#### **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

In previous bulletins I have commented on the need to have a Ministry Fair sometime at the beginning of the new year. One very important ministry of the Church is the ministry of Marriage Annulments. Marriage is "The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life, is by its na-

ture ordered toward the 'good of the spouses' AND the procreation and education of offspring . . . between baptized persons has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament," CCC 1601. We touched on this in last Sunday's readings. Fifteen years ago a Pew research reported 50% of ALL U.S. marriages end in divorce; in California 75% and Sacramento 85%. Unfortunately today, there are a lot of divorced and re-married Catholics who incorrectly believe they were excommunicated from the church and no longer practice the faith.

The Church has always acknowledged the rights of men and women to marry and naturally assume their marriages are valid from the getgo, regardless if they're catholic, mainline protestant, nondenominational, mixed marriages, or even non-believers (a natural marriage). But due to the human frailty and weakness, many times we enter into marriage for the wrong reasons. As people of faith, we look to the meaning and purpose of marriage as revealed to us by human reason, Holy Scripture and the teachings through Church Tradition. It is crucial and of great importance that the Church teaches our youth, particularly in the two years of Confirmation, about God's plan of love for the human race. This would include the faculty of human sexuality that incorporates chastity, modesty, and cultural peer pressure. But all too often, the teaching is not demonstrated in the homelife of the domestic church, and the teaching goes to the wayside.

Young adults can marry for the wrong reasons; they contracept, and even abort due to 'not being ready.' Marriages start off as codependent relationships; dominant, controlling and abusive; emotionally and spiritually unavailable, or thinking the dynamics in the relationship will change when they become married. The truth is, there are many, many reasons why a marriage may not be valid from the very beginning. Jesus gave to the Apostle Peter, the authority of the Church, the Keys to 'bind and loose on earth and in heaven'. By Sacred Scripture, the Church assumes all marriages are valid, UNLESS proven otherwise, which is the work of Marriage Annulments, a Ministry of Healing in the Church that benefits both parties. Annulments are not Catholic Divorces, but after careful examination, it is 'Peter's' declaration of a defect(s) in the union since its inception. In time, individuals can and do grow in maturity, healing, and yes enter into genuine conversions to Christ.

If anyone, any catholic, partakes in Holy Communion at the Catholic Mass while in a second or third marriage, who has yet to resolve that past marital relationship through the church . . . should not be receiving the Holy Eucharist until that person goes through the annulment process and thereby be 'free' for a 'con-validation' at the altar. Christ and Holy Mother Church wants all to partake of Him in the Eucharist, but not all can. The church is here to heal her members, and sanctify them in Christ. If you are in need of this ministry of healing, the sacrament that frees you to be purified and made whole in Christ, reconciled to God, call and make an appointment to see me and I can help you begin the process of returning back to 'Full Communion'.


