

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In my experience, one of the peculiarities of being a man is the somewhat unlikely ability to look into the mirror, no matter how out of shape he may be, and declare with full confidence: "Looking good, buddy!" Ask a man. He'll probably confirm it.

Therein lies a mystery. You might think I refer to man's ability to deceive himself or his propensity toward vainglory. But in this case, I refer to the mystery of a healthy and proper sense of self-love. We human beings (both men and women) have the utterly weird ability to look at ourselves as if we were another. Then we tend to love this "other." Then, somehow, that love becomes a bond between the two. We are three and yet one.

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. We ponder anew that God in His unity is a play of multiplicity: Lover, Beloved, and shared Love. Or, as we also proclaim, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. If we allow it, this mystery heals our temptation toward self-hatred and destruction. We all know how awful it is to look into the mirror and not know the person we see, or, equally bad, to know and hate who we see. Jesus, the Son of God, draws us into the dynamics of authentic self-knowledge and self-love. Perhaps we could ask the Holy Trinity this Sunday to teach us to truly look at ourselves and to properly love who we see looking back.




Exhibit on **Eucharistic Miracles**

In our times, there is a felt need for the Church to reach out to LGBTQ+ Catholics. Loud is the call to welcome and accompany members of this community.

I believe we all would agree that all people, regardless of the choices we make or inclinations we experience, are created in the image and likeness of God, which gives us equal dignity and value before God. We all also share a fallen human nature which makes us all equally in need of salvation. Therefore, the need for the Church - the need for us as Church to reach out, that is, to welcome and accompany LGBTQ+ Catholics is the same as the need to do so for any other Catholic.

Though the need is clear, I suspect most of us have struggled with the question: How do I welcome and accompany LGBTQ+ Catholics without giving apparent acceptance of ideology which conflicts with fundamental Church teaching?

I wish I had a comprehensive answer to that question, but I don't. However, I do have a place to begin.

There is a duet of ministries faithful to the teachings of the Church and focused on welcoming and accompanying LGBTQ+ Catholics and their families, namely Courage and EnCourage.

Courageous members are men and women who experience samesex attractions and who have made a commitment to strive for chastity. They are inspired by the Gospel call to holiness and the Catholic Church's beautiful teachings about the goodness and inherent purpose of human sexuality. Through this apostolate, people who experience same-sex attraction receive pastoral support in the form of spiritual guidance, community prayer support, and fellowship.

EnCourage members are parents, spouses, siblings, and friends of people who identify as LGBTQ. They are looking for help to keep the faith and keep their family bonds intact. Members work together to understand the experiences of their loved ones and to respond to them with compassion. They know that it is possible to express love for someone even if we can't support all of their choices or actions. They find spiritual guidance to grow in their relationship with Christ and community support from other members that helps them remember that they are not alone on this journey

Bishop Cotta sanctions the ministries of Courage and EnCourage as our primary Diocese of Stockton outreach to those experiencing samesex attraction and those struggling to identify with their biological sex. He encourages support and expansion of these ministries within our diocese in the following ways:

Father, we implore you to bless the Courage and Encourage Apostolate within our Diocese of Stockton. Grant them Your protection and guidance. Help them in their ministry to bring your love, fellowship, and direction to those experiencing same-sex attractions or gender discordance.

Please increase the number of those willing to bring this important message to those in need and give them the courage and graces necessary to do so. Lord, so much work has yet to be done in this area.




