



PASTOR'S MESSAGE

St. Thomas Aquinas, a thirteenth century Dominican friar, priest, philosopher, theologian and great Doctor of the Church wrote, "To one who has faith, no explanation (proof) is necessary. To one without faith, no explanation is possible." Even though God's plan for human salvation was pre-figured in ages past and came to fulfillment in Christ's deeds and signs, many still find it hard to believe. God told Moses and the prophets to write these things down and teach them to the masses and the Spirit inspired the Apostles; but doubters say "Oh, those are man's words, man's laws". But they are God's "words" and His commands of which He inspired man to write. Was not the Word made flesh in Jesus Christ on Christmas day? The purpose of Sacred Scripture is to preserve the Word in the minds of men and women for all time. Where or how else can we "accurately reflect" on God's call but through the Word?

In recent times there has been a movement to deny secular history as in man's landing on the moon or the Jewish Holocaust of WWII. Someone once said, "To not learn from the painful lessons of history, is to be doomed to repeat it." If humanity cannot learn from its own history, how can it learn from the historical account of God's unfurled plan of salvation in Jesus, as revealed in Sacred Scripture? In St. Paul's Pastoral Epistle, he exhorts Timothy, "All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction, and for training in righteousness . . ." (2Tim 3:16).

The disciples recorded Jesus' miraculous deeds to "Help the people believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, so that through this faith they may have life in his name." By this we may be unlike the doubting Apostle Thomas who needed to see physical proof to believe in Jesus' resurrection; but instead for all time, through succeeding generations, man who has not physically seen may believe and be *blest*.

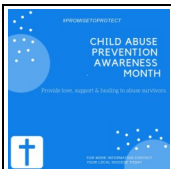
