#### **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

This weekend's readings and the Gospel of Luke refer to the bread and wine given as gifts from God, for sustenance, for life. In Paul's epistle to the Corinthians, he paraphrases Christ's, "Eat this... and drink this ... for this is my body and this is my blood...do this in remembrance of me." To "Do this in remembrance" is

to solidify a tradition into our memories so that it would not be forgotten. We remember forms of repetitions since our school days, that help us to remember, such as: practicing math facts and mathematical theorems, historical facts, and scientific principles and methods. At the Last Supper, the master and teacher enjoins us to repeat this eating and drinking of his body and blood, so we would never lose the meaning or the significance of how it gives us life, particularly, as we pass this on from one generation to another.

In the Book of Deuteronomy 6:8 and 11:19 of the Old Testament. The Lord God enjoins His people to a remembrance and practice of His commandments, statutes and decrees as they're about to exit the desert and enter the promised land, and by observing them, their descendants may have a long life. The Lord actually tells the Israelites to "Drill" them into their children, whether busy or at rest. "Bind" them at their wrist as a sign of remembrance, a pendant on their foreheads". And in Proverbs 22:6, "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it." Here the Lord our God is helping us to remember, by "binding", "drilling", and "training" of our children and our children's children. And we do this to remember, not lose its purpose through a Tradition.

In the second reading St. Paul said, "What I hand on to you, I also received from the Lord," a passing on the Spirit of Truth. Jesus said a Master does not share things of his father's business with his slaves, but I am your friend because all that my Father gives me I share it with you. And as we heard last week, Jesus said, "He, the Spirit of Truth, Holy Spirit, will guide you to all truth...He will take from what is mine and declare it to you, everything that is mine, from the Father.'

In other words, how are we as a people of God, faithful in worship, observant to the Commands of God, and the precepts of His Church, are we to receive what we have heard and pass it onto the next generation? Are we truly being observant and passing on the Faith, as we have received it? How is it, that western society across the globe is becoming more secularized and no longer coming to worship at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass? We're having fewer priests and more Christians converting over to NONES, (none of the above religions), not marrying and not baptizing. God knew how complacent and apathetic we could become in our comfort zones, that he calls us to 'remembrance', because as we forget, we fail to pass on the faith to our children and grandchildren. As a Eucharistic people and the Body of Christ, let us seek ways and means of rejuvenating the lifeblood of the Church by being genuine witnesses to the Faith...binding, drilling, and training in them, the 'remembrance' of Him who is Lord.
