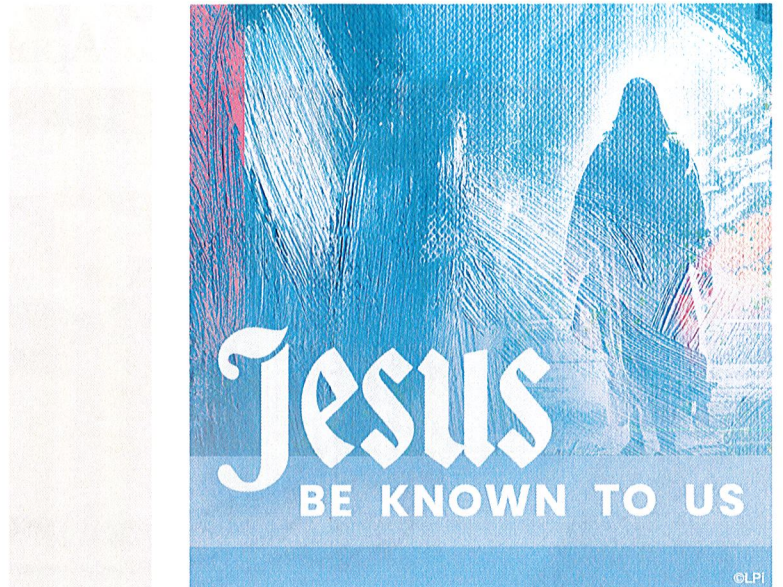

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

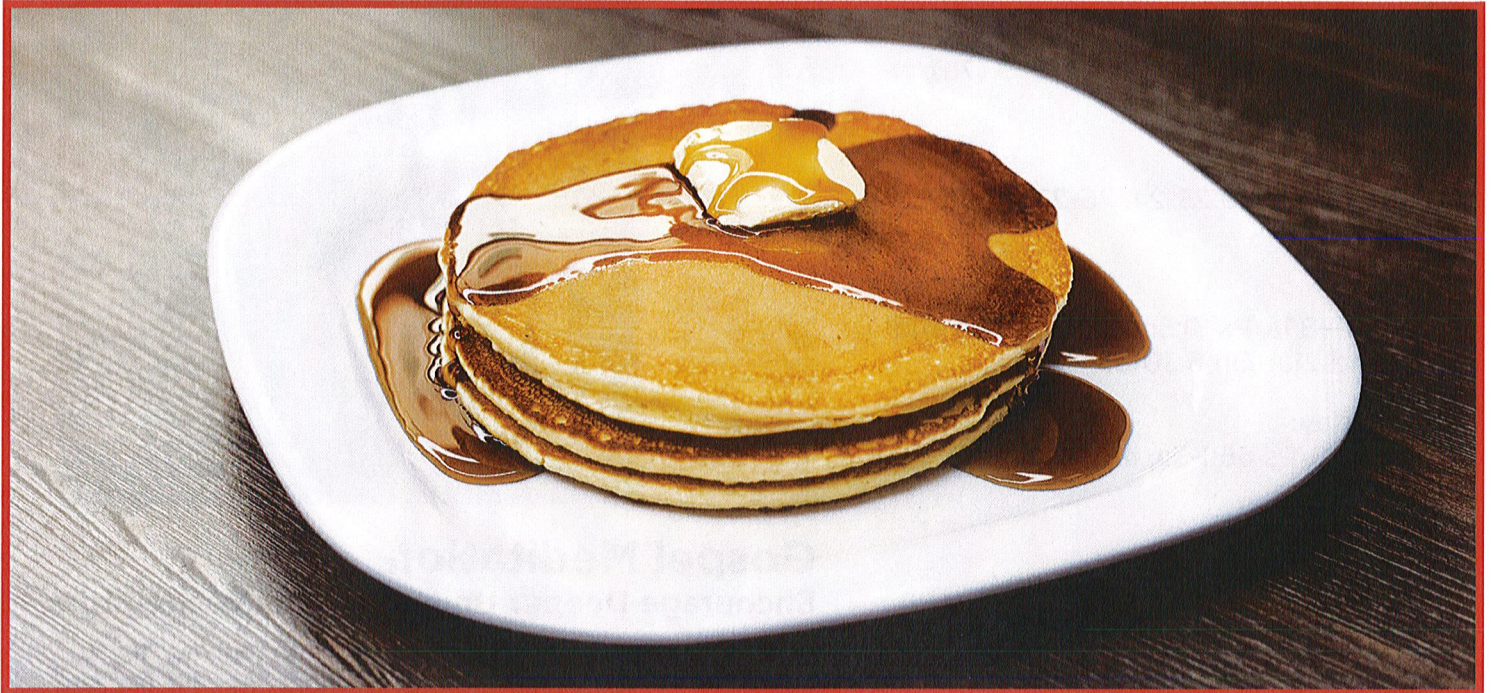
When I was a kid, a friend at my home parish told me, “If you get to Mass by the Gospel reading, it counts!” As a lifelong late-arriver, it’s something I have told myself many times, especially in my earlier years as a Catholic. If the “it counts” is justifiable on a pathetically minimal scale of liturgical legalism, then the Gospel reading today shows how insanely wrong-headed it is, and how helpful it is to re-think the Mass in its light.

The famous “Road to Emmaus” story recounts, on that first Sunday of the Resurrection, the basic two-fold structure of the Mass: *Word*, followed by *Eucharist*. Jesus spends a significant period of time with two dismayed disciples, as he connects a wide swath of the Hebrew scriptures with his own suffering, death, and resurrection. They would later report that this Liturgy of the Word touched their hearts with an inexplicable fire. This Word-induced flame alone is what leads the two disciples to discover Jesus’ presence in the “breaking of the bread.”

With this in mind, how can we possibly think that the Liturgy of the Word is unnecessary or incidental? The two disciples needed the Scriptures explained to them in order to experience Jesus alive in the eucharistic breaking of bread. Sure, we say, but they had the Risen Jesus. But that’s precisely the point: Jesus is risen and accompanies us in both parts of the Mass. Imagine how much our experience of Jesus in the Eucharist would deepen if we (preachers and listeners) took even more seriously that Jesus himself sets our hearts ablaze with his Word so that we know him in the Eucharist. That Word-induced fire counts, too!

Pastor's Message

Peter said to the people, "God has thus brought to fulfillment what he had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer . . . repent, therefore and be converted, that your sins may

be wiped away." And saint John the Apostle says, "The way we may be sure that we know him is keep his commandments." And in the Gospel today, after the Resurrection, Jesus said to the apostles in the upper room, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled." And he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. "Thus, it is written . . ." What I would like to reflect and bring to mind is the important of scripture and the relationship to what we have witnessed between the Old and the New Testaments.

We have often heard, that 'God works in mysterious ways.' And He does. But God also works as he said He would, as is written down the, His words of which He inspired these men of old to write them down, so that future generations may hear them proclaimed, ponder them, and understand how they're fulfilled and come to believe. Such is the relationship between prophesy and its fulfillment, as we're now witnessing during this Easter Season, i.e., the suffering servant, his crucifixion and resurrection. And it would befit us to be especially attentive to how God communicates to us, using our faculties of reason.

A Catholic priest, theologian and historian from the 4th century, St. Jerome was known as of the greatest biblical scholars in the Church and one of the great Latin Fathers of the Church. He translated the Bible from Greek into Latin, known as the Vulgate for the Word of God is universal, for all nations. St. Jerome said, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." He urged all people of faith, the Church to recognize that serious reflection, study of the Word of God is a necessity, not an optional luxury.

During this Easter Season, the Church is hyper focused on the 'significance' of Jesus' resurrection. We cannot fathom this unless we know what had proceeded before in this most beautiful miracle from the greatest story ever told. And this is the mission of the Church, to make known the history of salvation and how we are all called to participate in the living Word for all generations. Our 'participation' is to merit for the salvation of our souls through hearing and our obedience to His Word. Every time we come to participate at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the Holy Day of Obligation, we not only hear the Proclamation but we actually witness and participate in Christ's passion, death and resurrection. The Eucharistic Prayers on the Altar brings about the source and summit of our faith; we unite our own challenges and our sufferings with God's atoning sacrifice of His Son. There we have the realized hope of our raising with Him. Jesus Christ is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things he himself might be preminent. Col 1:18. If Jesus is the Firstborn, then that makes us the Second.

May the Lord's Peace be with you, always.
