Be Salty

I want you to close your eyes. Now think of the greatest saint in history. I don't care who you're thinking of. It's going to be different for everyone. Think of his or her life and answer the question: Why is he or she a great saint?

You're all thinking of different people, but the answer is the same for everyone. It's not "Because he did great things for God" or "Because she sacrificed everything she had for the poor." The reason is something more.

The greatest saints in history were not great at holiness. God brought holiness about within them because they were great at being who they were meant to be. Not who they wanted to be. Not who they thought they should be. Who they were meant to be. Simply put, they gave themselves to God. All of themselves. Flaws and all. And God took them, in their totality, and said: "Now watch this."

Just imagine if salt was ashamed of being salty and decided it was going to stop being salt. Now it's just a box of tiny rocks. Wouldn't it have been better for the salt to trust the baker using it?

There is a plan for each of us. There is a path to holiness for each of us. This path doesn't bypass our flaws or our weaknesses; it incorporates them. It transforms them. It fulfills them.

So be salty. Be who you were meant to be.

Prayer to St. Joseph

For centuries, Christians have relied on the intercessory prayers of Joseph, earthly spouse of the Blessed Virgin and foster father of Christ, who was obedient to the will of God in all things.

One particular novena prayer to St. Joseph is often called "the unfailing prayer to St. Joseph." It is thought to have originated in the first century A.D. and was sent by the pope to Emperor Charles as he went into battle. It is said that those who recite this prayer will not suffer a sudden death and will likewise be protected from drowning, the effects of poison and fire, falling into the hands of the enemy or being overpowered in battle.

All Saints Parish Pantry








