



PASTOR’S MESSAGE

Satan is the “fallen” Angel; he and his legions are known in sacred scripture as demonic spirits. Man, on the other hand, is both body and spirit made in the image and likeness of the Good God; he is an *en-fleshed* soul, as soul with flesh. When the World says it is “*spiritual and not religious*”, well . . . so is Satan; he is spirit and he *will not serve* God. In fact, Satan does not want man to serve God either. He wants man to be separated from God and destroyed. How better for Satan to destroy man’s spiritual soul but to target him through his body, “*The spirit is willing but the flesh is weak*”.

St. Paul to the Galatians speaks of the flesh that has desires against the Spirit and Spirit against the flesh as being opposed to each other, but that was not how it was in the beginning. “*God made them male and female . . . and the two became one*”, one in spirit, just as we humbly pray in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, “*That partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ, we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit.*” However, since the Fall of Man at Original Sin, the flesh has been warring against the spirit. The flesh, as desire left onto itself, would be enslaved to sin and the only way to keep the flesh in check, is that it be subject to the Laws of *do this and don’t do that*; threats of wrath and bribes as rewards to temper our desires. The Law is a binding force that enslaves us. To free us from the law that condemns the flesh, we must allow the Spirit of God to guide us. There, the law would no longer be THE enticement for good behavior or a threat of punishment. Instead the Spirit of God enlivens our hearts for love of Him, so as not to offend Him, who is Lord and Master, Our Savior who has loved us, who has atoned for our eternal punishments, that we may have eternal life.

The only way we can understand our call for living in His Spirit that purifies our flesh, is by coming to know Him, love Him, and serve Him as He is revealed to us in the solemn rites given through the Sacramental Life of the Church and her teachings. This is what it means to be . . . “*religious*”. In our Judeo-Christian tradition, religion is the revelation of our Lord God in Jesus Christ. This is what it means to be guided by the Spirit and not by the Law. Let the world be “*spiritual and let it be religious*” as well.
