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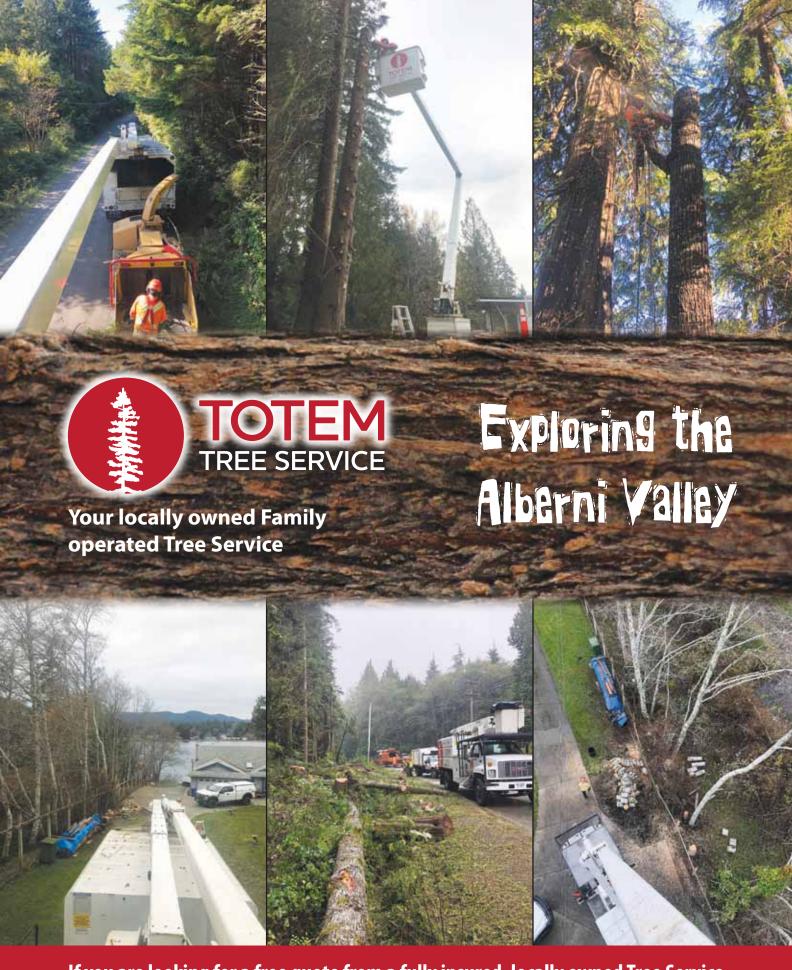

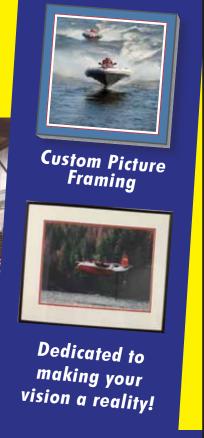

The main road into Port Alberni is via the Alberni Highway; travelling around Cameron Lake, through Cathedral Grove, and over the Port Alberni summit. The drive is magical to say the least; upon first entering the Alberni Valley, visitors and residents alike are greeted by 360° mountain views, encompassing our beautiful town; but entering the Alberni Valley wasn't always this way.

Travelling through the Barkley Sound and up the Alberni Inlet used to be the main route for anyone travelling in or out of Port Alberni. Imagine, if you will, how our beautiful town might look from that perspective; travelling on a ship, boat, or canoe, rocky mountains rising almost perpendicularly from the water on either side of you, trees covering the mountain sides. Certain parts feel as though you're in the middle of a mountain lake, rather than an inlet. We truly are blessed to live in such a beautiful place.

Alongside the natural beauty the Alberni Valley has to

offer is our amazing community. Friendly faces are seen throughout the town, whether you're running errands or going for a walk along the Dike. Exploring the Alberni Vall



Stamp River Provincial Park is a quick 15 minute drive down Beaver Creek Road; perfect for camping, day hikes through breathtaking forest and waterfall views, or relaxation by the river, Stamp River has it all.

One of the main attractions of the park is it's annual run of thousands of Pacific salmon swimming in the pool below the

falls, before ascending up the ladder to the spawning grounds; this natural migration happens during late summer and early fall months. The trail along the river and falls offer fantastic view points of the salmon, alongside well placed information stands that the whole family will enjoy reading. With salmon comes black bears looking for an easy meal, so always be aware and keep dogs leashed.

Stamp River Provincial Park is the perfect place to spend a couple hours immersed in nature or a couple days camping along the river. During summer months the water is calm enough in certain areas for a quick dip in the river to cool off while having a picnic lunch, while the trails offer spectacular views of the raging river and falls alongside the beautiful forest. The fall and winter months offer a phenomenal display of the river rushing past and down the falls, as you crunch on fallen leaves along the trail. This park is the perfect escape into nature, regardless of the season!



Located at the end of Plywood Drive, **Canal Beach** is the only sandy beach for non-motorized water sports, including windsurfing, stand up paddleboarding, and kayaking in Port Alberni.

Formerly an industrial mill site, Canal Beach has been transformed

into the perfect waterfront beach spot. Created to help transition the economy from industrial based to recreational and tourism, this beach has been fought for by the community. There are two must see murals created

by local artists, Alicia LaRue (Winddiva) and Alana Orr, one depicting the story of the Canal Beach evolution and the other depicting the windy activities along the Alberni Inlet.

The beach offers a waterfront park with a panoramic backdrop of the busy Alberni Harbour. Ideal for the entire family; walk along the beach, throw a frisbee, or head out into the water for a paddle. The perfect place to cool down on a hot summer day.



Located just 20 minutes outside of Port Alberni, down the bumpy Franklin River Road, is home to **China Creek Marina**, a beautiful destination for fishing, water sports, camping, RVing, and hiking.

China Creek is rich in history; starting with gold mining around

1862 with small placer-mines, worked primarily by Chinese men searching for "flour" gold. A placer gold-deposit is formed by the natural concentration of eroded gold-bearing rocks, the process of mining this gold was principally done using a "shoe-rocker" which separated the gravel from gold. In the summer of 1999 four Chinese vessels crossed onto Canadian Seas, carrying approximately 600 illegal immigrants. Most immigrants were sent home, but this event sparked the creation of one of Port Alberni's most popular diving sites.

Two of the four ships, The Blue and The Rusty, were sunk in the China Creek Marina. Before the ships were sunk, visitors were invited to explore the ships, as a public awareness project to highlight just how terrible the living conditions were. The ships were sunk in 2001 and now home a giant octopus, Dungeness crabs, the occasional wolf eel, and various species of fish and anemones. Visitors can dive down to the ships and witness this beautiful artificial reef. With the mountains and forests surrounding China Creek Marina and ocean at your feet, it has a deep sense of calm, relaxation and exploration.



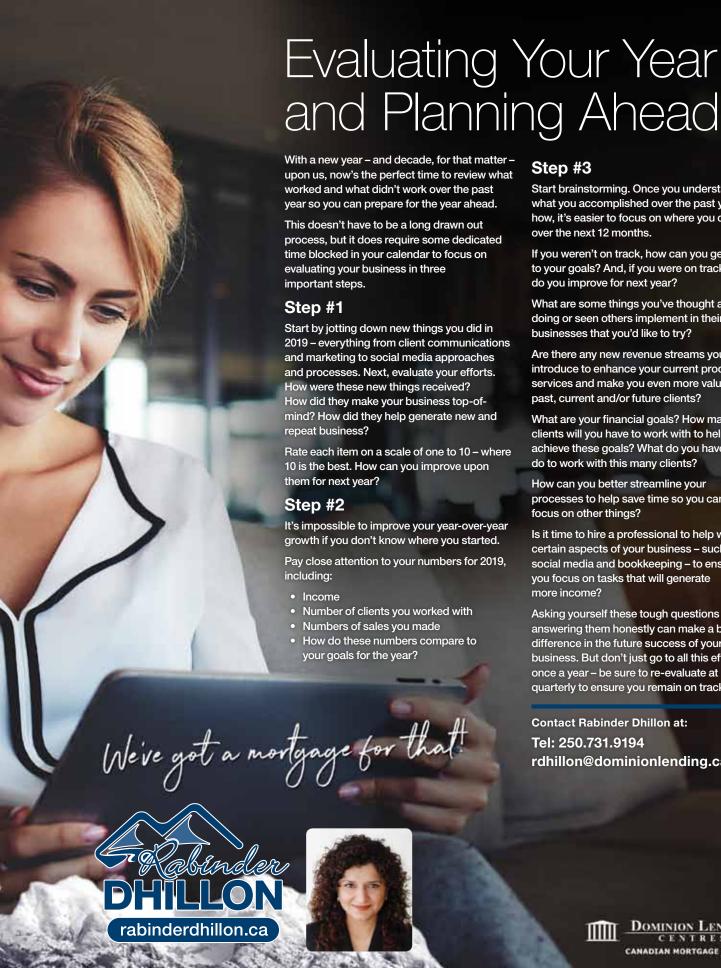
Paper Mill Dam is located on Paper Mill Road off of Falls Street. In 1892, British Columbia's first paper mill was built on the Paper Mill Dam site on the Somass River. Paper was produced between 1894 and

1895, but due to heavy expenses and poor equipment, the mill was unable to continue running and closed down. In 1915 the dam itself was destroyed to allow schools of salmon to continue up the Somass River to their natural spawning grounds.

Now, the Paper Mill Dam Park is an ideal location to cool off during the summer heat in the river, walk through the forest, and bask in Port Alberni's natural beauty.

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Della Falls is located at the west end of Great Central Lake in Strathcona Provincial Park, about 25 minutes from Port Alberni. At 440 metres (1456 feet), Della Falls is the highest waterfall in Canada and one of the highest falls in North America. Home to cougars, black bears, Roosevelt moose, grey jays, eagles, and Vancouver Island marmot.

This breathtaking landmark is accessible via boat or water taxi and a 15km hike from Love Lake. This hike includes rugged terrain, backcountry camping, and is best suited for intermediate and experienced hikers. This adventure is perfect for those looking to submerge themselves into nature for a couple days!



Where the fresh water meets the sea: from the Pacific Ocean. through the Barkley Sound, up the **Alberni Inlet** to meet the Somass River. Travelled for thousands of years by the Hupacasath First Nations, whose territory was governed by the seasons, they followed the animals, fish and mammals alike, up and down the inlet

between Sproat Lake and Nettle Island.

The Alberni Inlet is named after the Spanish captain, Pedro de Alberni, who commanded a military outpost in the Nootka Sound between 1790-1792. In 1860, a tall-masted schooner, the "Meg Merrilies" moored in the Alberni Inlet.

In present day the Inlet is still used for maritime trade and marine commerce between Port Alberni and the world. We continue to follow the Salmon up and down the inlet, during the Salmon Festival and Derby, as well as spending our summers in and around the water.

You don't even need a boat to see the Alberni Inlet; along the 20km Inlet Trail, hikers can explore from Port Alberni continued on page 18

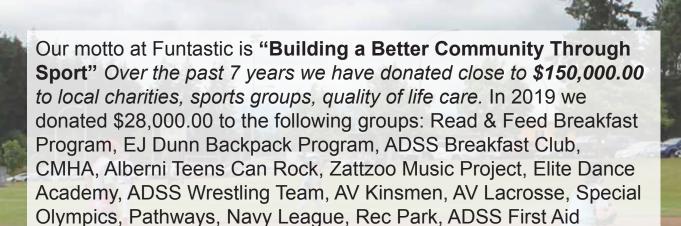

to just past China Creek Marina. The hike offers some challenging sections, spectacular views, and the perfect balance between forest, mountains, and the Ocean.



Located just 15 minutes west of Port Alberni down the Pacific Rim Highway, **Sproat Lake Provincial Park** is the perfect summer get away. Choose from hiking, nature walks complete with Petroglyphs, camping, lounging on the beach, or water sports, this park has something for the entire family.

Sproat Lake is named after Gilbert Malcolm Sproat, a native of Galloway, Scotland, who came to Vancouver Island in 1860 to establish the sawmill at the head of the Alberni Canal. Before being given to the Province in 1966, it was known as Smith's Landing after George Smith who farmed the area. The park homes one of the finest panels of prehistoric Petroglyphs in British Columbia.

Sproat Lake offers many water activities including canoeing, scuba diving, fishing, swimming, windsurfing, stand-up-paddle boarding, and water skiing. Year round you can enjoy nature walks, hiking, and wildlife viewing on many of the surrounding trails of varying difficulty. Sproat Lake is a beautiful place to spend a couple of hours or a couple of days, the ideal family escape.

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Port Alberni is full of hidden gems. For day hikes that are perfect for the entire family and take you away from reality into nature, the Hole in the Wall is top of our list.

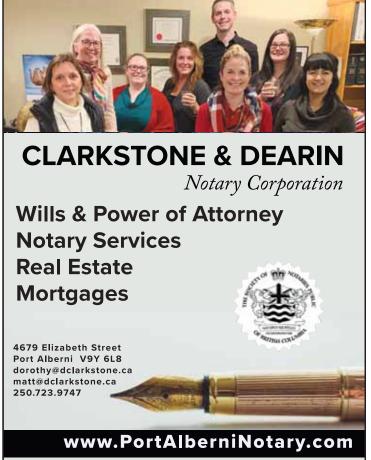
Located at the entrance of Port Alberni, across the Alberni Highway from the entrance to the Look Out, you'll find a marked trail head. After an easy 15 minute hike from the trail head, visitors are greeted by a breathtaking hole in the wall. This hole is complete with a stunning waterfall, leading into a calm creek. It almost seems as if it's a doorway into another world. Ferns and trees crawl their way up the wall, creating a picturesque image that you'll want to look at for hours.

This large, man made hole was once a shortcut for the city's water line, prior to the amalgamation of Port Alberni in 1967. The hole was formed through volcanic shale and is now a beautiful waterfall feeding into Roger Creek. This is an ideal spot to stop for a picnic lunch, dip in the creek, or quiet contemplation.

There's more to see than just a Hole in the Wall; if you turn left and walk along the creek you will find several Inukshuk formations, with more being added all the time. This is a fun activity to do with kids, balancing rocks on top of each other to create beautiful rock formations, taking shape from imagination. Walking along the creek with the massive volcanic shale wall to your left and lush forest to your right, reminds you how small you are in comparison to the Earth. This is the perfect place to explore with friends and family of all ages.

You can spend half an hour or a couple hours exploring the Hole in the Wall; with trails taking you along Roger Creek, down logging roads, or just dipping your feet in the creek, these trails are fairly easy and ideal for the entire family.

The Guru Nanak Sikh Society kindly sponsored a spectacular fundraising dinner and cultural event in September to benefit Westhaven long-term care facility, now under the auspices of Foundation support for fundraising and advocacy. Donations from that event were applied towards the purchase of two new medication carts and a sterilizing machine, both essential and much-needed items that allow Westhaven staff more time to focus on all-important patient care. 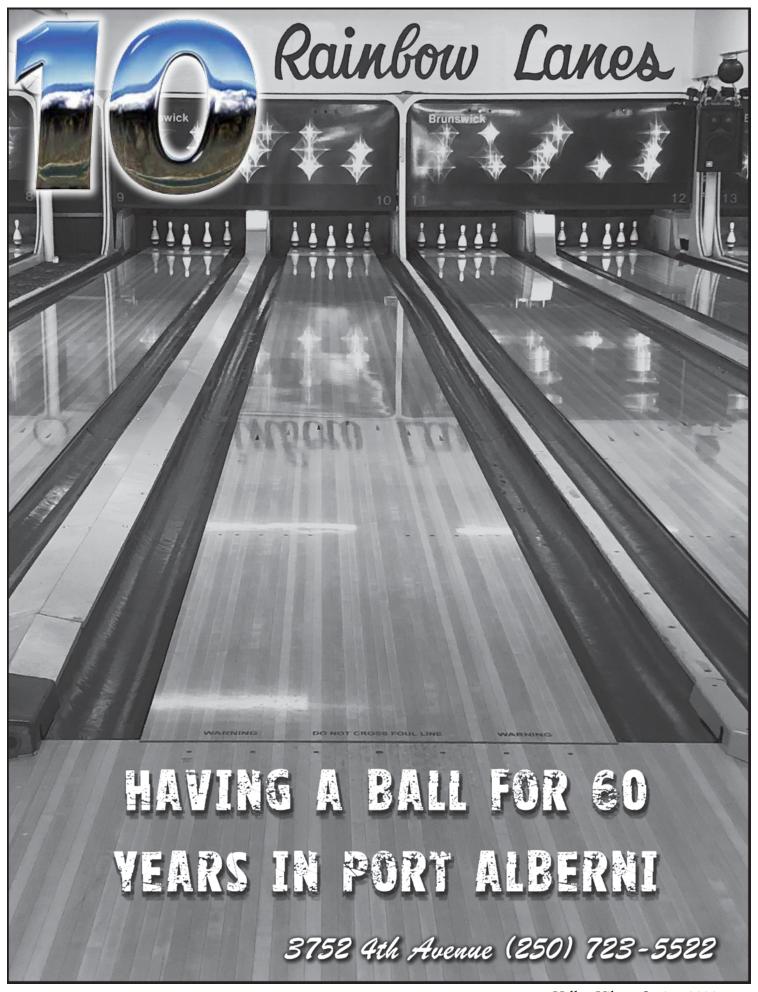

Recent day forestry has expanded recreationally and sustainable tourism opportunities. Specifically at Great Central Lake with the building of a portable saw mill and potential float house projects.

The Hupacasath First Nations community garden provides the Alberni Valley with locally grown produce. This service is available to the whole community. Locally grown produce supports local businesses and sustainable agriculture, all while enjoying fresher and tastier food! Opening this June we will be located on 5333 River Road and look for the bright red sign.

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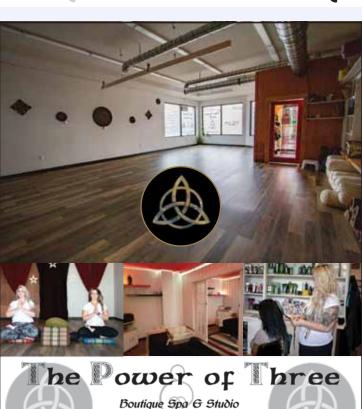
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Penne with Chicken and Asparagus

A light but super-tasty pasta dish, with fresh asparagus cooked in broth with sauteed garlic and seasoned chicken.

- 1 (16 ounce) package dried penne pasta
- 5 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 skinless boneless chicken breast cut into cubes
- Salt and pepper to taste

Garlic powder to taste

- 1 bunch slender asparagus spread, cut into diagonal 1 inch pieces
- 1 clove garlic
- ¼ cup Parmesan cheese



Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to boil. Add pasta, and cook until al dente, about 8 to 10 minutes. Drain, set aside.

Warm 3 tablespoons olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Stir in chicken and season with salt, pepper, and garlic powder. Cook until chicken is cooked through and browned, about 5 minutes. Remove chicken.

Pour chicken broth into the skillet. Stir in asparagus, garlic and a pinch more garlic powder, salt, and pepper. Cover, and steam until the asparagus is just tender, about 5 to 10 minutes. Return chicken to the skillet, and warm through.

Stir chicken into pasta, and mix well. Let sit about 5 minutes. Drizzle with 2 tablespoons olive oil, stir again, then sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.

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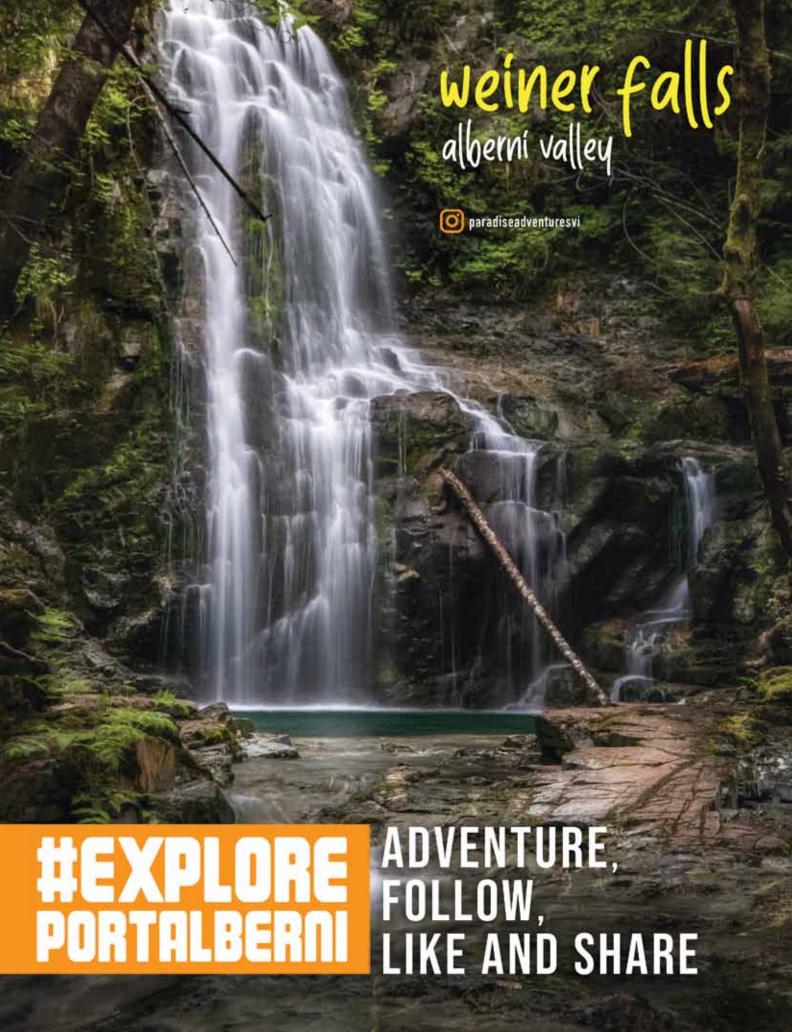
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
