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
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


## Mighty Mars will take their last flights over the Alberni Valley before becoming part of aviation history

Every community has one thing that unites them. For the Alberni Valley, that's the Martin Mars Water Bombers. But its fame runs much deeper in this province than just our Valley. Since the late 1950s, the red and white bombers have been in service fighting the wildfires across British Columbia. Although they haven't flown in B.C. since 2015, for many decades they were a powerful tool in the battle against wildfires here.

Over the past couple of months, residents of the Alberni Valley have learned that their beloved planes will be leaving the shores of Sproat Lake for good this fall. Although the history of the great planes will be preserved, it will be difficult to say goodbye for many people who grew up watching and hearing them fly overhead. Coulson Aviation, which bought the only two remaining Martin Mars water bombers in 2007 from Timberwest, recently announced the Hawaii Martin Mars would leave the Bomber Base on Sproat Lake and head to the B.C. Aviation Museum in North Saanich late this summer. The mighty plane first went up for sale in 2022 for \$5 million, but the donation of the Hawaii was announced in March of this year. The Province of BC will support its preservation by offering \$250,000 in funding to make its final flight south possible. The museum is raising funds to build a new hangar to house the Mighty Mars and other BC firefighting aircraft on land that was donated to the museum by the Victoria Airport Authority.

Shortly after the announcement that Hawaii was leaving Sproat Lake, Coulson released the timeline for the departure of the Philippine Martin Mars. The Philippine was sold to the Pima Air and Space Museum in Tucson, Arizona. Now painted in its original dark blue, the plane will head to its new home in the US later this year where it will be preserved as a World War II era aircraft, as it was not known in the US as a waterbomber.





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
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Britt Coulson, who now oversees Coulson Aviation, said "the Mars are among only a few World War II airplanes that are not currently preserved in a museum, this makes them very desirable and there were many museums competing for them." The addition of the Hawaii Mars will also help to raise the profile of the BC Aviation Museum, which currently attracts approximately 20,000 visitors annually. Coulson said, "Ultimately the family chose the BC Aviation Museum in Victoria because that was the right home for the Hawaii Mars. It will honour the long and extremely successful firefighting career in our province. Pima Air and Space Museum was chosen because it is a great museum, and with the amount of annual visitors it gets, it will be a perfect place to showcase the Philippine Mars."

"It was important for us to preserve their amazing history and place them in museums that would do them justice and look after them," Coulson said. "Port Alberni has been a good home for them, but both Victoria and Tucson will allow them to be visited and loved by exponentially more people."

He added that it is a great feeling knowing so many people will be able to enjoy them for years to come. Residents of the Alberni Valley appear to agree, as Coulson described their reaction to the announcements as "overwhelmingly positive."

Although the Martin Mars have a rich history in BC, that's not where they began their career in the air. Built between 1942 and 9147, the Martin JRM Mars was the largest flying boat ever produced in the United States. They were originally used as a transport fleet between Hawaii and the Pacific Islands to support the U.S. Navy. Following World War II, they were used in the Korean War for medical air transports between Hawaii and California. Their last duty with the U.S. Navy was as a cargo plane, until they were decommissioned in 1956. In addition to the prototype plan, The Old Lady, initially five planes were produced - Hawaii Mars, Philippine Mars, Marianas Mars, Marshall Mars, and Caroline Mars.

What many people do not realize is that this was not the first plan for these massive planes. The Martin Mars was originally intended as a maritime bomber. The plan was to build a plane that could patrol the sea



and also launch long-range missiles. It took longer than expected to build the planes, and by the time they were complete they were no longer needed in that capacity. Not wanting to call the project a failure, the plan shifted and the planes were used to fill the need for larger transports.


After they were retired from the military, a consortium of Canadian timber companies in British Columbia bought the four remaining planes with the idea that they would be a powerful addition to the province's firefighting fleet. They were converted and moved

to their new home on Sproat Lake, where they soon became an icon of the community.

After their conversion to water bombers, they became the largest fixed-wing water bombers in the world, with a capacity to carry more than 27,000 litres of water. It has a 200-foot wingspan, making it an impressive site as it flies through the air or lands on a lake to refill. One of the four Mighty Mars crashed in 1961 during firefighting operations, and the following year another was damaged beyond repair by a Pacific typhoon.
















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For decades the remaining Mars water bombers fought fires in the province until the BC Wildfire Service shifted to use more modern firefighting methods such as smaller aircrafts. The province ended the contract with the plane's current owner, Coulson Aviation, in 2013. After 53 years of service, the last bomber, the Hawaii, was pulled out of the water. It has remained alongside the Philippine at Coulson's Bomber Base ever since, although the Hawaii came out of retirement in 2015 to help fight wildfires for a month. For more almost a decade, fans of the planes could only admire the Hawaii and Philippines from a distance, but this summer that will change.

For the first time in almost a decade, the all too familiar rumble will be heard across the Alberni Valley. As they did in the past, people will surely drop what they are doing at the time, to go outside and look to the skies hoping to spot the Mighty Mars. Although there is no exact date available, both water bombers will once again take to the skies this year. "There is not a defined schedule for the flights yet," explained Coulson.

"However, it will be this summer." He added that a few very lucky people will get a chance to experience firsthand what it's like to be in the world's largest water bomber. "We are planning on offering a very limited amount of VIP experiences where people could go through the ground school with the flight crew, as well as taxi around the lake onboard." he said.

Coulson Aviation does plan on announcing the flight plans at a later date. They will also make sure it is announced when the Hawaii Mars is set to head to the museum in Victoria so that people along the route will also get to enjoy the sight of the historic plane flying over one last time. Once the water bombers have left for their new homes, Coulson Aviation will relocate their operation that is currently on Sproat Lake to the Alberni Valley Regional Airport. The leased land will then be returned to Mosaic, closing a chapter on the Alberni Valley's aviation history.

"Canopy locked? Spoilers locked and brake on? Clear above and behind? Ok, take up slack!" As the rope pulls tight, the tow plane and glider climb in unison into the sky and another flying lesson begins for 19-year-old Keanna at the Vancouver Island Soaring Centre in Port Alberni.

If you gaze skyward on a summer afternoon, you might see the flash of sun sparkling off the wings of gliders spiraling upwards in thermals near Sproat Lake, or surfing the ridge lift along the Beaufort Mountains. Port Alberni is one of just a handful of places in British Columbia where gliding takes place, and it has a long history in the valley dating back to the early 1970's.

Many pilots get their start in gliders, either through air cadets or at a local club. Gliding is an ideal introduction to flying and can springboard an aviation career or just lead to a lifetime of soaring fun. It's also one of the most accessible and affordable ways to fly.


For over 18 years, the Vancouver Island Soaring Centre has been teaching people the art of soaring, with some students now Captains at major airlines. Demand for flight training has never been higher, with a pilot shortage leading to many young people now recognizing it as an exciting career with good pay and the perks of travelling the world.


Amazingly, students can solo as young as 14-years-old and earn their full license at 16. "Learning to fly is not just about how to operate an aircraft," says Warwick Patterson, the new owner of Vancouver Island Soaring. "It teaches so many skills that can be applied throughout life. From decision-making and communication skills to boosting confidence and self-esteem. I think it's one of the most rewarding achievements."

Back in the glider, now up at 4000 feet above the ground, Keanna pulls the yellow release handle and the glider is set free from the tow plane. Contrary to what you'd think, the glider doesn't plummet back to earth. The energy from the sun today has warmed the fields below, forming rising









## West Coast General Hospital Foundation Reaches \$185,000 Goal Thanks to Donor Support!

The West Coast General Hospital operating room has a new addition thanks to the generosity of donors of the West Coast General Hospital Foundation. The new Stryker Video Tower has arrived and is now ready for use in the operating room at WCGH. "We are extremely grateful to all who contributed to the purchase of the new tower and for their continued support," said Erin Williams, General Manager of the WCGH Foundation. "Good health is important to all of us and donors from our community are vital in bringing the best in care close to home." As this campaign closes, another begins with the fundraising for two new pieces of equipment that will assist our health care teams in detecting cancer. The Detect Cancer Quick Campaign includes a Mammotome for the Operating Room (\$90,000) and an Endocavity Probe for the Emergency Department (\$9,000).

The Mammotome is a vacuum-assisted breast biopsy (VAC) device that uses image guidance such as x-ray, ultrasound and/or MRI to perform breast biopsies. The benefits of a mammotome biopsy include: The incision requires no sutures; hence, they are more aesthetically pleasing than an open surgical biopsy. Image guidance helps to locate the abnormal tissue site precisely. The procedure is minimally invasive, and recovery is quick, so patients can return to normal activities immediately. An endocavity probe is a specialized medical device used for internal imaging, particularly for gynecological and urological purposes. It allows for detailed images of internal structures due to its proximity and its ability to facilitate insertion and maneuverability within the body cavity. Having this available in the Emergency Department will speed up the process of detecting cancer.

columns of air called thermals. A few minutes later, the glider has climbed above 5000 feet and Georgia Strait appears over the ridge.

Like a three-dimensional game of chess, glider pilots search the sky for these sources of lift, often indicated by the puffy cumulus clouds overhead. Each time this source of energy is found, the pilot spirals upwards, essentially "filling the tank" to continue onwards. On a good day with high clouds, local gliding club members often fly for several hours and travel the length of the valley from Comox Glacier to Mt. Arrowsmith.

"On a clear day, we can see Vancouver in one direction, and Kennedy Lake and Tofino in the other," says Patterson. "Gliders have amazing performance, and flights over 100km are common here. In some places, like Alberta or the Alps, flights over 1000 km are achievable."

With a long-term dream of opening a flying school in mind, Warwick Patterson was drawn to the Alberni Valley by the opportunities provided by the airport here. The offer to take over the Soaring Centre came up and his dream was realized faster than expected.

"I love taking guests on scenic flights or introducing people to aviation," he says. "I want the Soaring Centre to become a community-focused business to show people in the Alberni Valley and beyond that learning to fly is something they can go and try too. So many people dream about flying but don't realize its more accessible than they think."

For youth between the ages of 13-21, or full-time students under 25, there are bursaries and discounted membership rates available through the local gliding club, supported by the Soaring Association of Canada.

For locals or visitors wishing to sample silent flight, the Vancouver Island Soaring Centre also offers several levels of sightseeing flights, with the flying season running April through September. It's a truly unique experience, offering an aerial perspective of the Alberni Valley few get to see.

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#### Marinated Bocconcini

4 to 6 servings; Total prep time: 15 mins, plus at least 4 hrs marinating time best if left overnight! This take on marinated mozzarella may not be the most obvious, but the flavors mellow as they sit, complementing the creaminess of the cheese.

16 ounces drained Natural Pastures Bocconcini di Bufala

- 1/2 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 3 Tbsp capers, finely chopped
- 2 Tbsp finely chopped fresh Italian parsley leaves
- 1 Tbsp finely chopped fresh thyme leaves or fresh basil
- 1 medium garlic clove, thinly sliced
- 1 tsp kosher salt

1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

Toss all the ingredients in a large bowl until the mozzarella is well coated. Add tomatoes if you like.

Refrigerate in an airtight container and let marinate at least 4 hours or overnight. Serve at room temperature – delicious! Can be served with anchovy-marinated olives, marinated mushrooms, cured meats, and crusty bread for an impromptu picnic. The bocconcini will keep for 1 week refrigerated in a covered container.

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

As the growing season starts and gets into full swing, you should think about how you can add more locally grown foods to your menus. By doing so you are supporting the many benefits of locally grown food.


## Tips on how to support food systems and farmers within the Alberni Valley





Black bears are part of what makes the Alberni Valley a majestic place to live. They're beautiful, intelligent, social animals who play a significant role in keeping our ecosystems balanced. But the way we residents manage the environment around our homes and businesses has a bigger impact on black bears than many people realize.

Attractants are items that will draw the attention of wildlife, including everyone from rodents up to black bears. Common items like bird feeders, outdoor pet food, barbecue grease traps, and citronella candles are major attractants for black bears. It may not look like the picnic baskets that Yogi was always chasing, but any bear in the area will follow their nose to a pile of dog food, high-calorie birdseed, or the citrusy-scent of citronella.

While some people may love a chance to see black bears visit more often, the unfortunate fact is bears who become comfortable around people or expect to find food at homes are killed by enforcement agencies. Fortunately, there are a number of simple ways residents and homeowners can prevent this, and keep everyone in our community safe and healthy.

Port Alberni is a great place for growing fruit trees, and many of us enjoy the homegrown apples, pears, and plums that we harvest. But when those fruits ripen in late summer to fall – and aren't picked or fall to the ground, they become major attractants for bears (and other wildlife).

Ensuring that fruits are appropriately harvested is important in preventing negative encounters with black bears. If you're not able to use or pick all that fruit yourself, don't worry, there's an entire community that wants to help!

The Alberni Valley Food Security Society runs The Gleaning Project, which connects tree owners to volunteers who want to harvest and enjoy local fruits. According to the Society, they collect around 11,000 pounds of fruit per year – that's a lot of pie! If you need help collecting fruit or finding folks who want it, check out AVFood.ca.







Offering birds food to help through winter is a common practice, but when bears are available, a bird feeder becomes a bit like building a fast-food joint across from a high school: it's going to get busy. High calorie, high fat foods are exactly what black bears want, and that's exactly what most bird seed is. Putting away bird feeders while black bears are active will prevent negative experiences with not just bears, but also rodents and other small animals that may be unwanted near homes. The grease trap of a barbecue, outdoor pet food, forgotten-snacks, and other items common in backyards may also attract black bears. Regular cleaning and removal of foodstuffs makes an impact.

We encourage residents of Port Alberni to appreciate, enjoy, and respect wildlife – part of that means respecting the role we play in keeping our ecosystem and everyone who lives in it safe. Learn more about black bears and managing attractants at TheFurBearers.com/attractants.

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Hupačasath welcomes you

The Hupacasath First Nations people are a living history of the Alberni Valley. For thousand of years, our instilled have ancestors importance of community on central Vancouver Island. Our traditional territory includes the town of Port Alberni, Great Central Lake, Sproat Lake, Mount Arrowsmith, Thunder Mountan and Mount Klista. The Hupacasath First Nation is one of the 14 Nuu Chat Nulth First Nations. The collective term, 'Nuu Chat Nulth' means "all along the mountains and sea."

Mountain Arrowsmith (shown in the background of Loon Lake) Cal-ka-cath means 'jagged points facing upward' is the traditional name for Mount The mountain which Arrowsmith stands before you, is one of the most boundaries of the eastern Hupacasath territory A Nuu Shah Nulth story about Mount Arrowsmith describes a Thunderbird who was hunting over the ocean when it caught two whales. Carrying one in each of its talons, on the way back to its nest, Thunderbird dropped one of the whales on the op of Kal-ka-cath. .





In recent times, an anthropologist and archeologist found the skeletal remains of a grey whale at the top of Mount Arrowsmith. They deduced that it was left behind after a historical flood, but the Hupacasath Elders told them that Thunderbird had left it there eons ago.

The Thunderbird pole (locaed at Loon Lake) honours the supernatural create whose main source of food is the grey whale. When Thunderbird flaps its wings, we hear thunder roll. It carries Lightning Snakes under its wings for hunting and when it blinks, snakes shoot down and stun its prey. Then Thunderbird swoops in and carries its catch to its nest on Thunder Mountain, where it still lives today.
