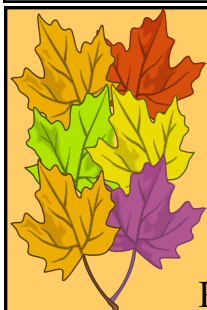


FILL THE FOOD PANTRY

PASTOR’S MESSAGE



Have you ever felt that you were duped, tricked or misled? It’s not a pretty sight, is it? It is a feeling of betrayal. In his most human of experience, that is what the prophet Jeremiah had felt when he wrote, *“I have been duped,”* in the first reading. Worse yet, he believed that he allowed himself to be duped by God. At first, Jeremiah believed he was tricked by God to be His prophet. The burning message of the Lord that brought his heart to initially surrender to God was so strong he could not contain it. The Word had to be shared.

When we first come to the Lord we are in awe of His beauty, His goodness, His truth. And we are exalted in the wonder of His providential care, His love, peace and happiness. Not being able to contain this awe-filled experience only for ourselves, we share the Good News with others. The news of the Gospel is to be lived and to be shared for the salvation of all. There is a price to pay though, for this exalted life on earth. It is to submit to the Ways of the Lord, obedience to His commands, statutes, and teachings. We find ourselves dying to our old ways of thinking and living, denying our primal dispositions, passions and pleasures that are not in harmony with the Gospel. Yet God gives us the grace we need to abstain from these harmful desires.

I too, like the prophet Jeremiah, once felt I let myself be duped by the Lord. Since childhood, I knew I was called to be a spouse and a father, and in early adulthood I decided to follow the Lord toward that end; with the precepts of the Lord and His chaste love. As I approached mid-life I asked, *“Where is she...where are my children...have I been duped?”* Slowly dying to myself, continuously surrendering and rising into a newness of life in God, my heart-felt convictions could no longer be contained as I spoke His praises. But not everyone wanted to hear them as I found myself alone with persecutions, an object of laughter and mockery. I would wake up in a sweat, my heart beating with rage of the injustice and violence. I’d tell myself it was only a dream but in reality it wasn’t.

Like the two disciples who unknowingly encountered the risen Lord on the Road to Emmaus, my heart was burning within me and His Word imprisoned in my bones; the Good News of the Risen Lord to proclaim everywhere with the witness of my life. Then he revealed to me what would be my bride and my children: that of the Lord’s consummated at Calvary, in the sanctuary of His church. He granted my prayers that would exceed my greatest longings. God’s ways are not our ways.

By the very nature of our Baptisms we are all called to die to ourselves and take up our cross; for to be not of the world yet still be in the world is countercultural. Everyday we must remind ourselves in prayer that our true home is in the Lord, the Father’s glory accompanied by his angels at heaven’s gate. To find our lives we must lose it, take up our cross and follow Jesus. It is an act of the will, renewed daily. Let the consolation of the Lord be our hope, always for the glory of heaven, our ultimate union with God.
