting to Vanacore's penchant for something different. Taking a page from the David Foster songbook, Vanacore has crafted this arrangement into a driving opener complete with a short piano (Trumpet, Trombone optional) solo or an optional coda w/out soloists!

Chattanooga Choo Choo

Chattanooga Choo Choo was introduced in 1941 by the Glenn Miller Orchestra. The song was featured in the movie "Sun Valley Serenade" and was performed by Tex Beneke and the Modernaires. Harry Warren wrote the original music score, while Mack Gordon takes credit for the rhythmic words. The 1941 recording of "Chattanooga Choo Choo" by Glenn Miller and His Orchestra was inducted to the Grammy Hall of fame in 1996. This is a version for Symphony Orchestra arranged and re-orchestrated by Victor Vanacore and is most likely one of a very few versions available for Symphony Orchestra.

Cheek To Cheek

"Cheek to Cheek" is a song written by Irving Berlin in 1935 for the Fred Astaire/Ginger Rogers movie Top Hat.

While it has been recorded by many artists from Ella to Andrea, it still owes part of its fame from the Sinatra album Come Dance With Me. A Grammy Hall of Fame recipient in 2000, in 2004 Astaire's version finished at #15 on AFI's 100 Years 100 Songs survey of top tunes in American cinema.

This is a true *paso doble* and can be repeated for a 4-minute version. Fiery woodwinds, strings and trumpets will evoke a Spanish bullfight by the second measure. Adventuresome and romantic are the buzzwords for this simple Spanish melody.

Feliz Navidad

A great way to celebrate the Christmas season in Spanish and English. This very clever arrangement features your percussion section, pianist (all *montunos* are written out) and optional SATB.

Fly Me To The Moon

This 1954 hit was originally titled *In Other Words*. When Mr. Sinatra decided to record this arrangement by Quincy Jones with the Count Basie Orchestra, the title became *Fly Me To the Moon* and was closely associated with the Apollo missions.

A combination of Sinatra, Basie and Jones led to a version that became a straight swinger which explodes with energy. Vanacore's symphonic version of the Jones arrangement allows the Symphony to swing "straight ahead" even without a sax section.

Good Vibrations

One of the Beach Boys' biggest hits, *Good Vibrations* has been described as a "pocket symphony" because it featured instruments unusual for a pop song at the time. It is #6 on Rolling Stone's 500 Greatest Songs of All Time.

This orchestration features the brass section in a chorale setting, a dixieland clarinet solo (written out), plenty of pizzicato and a driving robust ending.

Granada

Granada is music: the city where Manuel de Falla wrote most of his work, where Andrés Segovia acquired his magical touch with the guitar and where the gypsies of the Sacromonte live their inimitable 'zambras' in the caves that look onto the omnipresent Alhambra. The musicality of Granada inspired the Mexican composer and poet Augustín Lara to create the most famous of his compositions: Granada, official hymn of the city, translated and sung in every language and performed during large events. This arrangement features Trumpet, vocal or any other great soloist you may want to use in your orchestra. This arrangement is in D major.

Great American Blues

Audience participation with an old fashioned American Big Band Blues. The orchestra literally turns into a big swing machine from the opening bars and ends with a "shout chorus" with the whole orchestra standing. Features any soloist in your orchestra that can play the blues. A real show stopper!

This Michael McDonald cover of another Motown hit is another great arrangement to feature your favorite male pop singer. This arrangement, originally recorded on Ray Charles' last album, "Genius Loves Company", is pop writing at it's very best and will excite your audience as a live performance. As with all Victor Vanacore vocal arrangements this presentation has special colors to delight your orchestra members too! This arrangement is in the key of F.

Hot! Hot! Hot! Opener

Aaron Copland meets Buster Poindexter. The ever-popular Fanfare for the Common Man starts off as a Salsa complete with Clave and enormous percussion accents. We finally hear Buster Poindexter's Hot! Hot!.

There are optional lyrics cued in many of the orchestra parts for that party atmosphere.

How Do You Keep The Music Playing? (Vocal)

Originally orchestrated by Vanacore for Natalie Cole's last album, this arrangement features lush strings, french horns, woodwinds and piano trio. This arrangement is ideal for a sophisticated female vocalist who can sing a very subtle and understated rendition of this iconic song. Very cinematic and perfect for Valentine's Day.

This is the most popular popt une ever written!

It Was A Very Good Year

This is a vocal feature from the Grammy Award winning album from Ray Charles "Genius Loves Company." It is a great way to feature a male singer from your community. Before Ray Charles' untimely passing, he called Victor and asked him to do an arrangement of "It Was A Very Good Year". A previous discussion with Ray many years before, revealed that Ray did not want to do any of Mr. Sinatra's material, because as Ray put it "once Frank records a song it really becomes his".

Victor then asked Ray what kind of arrangement he wanted and Ray replied with:

"Well Vic, something that does not sound like the original and perhaps a lot of musical interplay with my phrasing of the tune. Use a lot of woodwinds like on our symphony dates."

(Quote From Victor)

"Ray and I took the liberty of changing some of the lyrics in the last verse more in keeping with the kind of life Ray led."

Frances Albert Sinatra was perhaps the most dominant pop icon of the 20th century and Nelson Riddle's treatment of this tune is the quintessential example of pops arranging. This tribute to the main man and his arranger features piano (jazz style with improvisation). It can also be utilized as a vocal with big brassy sounds leaping out from the orchestra on the shout chorus. Key of Eb

This iconic singer, for whom Victor was Musical Director/Pianist at the tender young age of 26, is the most requested artist of the Christmas FM playlists for most of the musical formats available. Vanacore has taken this gem and transcribed all of the instruments on the original recording including the Choir, which is optional.

It's The Most Wonderful Time of the Year has been the centerpiece of Christmas Concerts since Johnny Mathis and Andy Williams recorded their versions many years ago. Lift Every Voice And Sing

A direct quote from the composer: "A group of young men in Jacksonville, Florida, arranged to celebrate the birthday of Abraham Lincoln in 1900. My brother J. Rosamond Johnson and I decided to write a song to be sung at the celebration. The song was taught to and sung by a chorus of five hundred colored school children.

The school children of Jacksonville kept singing it; they went off to other schools and sang it; they became teachers and taught it to other children. Within twenty years it was being sung over the South and in some other parts of the country. Today the song, popularly known as the Negro National Hymn, is quite generally used. The lines of this song repay me in an elation, almost of exquisite anguish, whenever I hear them sung."

This arrangement works wonderfully with the Vanacore arrangement of the National Anthem and America The Beautiful. The work is perfect for MLK day and the entire month of February, and is inspired by the original Kirk Franklin vocal arrangement.

Love Theme from The Godfather ("Speak Softly Love")

Luck Be a Lady

Vanacore has added his unique touch to incorporate the range of colors that only a symphony orchestra can provide.

New York, New York is the theme song from the Martin Scorsese film New York, New York (1977), composed by John Kander with lyrics by Fred Ebb. In 1979, Theme from New York, New York was re-recorded by Frank Sinatra for his album Trilogy: Past Present Future (1980) and has since become closely associated with him. He occasionally performed it live with Lisa Minnelli as a duet. Sinatra recorded it a second time for his 1993 album Duets, with Tony Bennett.

This symphonic orchestration of this iconic song leaves no instrument idle. Every part is well thought out and has become All of the "indigenous" sax lines are cued in the lower woodwinds, french horns and low strings.

Nickelodeon At The Pops #1

Nickelodeon represents a nostalgic look at favorite television themes in a medley form. Included are *Mickey Mouse, Looney Tunes, The Flintstones, Hogan's Heroes, Bonanza, Get Smart, Hawaii Five-O, Bewitched, I Dream of Jeannie, Star Trek* and the *I Love Lucy* theme. From Victor Vanacore: "The first time I heard Panis Angelicus by composer César Franck, I was struck by the simplistic beauty of this composition. When I saw Luciano Pavarotti sing this beautiful melody with his father at a Cathedral in Modena, Italy I knew I had to write an arrangement for Mixed Choir and voices."

This arrangement may be performed as a Tenor or choir feature depending on your symphony's needs and requirements.

Phantasia of the Opera

Andrew Lloyd Webber meets Bach. The *Toccata and Fugue* opens this arrangement and is then juxtaposed over Lloyd Webber's *Phantom of the Opera* theme. As with many of our arrangements, this mashup creates a very interesting result.

A fun tune for Christmas in the Stray Cats/Voodoo Daddy Style. This arrangement features a male vocal (key of C) and a short drum battle between the orchestra and drummer. Truly a burner da Capo a fine!

This masterful arrangement juxtaposes the classic samba Brazil, with the George Gershwin classic, Rhapsody In Blue. The album was the best-selling in history until 1984, when Michael Jackson's Thriller (also in our library) replaced it. These jazz classics were the centerpiece of a concert celebrating the 60th anniversary of the Berklee College of Music who commissioned the work. *Concierto de Aranjuez* by Rodrigo known as *Spain (*Chick Corea) in jazz circles is "mashed up" with the jazz vocal classic *Birdland (*Joe Zawinul). Your jazz fans will appreciate this arrangement.

Star Spangled Banner

This is a completely new and re-harmonized arrangement of the National Anthem for Symphony Orchestra. It features interesting chord structures with a majestic and stately ending. There are also rental versions for brass choir and SATB vocal choir.

Stompin' at the Savoy

"Stompin'at the Savoy" is a 1934 jazz standard composed by Edgar Sampson. It is named after the Savoy Ballroom. Although the song is credited to Benny Goodman, Chick Webb, and Edgar Sampson and the lyrics by Andy Razaf, in reality the music as written and arranged for Chick Webb's band by Sampson, who was the band's alto saxophonist. It was recorded as an instrumental by both Webb and Goodman, whose recording was the bigger hit. Lyrics were added by Andy Razaf, who wrote the lyrics to many popular songs. Goodman and Webb got their names added to the song when their bands recorded it. Judy Garland recorded the song in 1936. In 2007 Nikki Yanofsky, a Canadian jazz-pop singer, collaborated with Grammy Award-winning musicians Herbie Hancock and *The Black Eyed Peas* to record a crossover version of this swing era hit. The song was also heavily featured throughout Woody Allen's 2000 film *Small Time Crooks*.

This song was re-orchestrated in 2011 for Symphony Orchestra by Victor Vanacore and may be the only version available. Great for any swing concert.

Sweet Caroline

The Iconic song *Sweet Caroline* by Neil Diamond, is presented here in a manner that can be used several ways. First of all you can use it as a straight orchestra feature, or you can have a soloist sing it, or you can add a choir for the chorus to the soloist. In reality with a twinkle in your eye just ask the audience to sing along and you will have everyone in the hall singing at the top of their lungs. This is an audience participation going from the first note whether they know it or not. Ask the fans at Fenway Park!

This is a beautiful Victor Vanacore orchestration of the Tango in D Major by Isaac Albeniz, in which the bandoneon and guitar are emulated to capture the true classic sense of this composition. Highly cinematic in its approach, one can't help but imagine being in the heart of Buenos Aires.

The Best Is Yet To Come

"The Best Is Yet To Come" is a 1959 song composed by Cy Coleman to lyrics by Carolyn Leigh. It is associated with Frank Sinatra, who recorded it on his 1964 album "It Might As Well Be Swing". This fabulous Quincy Jones arrangement was transcribed by Victor Vanacore and of course symphonic orchestration was added to the palette in addition to the original saxophone parts which are covered in Vanacore's orchestration. Saxophones are optional.

The Duel (Deliverance)

What do you get when you mix classical themes with the theme from Deliverance? The Duel! Every instrument and section in the orchestra is featured in this arrangement. The country music movie theme from Deliverance, is paired with such classical themes as The Marriage Of Figaro, Eine Kleine Nachtmusic, Tchaikovsky's Tre Pak, The Nutcracker, and Handel's Messiah. The musical ball is thrown around the orchestra to the delight of musicians and audience alike. Of course the Banjo is optional but a great mix in the event you desire to be daring!

The Lady is a Tramp

From the Roger's and Hart musical Babes In Arm comes one of Mr. Sinatra's signature hits. She loves the cool, free, wind in her hair typically is sung about a woman who loves the "hobo" style of life living care-free without any worries whatsoever. "She's broke and that's oke". While the lyrics are not very politically correct today, they still evoke a time of reflection.

You will enjoy the interplay among the orchestra on this song as it as been totally re-orchestrated from live and recorded versions, thereby enabling your orchestra to swing the audience out of their seats.

The Lord's Prayer

Albert Hay Mallote's Lords Prayer was composed in 1935 and published by the G. Shirmer Co. When I heard the Bocelli version with the Mormon Tabernacle Choir, I was immediately impressed by the simplicity of the orchestration and the subtleness of the Choir. This orchestration was a lot of fun for me to transcribe and to add some additional instruments and ideas.

The Prayer

A composition written by Carole Bayer Sager and David Foster has been recorded by Celine Dion, Andrea Bocelli, The Mormon Tabernacle Choir and Josh Groban. This song speaks to Unity, Peace, Safety and Love; written in English and Italian, and is appropriate for any holiday. The Vanacore orchestration is in the key of Bb (C4 - Bb6) and is written for Tenor solo (optional Soprano), Tenor with SATB or Tenor alone. WW's are written to play the musical answers "if no choir" and also replace the acoustic guitar on the recording provided. The key of Bb major is retained throughout.

The Roaring 20's

This symphonic arrangement is ideal for listening or dancing. It embodies the excitement and free spirit of the 1920's flappers with a very exciting orchestration from today's Hollywood Sound stage. Treat your audience to a melding of *The Charleston* (James P. Johnston 1923) and perennial favorite, *Black Bottom* (Jelly Roll Morton, 1926).

Time To Say Goodbye (Con Te Partiró)

This orchestration is based on the 2nd version of the song (sung partly in English) released in 1996 as *Time to Say Goodbye*. This version paired Andrea Bocelli with English soprano Sarah Brightman, and achieved even greater success than the original, topping charts all across Europe including Germany, where it became the biggest-selling single in history.

Vanacore has crafted this Tenor vocal feature utilizing the symphony and choir as a "rock power ballad" complete with solo cello and piccolo. The Celtic style opening and bridge leads to an inspirational setting for this festive time of year.
