PASTOR'S MESSAGE



The readings of this weekend, the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time, highlights for us the Call of God: God's call of young Samuel in the Old Testament and Jesus' call of his disciples to come and see, follow him. God calls all of creation to know Him, love

Him and serve Him. God as Creator and Father loves all of us to be one in union with Him. How God manifests His call is by choosing his leaders to shepherd the people. As Jesus gathers his first apostles, Andrew and his brother Simon, he is forming an organization that would become the institution of his Church. This formation is Jesus' organization of the Church that would become his mystical body, his bride, the temples of the Holy Spirit. Some today say "I believe in God, in Jesus Christ, and I am a Christian, but I do not believe in the 'organized religion'". Today we see Jesus beginning the foundation of his Church, which stands on the Apostles with Peter as the cornerstone. Jesus in organizing, developing his Church, would ultimately offer an oblation for the sins of humanity. Jesus himself would become the sacrificial lamb that would be offered as the atonement to God. Jesus would offer himself as the perpetual sacrifice at the Holy Mass as his priests raises the prayers and offerings of the people to God, with the bread of life at the altar.

It is Christ's organizing, developing and commissioning the Church and its sacraments that sanctifies, teaches and helps us to be ordered rightly and justly that we may be one in union with God the Father. God calls Samuel, just as his mother Hannah consecrated and dedicated him to God at this birth. All throughout Old Testament times, God has called and given man a mission to help him usher in the new era of salvation; forming His chosen people, the people of Israel. From the old covenants of Noah, Abraham, Moses, King David to the new Covenant in the Son of God, Jesus the Christ, God calls all to do His works, that all might be saved from the bondages of sin and death.

From our Baptisms, we have been called to enter into new life, one in union with God as our Father. Jesus calls us not only friend, but also brother, sister and mother; you who do the will of the Father. United with the Son of God, we become the Mystical Body of Christ. St. Paul to the Corinthians teaches us to preserve the body by forsaking all immorality, shunning lewd conduct and fornication, that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit. And as one body of Christ, we have been given a mission to evangelize the world by our words and our conduct. It is because of your love for the word of God, that you remain obedient and come to do the will of the Father, that gives praises and glory to God that others would follow.
