

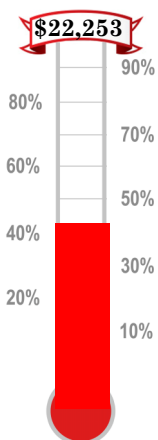

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Matthew's Gospel has been called the "Gospel of the Kingdom." Today's reading illustrates the parable of the bad seed sewn nefariously with the good seed and how they're allowed to mature until the harvest, the end of time when the good will be separated from the bad. God's kingdom allows for growth of both, that the bad may repent and become 'One' with the elected, for heaven. Last week the seed was a parable for the Word of God.

Sometimes we see the good word of God being mixed with the bad word of the enemy, half-truths, so as to deceive and entrap the innocent. For an example, advocates of same-sex marriage point to God creating them 'good' therefore morally free to live the lifestyle. It is true God created all of humanity as good, made in His own image. But as believers we acknowledge the Fall of Man, the doctrine of 'Original Sin', which has corrupted all of God's creation, making of it disorders of hurricanes, tsunamis, earthquakes and defects in the womb that became killers, both in the temporal and spiritual. Death is not what God intended, but His good Word has been perverted with the lies sewn by the devil.

So the good seed of God's Word planted and secretly mixed with the bad seed from the evil One, is the wheat mixed with the weeds. This is evident in politics, the workforce, in schools and colleges, the marketplace, in our families and yes, even in the Church. So we are never really surprised at finding imperfections and weaknesses within the Lord's Church. A lot of this is simply misunderstandings and not knowing the full truth. So we must seek the truth before we rush to judgment. Through his Church Militant, Jesus came to establish the Reign of God's Kingdom of righteousness, truth, justice, peace and mercy. We learn from Jesus who is meek and humble, slow to anger, rich in kindness.

Still, we all have the duty and the obligation to not be quick to judgment. And whenever we experience a perceived injustice, it should be fully investigated and made right. Sacred Scripture teaches the innocent victim must first go to the source and seek restitution. If he/she is not satisfied, then gather two or more witnesses to again seek reparation from the offender. Still if there is no satisfaction, then go to the higher-ups, the Church, the 'chain of command'. If there be a resolution, this will dissuade misunderstandings and hence scandal among the faithful.

I believe in the confidentiality of an Open-Door policy.
