What Is Mammon?

Question:

When Jesus says, “*You cannot serve both God and mammon,*” what does he mean? What is mammon?

Answer:

When you hear Scripture proclaimed each Sunday, remember it wasn’t originally written in English. Hebrew, Aramaic, Greek — these ancient tongues were the original language of our Old and New Testaments. Most of the time, all of the words are translated into our native language. Sometimes, a word or two is left in the original language. Such is the case in this Scripture passage.

Mammon is an ancient Aramaic word referring to money, wealth, or profit. Earthly wealth isn’t bad in itself, nor does it automatically exclude us from being a disciple of Jesus. But what dominates our life? To serve money — that is, to seek accumulation of wealth for its own sake and to structure our lives around it — is morally problematic. What good is our wealth if it isn’t at the service of others? What good is our wealth if its pursuit leads us to selfishness, obsession, greed, envy, and comparison? There are many things that can be opposed to our service of God — power, prestige, popularity. Ultimately, something in our lives will be our master. But there is only one God worth serving.

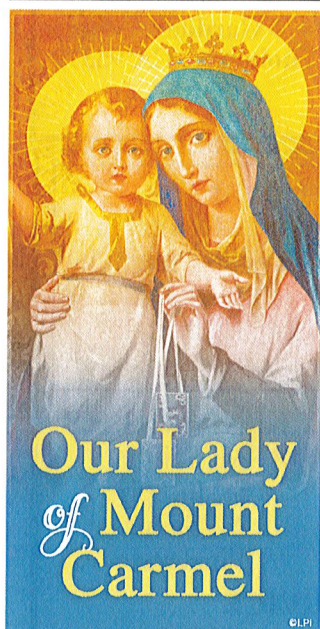

The origins of this feast reach all the way back to the Old Testament. In the book of Kings, we read the story of the prophet Elijah. Much of his prayer, fasting, and public ministry occurred from Carmel, a mountain in Israel. Christian hermits -- seeking solitude -- made their homes on the mountain during the first millennium. Over time, the hermits assembled into a community and were given a Rule of Life. They named their church after Mary -- Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Political upheaval forced the Carmelite order out of the Holy Land and into Europe,

where they established monasteries for both men and women across the continent. Many great saints and doctors of the Church have come from the Carmelite order, including St. Teresa of Avila, St. John of the Cross, St. Therese of Lisieux, and St. Edith Stein. Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Pray for us!

We will conclude Part II, On the Boat Together, with reading the final two sections: Ordained Ministers at the Service of Harmony and Together in Mission. The section regarding the ordained ministers provides us with an understanding of the roles and service of the Bishop, Priests and Deacons. These ordained ministers are called to offer their special gifts in love, in service and in unity to provide pastoral care to the people within their dioceses and/or parishes. (#68 – 73)

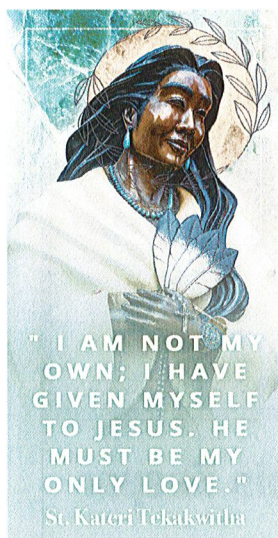
Together in Mission encourages the lay faithful, both women and men, to their role of co-responsibility in the mission of the Church. Bishops, priests, deacons and laity work together, sharing their particular skills and gifts for the life and mission of the Church. (#75) Specific and concrete opportunities for participation of the laity in the mission of the Church are given in #77.

Throughout the listening sessions in our diocese, there were many requests that the laity be empowered to be co-responsible partners for mission through the creation or resumption of Parish Pastoral Councils. Many, if not all parishes, have responded to this request under the direction of Bishop Cotta. The Bishop presented each pastor with a book entitled *Becoming a Pastoral Parish Council; A Guide for a Synodal Church* by Patricia Carroll. As Bishop Cotta states, "the importance of establishing Parish Pastoral Councils is the means by which the synodal model can be put into action for parishes and the diocese."

May the Holy Spirit continue to guide us in our desire to be a Synodal Church.

On July 14th, we celebrate the feast of the "Lily of the Mohawks." St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American woman to be canonized. Orphaned by a smallpox outbreak, Kateri survived with severe scarring and impaired eyesight. Despite tragedy, she was a devout girl at a young age, often building crosses from sticks in the woods. When she was 18, she began secret instruction in the Catholic faith with French missionaries. Her commitment

to Christianity and vow of virginity was misunderstood and ridiculed by her fellow villagers. She escaped to a nearby mission, where she attended daily Mass, taught the children, and cared for the sick and the elderly. Sometimes the greatest misunderstandings can come from those closest to us. Like St. Kateri, God invites us to be faithful to our commitments of faith and to always respond in love.

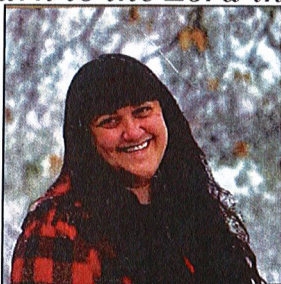

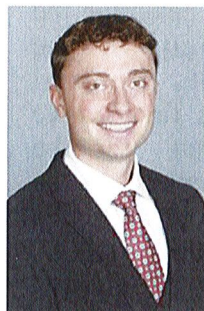

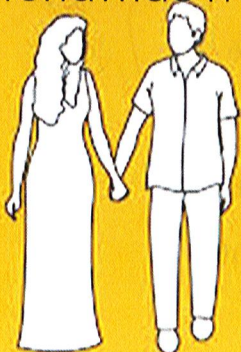
