St. Michael Prayer, Explained!

The prayer to St. Michael invokes the protection of the archangel Michael in the ongoing spiritual battle for the souls of all mankind. This prayer was composed by Pope Leo XIII and its use was instituted in 1886 at the end of Low Mass, a tradition which continued until the liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council. A popular story regarding its origin claims that the Pope wrote this prayer after having a vision of demonic spirits descending on Rome.

Michael is mentioned as one of God's seven archangels in the Book of Enoch and is presented by Revelations 12:7-12 as the warrior angel who cast Satan from heaven. He is therefore traditionally venerated as a protector against the forces of evil and a guardian of the Church.

The Prayer to St. Michael is still commonly said at the end of the rosary and by some parishes after the conclusion of Mass.

Questions of the Week ~ Reflect and Respond to the Scripture

First Reading: Isaiah speaks of God's love and care for Jerusalem as a loving mother who feeds and comforts her child. What are some favorite memories or images you have of your mother?

Second Reading: Paul ends his letter to the Galatians emphasizing that believers are part of God's "new creation", no longer defined by circumcision and uncircumcision. How does your faith community encourage or energize you to think differently?

Gospel: The 72 followers of Jesus succeeded in their work to preach the kingdom of God and heal the sick and demon possessed. What does a successful parish look like today?

We are all *Called and Sent!*

This weekend we are kicking off our *Called and Sent – A Campaign for the Church for Tomorrow*. This is a diocesan-wide effort to raise \$30 million to support seminarian education, our retired priests, and evangelization of youth and young adults. Our parish will also benefit from the campaign.

Each parish has been given a goal for the campaign. The goal for All Saints is \$215,000. Keep in mind that we are seeking to raise these funds over five years.



Strengthening Parishes (\$10 million)

The parish is where the church lives. Recognizing the primary role of the parish, 40% of all funds raised up to the parish goal will remain with our parish for our own needs. If we are fortunate to exceed our goal, we will retain 60%. We will use our share of funds to renovate the bungalows.



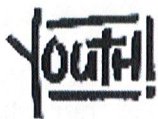
Seminarian Education (\$10 million)

Our diocese is blessed to have seven men studying to be priest. But this comes at a high cost. Did you know it costs \$55,000 to send one man to the seminary for one year.



Priest Retirement Fund (\$7 million)

Currently, there are 22 priests retired from active ministry with another 16 eligible to retire in the next five years. Our Priest Retirement Fund is severely underfunded.



Evangelization of Youth and Young Adults (\$3 million)

Establish an Office of Youth and Young Adults to work with parishes in the coordinated effort to ensure that our young people remain active members in their parish communities.

We are pleased to report that a number of families have already stepped forward to pledge their support to the campaign. As of this writing, we have secured \$82,000 towards our goal. That is 38% of our goal!

The Synod Corner #4



We continue our reading of Part II, *On the Boat Together*, namely the section titled *Charisms, Vocations and Ministries for Mission* (Pages 19 – 23).

Christians, individually and as part of ecclesial movements and associations, are called to bear fruit by sharing the gifts they have been given and to witness to the Gospel. (#57)

In our Church communities and parishes, these gifts are offered and shared by all of the Baptized, women and men who have equal dignity as believers (#61), young people who have gifts to offer to the renewal of the Church (#62), people with disabilities who feel called and sent (#63), married persons and families and those who have chosen to live alone (#64), men and women in consecrated life (#65), and theologians through their contributions of research and study. (#67).

Each of these persons, each of us, is gift created by a loving God, a God who calls us to share our giftedness with one another as we move forward together in mission, companions of faith, hope and charity giving witness to the Risen Christ.

The People of the Diocese of Stockton have stated, "the mission of the Church is best served by accepting and empowering each of us to offer our special gifts and skills in our role of co-responsibility for mission."

May the Holy Spirit continue to guide us in our desire to be a Synodal Church.

Feast of St. Benedict ~ July 11, 2025

Have you ever wanted to change the world? 5th century Europe was a dark place. The Roman Empire had fallen, and barbarian tribes were picking over the scraps of what remained. Faith hung on, but there was no consistent, coherent Christian culture in the world around. Young Benedict began his life with education and privilege but became disillusioned by a life pursuing material success. He withdrew to a monastery and spent much time in solitude. He began attracting followers, whom he organized over time into 12 monasteries, with a 13th established to train young monks. He wrote a rule of life including basic principles for living as Christ. His monks took three vows: conversion to Christ, obedience to the local abbot, and stability to remain with the community. Benedictine monasteries became lights in the darkness, secure centers of Christian culture enlivening the faithful beyond their walls. When the world around us seems complicated and contrary to the Gospel, how will you be a light?

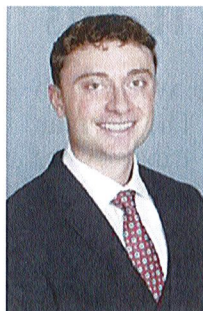
