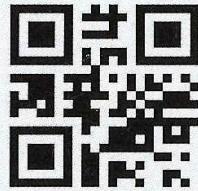

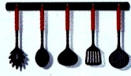

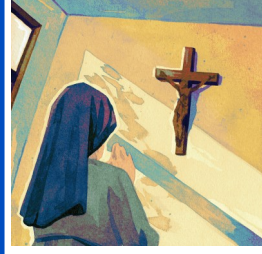

To Carry the Cross

Carry the cross? Absolutely, I'm happy to! Hand it over. Here's the thing: I just might...set it down for a moment, just for a second, from time to time. That's okay, right?

How else am I supposed to have both hands free to gesture when I am angry? I can't, if I'm carrying the cross. Well, fine, then let me just shift its weight, so I can say what I think about this person who's got it all wrong — I'll just lean it against the wall here. No? Okay, fine, I won't put it down! I'll keep holding it. That's better, actually. Then, I can use it as a weapon, to knock some sense into people and set them straight! What? No to that too? Am I doing this "Christian" thing wrong?

"Whoever wishes to save his life will lose it," Jesus tells us in today's Gospel. "But whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." This is not an affirmation of the paradox that if you no longer care about something, you can finally have it. It's not a judgment about the worthlessness of life in this fallen world or the futility of trying to preserve that life. It's merely a statement about priorities.



When Peter says, "God forbid!" at the thought of suffering, God is not his priority. His own safety is his priority at that moment. When I say, "God forbid!" to anything that comes from the mouth of God, it is a reminder to me, to look at my hands - because they have probably put down the cross.

How merciful is our Lord - he never takes my cross from me, even when I walk far away from it. He always lets me pick it back up and try again. In His dear and sweet goodness, He even helps me lift its weight. And He gestures, in case I've forgotten: "This way. Follow me."

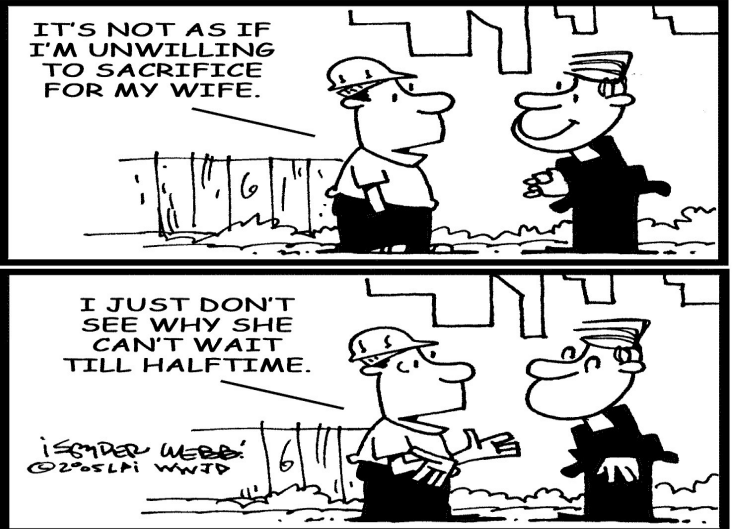

Zeal

Zeal gets a bad rap these days, as we most often hear this word associated with extremists whose adherence to a belief system leads them to violence. In Scripture, we hear Paul condemn those whose “zeal for God” lacks discernment (Romans 10:2), so we know this was a problem in ancient times as well.

But no one acting in violence or hatred is practicing virtuous zeal, which refers to an all-consuming love for the Lord: “Zeal for your house has consumed me,” writes the Psalmist (Psalm 69:10), referring to a religious devotion that has deprived him of all his worldly status.

If anyone’s “love” of God leads him to sin, he is not actually motivated by love of God. A burning and all-consuming love of God has, for its object, God Himself — and closeness with God is impeded by anything contrary to the teachings of Jesus Christ.

Priest Vestments: Why do priests wear vestments? Do they have a special meaning?

The alb is a reminder of the baptismal garment. The stole is a symbol of ordained ministry & authority within the Church. The chasuble reminds us that we are on a pilgrimage of faith, passing through this life towards heaven.

Vestments draw attention to the importance & solemnity of the act of worship. The color indicates the season of the year or the feast being celebrated. In the celebration of the Mass, the focus is on what we do together, on our common unity, and on the mystery and person of Christ.
