Marine Safe Victoria Life Jacket Inspection Day

Recently we were very privileged to have Marine Safe Victoria approach us to conduct a life jacket safety inspection day at our club rooms.

The event was held on Saturday 6th of February with a very good turn out of about 90 people registering for the clinic, which made it the largest attendance in Victoria.

The day consisted of 4 x 3/4 hour sessions which involved the visual inspection of the outer and inner components of the jacket, the self inflation of the internal bladder, the weighing of the gas cylinder and the recording of the inspection of the jacket.

The feedback from those that attended said the sessions were very informative and quite a few did not realise it is possible to be fined by the police if these self inspections are not carried out and recorded on an annual basis.

All participants received a show bag including a \$30 voucher from the State Government to be spent on marine safety equipment at Geelong Marine World, Moolap.
