PASTOR'S MESSAGE

To me, this weekend's Solemn Feast of the Ascension is particularly heart-warming and reassuring to be resolute and at peace, in Christ's farewell and commissioning of the Apostles and us as his disciples. In the first reading; the Acts of the Apostles, the disciple reminds the people of the passion of the Lord and his crucifixion. This was the first time

Jesus was taken from them. Can you imagine their fear of being associated with Jesus, then their deep mourning after he was crucified? The Apostles deeply regretted their abandonment of their friend and their brother. They loved Jesus but they could not stand by him for fear of the Jews. As the shepherd was struck the sheep scattered . . . literally. Are their moments when we succumb to fear and fail to witness to the world our belief, our trust and total dependence on the living God?

Now at this Solemn Feast, Jesus' departure from the Apostles the second time, something is different. First, they were all convinced Jesus was the Messiah, the Son of God, because of the miraculous Resurrection and Jesus having taught them for forty more days. As Jesus ascended into heaven, the Apostles were in awe and there was a long silence as they looked up into the sky, Jesus was "lifted up". This is the stark contrast to when Jesus was first "lifted up" on the cross when they feared and mourned. Imagine the Apostles gathered in that remote area, alone with the Lord, listening attentively to Jesus' final farewell and instruction to wait in Jerusalem for the Advocate. Jesus commissioned them to teach the nations of the Good News and promised the gates of hell shall not prevail against them. He would be with them until the end of the age. Having just witnessed the Ascension, there was a great silence, a stillness of the heart, and the peace of Christ that only He could give.

Today, you and I have the benefit of having heard the greatest love story every told: the Lord's life, death, Resurrection and Ascension. Through Baptism and Confirmation we have encountered the living God as we have received the Holy Spirit, just as the apostles at Pentecost. How are you left at Jesus' bodily Ascension? Are you consoled at having received the Spirit of Truth with its fruits of the Holy Spirit? Are you at peace, knowing the Lord is with you until the end of the Age? And, can you boldly proclaim the goodness, the Gospel of the Lord by word and deed, the witness of your life? At the end of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the priest who stands at the altar in *Persona Christi* blesses you and commissions you into the world saying, "Go in peace, and proclaim the Gospel of the Lord." Then they returned to Jerusalem filled with joy.
