



The 2016 Marines Toys For Tots Ride in Arizona took place on Saturday November 19. All toys & monies collected during this event stay in Maricopa County to benefit the Marines Toys for Tots Program.

This year's sign-in took place at Harley-Davidson of Scottsdale, 15656 N Hayden Rd from 9-11am. Breakfast, donated by HDoS, was included in the registration fee. This was a self-paced ride, so once you were ready to roll the only thing to keep in mind was being at the last stop by 2pm.

The ride headed west this year, with stops at Connolly's Sports Grill in Phoenix, Beaver Bar & Grill in Phoenix, and last stop at Desert Rose Pizza in Glendale for the end party.

More than 200 people participated in this event.

The head count comes from meal tickets being turned in at the last stop for the lunch that was also part of the entry fee. Many people come out to take the ride & make their donation, but don't claim the meal. {Fewer meal tickets redeemed means less money paid out & deducted from the donations collected.

The band Skarlett Fever entertained ~ and donated their time to the cause... How cool is THAT?! Brat relayed, "There was a 50/50 and tons of raffle prizes that were donated."

This was a 'family-friendly' event. According to Sue, "There were several kids riding with their parents and the Marine who volunteered with us that day also brought his wife and family to see Santa at the registration. Rick Black always steps up and plays Santa for us and at other events across the Valley."

The Marines Toys for Tots received from this event, "approximately 12 large toy boxes filled; plus a truck load of toys that were donated a few weeks later by a private donor living in Fountain Hills."

October 15, 2016 ... The Reason Riders Association concluded their inaugural Blanket Drive for Homeless Veterans. From September 1st until October 15, blankets and cash donations could be dropped off at Arrowhead HD, St Nick's Tavern, Charley's Place, Timmy Tees Shirt Shop, & the VFW on Purdue Ave. Online donations were also being received via the Reason Riders website, http://reasonriders.com/. More than 350 blankets were collected.

We got this wrap up from RRA President Bishop, "'Operation Marshmallow' is the organization that we contracted with to do the delivery to the homeless Vets. Many blankets have already been given out in the city parks around the Phoenix area and on street corners. At least a hundred have been

set aside to distribute to the homeless at the upcoming <u>Arizona Stand Down</u>. The hand-made blankets and afghans that were donated have been rolled up, wrapped, and covered in patriotic ribbon. They were then given out as honors to disabled Viet Nam Veterans and to the Parents of deployed children. We did receive donations from all over the country. The U.S Military Vets MC (Wild West Chapter) came through with more than 100 blankets and set up the relationship for us to be able to partner with Harbor Freight and Tools, who graciously sold us the high quality quilted waterproof blankets at a considerable discounted price. That allowed our donated money to go much farther than buying at full retail prices. We are extremely grateful for that. The New Founders of Freedom also held a special ceremony to donate to the Bikers for Blankets Drive and hosted a great party to present the donation to us. Many online outlets picked up the story and helped spread the word as well. It was a true showing of charity where help was needed. We hope that next year we can repeat the success of the inaugural event and make a staying presence in the State."

Wiring Harness could Fray and Brake Line may Melt. In the affected vehicles, the wiring harness can fray and contact the ABS modulator. If the brake line is electrically conductive, the brake line may overheat and melt. If the brake line melts, brake failure may result, increasing the risk of a crash. Potential Number of Units Affected: 5,812.

Remedy: KTM will notify owners, and dealers will re-position the wiring harness for the electronic control unit, free of charge. The manufacturer has not yet provided a notification schedule. Owners may contact KTM customer service at 1-888-985-6090. Summary: Indian Motorcycle Company (Indian) is recalling certain model year 2014-2017 Chief Classic, Chief Dark Horse, Vintage, Chieftain, Chieftain Dark Horse, Springfield and Roadmaster motorcycles manufactured April 15, 2013, to July 15, 2016.

Fuel Rail may Chafe and Leak. In the affected motorcycles, the fuel rail may contact other components and result in a fuel leak. A fuel leak in the presence of an ignition source increases the risk of a fire. Potential Number of Units Affected: 23,746.

Remedy: Indian will notify owners, and dealers will install a bracket that will limit movement of the fuel rail, free of charge. The recall is expected to begin in December 2016. Owners may contact Indian customer service at 1-877-204-3697. Indian's number for this recall is I-16-03.

MPP - Filming Police in Public is a Constitutional Right

Does a person have the right to film police officers in public? Despite clear precedent, the MPP has received the inquiry many times. This is a particularly relevant question relating to developing a "pattern of evidence" that proves motorcycle profiling is occurring. Indeed, video of police profiling motorcyclists was critical to passing the law addressing motorcycle profiling in both Washington State and Maryland.

As Americans, we should all be able to agree that the right to be present in a public place and gather information about an ongoing public concern is fundamental to a free society. This is the essence of political expression, political speech, and a free press, particularly when discussing issues of government accountability.

To deny the right to gather information in a public space would deprive the public knowledge about government abuses. Without this knowledge there is no impetus for advancing police accountability.

A LEGAL OPINION-SIMPLE AND CONCISE

Millie Thompson, an attorney from Austin involved in both the criminal and civil proceedings stemming from the Waco tragedy that occurred on May 17, 2015, recently discussed the issue on social media. Thompson writes:

For those of you who don't know:

We have co-equal rights to 1) be present in a public place, 2) gather information on a matter of public concern, and 3) speak on a matter of public concern. Police officers – as public officials and

agents of the government – are by definition a matter of public concern.

We therefore have the right to film them.

This is not a privilege. It is a Constitutional right. Period.

Filming the police may not be something you would consider doing. You may also not be the type of grab a picket sign and take to the streets to protest something.

Pick a topic about which you are passionate whatever it is – it doesn't have to be something I

Are you passionate about pro-life? Are you passionate about supporting the troops? Or 'backing the blue?' Pick a topic that you believe in. The people who support that issue have the same rights as those who disagree with you. Remember do unto others?

You don't have to agree with a person's agenda to defend their First Amendment rights around that agenda.

Why defend it? Because it may be you in the future who wants to speak about an issue. Or - itmay be you who wants to gather information about government actors so that you have something interesting to say when you do speak.

Do you believe in government accountability? Don't people need to know what the government is doing in order to hold them accountable?

WHAT DO THE COURTS SAY?

The right to express information relating to an ongoing public concern often frames discussions concerning the 1st Amendment. Less commonly understood is the equally fundamental right to gather that information. Moreover, in an era of cell phone videos and social media the courts have granted individual citizens the same fundamental right to gather information in public as it has traditionally afforded the credentialed press.

In Buehler v. City of Austin (2014), the federal

court concludes that the right to film the police in public derives from "foundational and long-standing principles of constitutional law."

"A private citizen has the right to assemble in a public forum, receive information on a matter of public concern—such as police officers performing their official duties—and to record that information for the purpose of conveying that information."

A WORD OF CAUTION

Despite the fundamental right to record the police, caution is in order. The right is not absolute and without limits. When filming police take care not to break the law or interfere with an officer's ability to do their jobs.

"[N]either the First Amendment right to receive speech nor the First Amendment right to gather news is absolute." Davis v. E. Baton Rouge Parish Sch. Bd., 78 F.3d 920, 928 (5th Cir. 1996). An individual is not permitted to break the law in the process of filming the police in public. For example, an individual cannot interfere with the police's ability to do their job. "Thus, to the extent that an individual, in exercising his First Amendment right to film police officers as they execute their official duties. violates a valid criminal law, he cannot plausibly argue that his First Amendment right acts as a shield that protects him from criminal liability."



Temps were in the 70's for the morning ride out. It was a great ride on a perfect day ~ with clear sky, a cool breeze, & no chem-trails as we made our way to Harley-Davidson of Scottsdale, located at 15656 N Hayden Rd in Scottsdale, for Bob's Biker Blast. This was their 5th annual event, held in support of Phoenix Children's Hospital on November 5, 2016. It is a combined effort, co-sponsored by HDoS and GO AZ Motorcycles in Scottsdale and Peoria, along with entrepreneur and philanthropist Bob Parsons.

Vendor booths were set up outside the service area, manned with reps & distributors for Kuryakyn, Vance & Hines, Progressive Suspension, Performance Machine, & Everything LED. Specials were being offered in the Service Department for this weekend.

There was a lot of activity at HDoS , with a good looking turnout of people \sim even before the PCH Ride arrived. We met up with people we hadn't seen in a while, which is a bonus of these large-scale parties... You often get to re-acquaint with old friends, along with meeting new ones. There were numerous organizations represented along with a houseful of independent riders.

Bug Hall, of the Discovery Channel mini-series "Harley & the Davidsons" was available for photo ops & autographs. The Arizona Cardinals Cheerleaders were there as well. And of course who would pass up the shopping opportunities at the 'World's Largest H-D Dealership'?

Some 500 riders made the self-paced "I Ride For PCH" run from Phoenix Children's Hospital in Phoenix to HDoS. The entry fee included lunch, a commemorative bandana, a gift bag, & more.

We took a stroll over to the concert venue. There was a crew working to get everything ready for the anticipated crowd. The stage was flanked by VIP

seating areas, rows of picnic tables were set up for dining, bleachers were set up closer to the stage, there was a covered open-air bar with couches & bigscreen TVs for watching the concert. Food vendors 'Up in Smoke BBQ' and 'Sweet Things' were joined by stations with plenty of refreshing adult beverages including Jack Daniels & Miller Lite. There was plenty of clear space stage-front for dancing. Big screens to either side of the stage would transmit images from the stage for the people further back in the audience.

If you had a motorcycle endorsement, entry to the concert was free for you and your passenger. An estimated crowd of 8,000 motorcyclists and music fans gathered to see country artists Montgomery Gentry, Craig Morgan, and Kellie Pickler perform.

Lisa Cyr of FX Promotions sent along this statement, "Mr. Parsons holds this event each year with two goals in mind. To raise funds for Phoenix Children's Hospital and to throw a free party for the entire riding community. Obviously those two goals are a little challenging to achieve in conjunction with each other. Where do the proceeds come from if you're letting everyone with a motorcycle endorsement into the concert for free? The ride from PCH generates some revenue, as does food and beverage sales and there are proceeds from ticket sales to non-riders and for the VIP Decks, as well as additional cash donations made at the gate. But the bulk of the donation each year comes from the Bob and Renee Parsons <u>Foundation</u>. That's right, Bob not only foots the bill for all the expenses associated with putting on Bob's Biker Blast, he also puts up the majority of the huge check presented to PCH. This year that check was \$250k! About \$180k of that check came from the Parsons Foundation.

"FX Promotions is tremendously honored to

have been a part of Bob's Biker Blast since its inaugural event in 2012. We look forward each year to working with the great folks in Mr. Parsons organization to make each Bob's Biker Blast bigger and better."

It is inspiring & heartwarming to observe that such wealthy people as Bob Parsons & his wife Renee are willing to dedicate themselves so deeply in their community, on behalf of numerous causes. You can learn more about The Bob & Renee Parsons Foundation via the website https://www.tbrpf.org/

There was SO MUCH positive feedback about this event. Bob Parsons and his team have hosted another rousing success. We're glad we could be there.

We heard afterwards from Andreanne at Desert Wind Harley-Davidson that the final count from this event was 300 bears plus \$1220.



When homeless Vets find the safety and security of this camp, it gives them the opportunity to seek support from the VA representatives and focus on finding a job & help rather than their next meal.

Numerous people have 'graduated' from the camp; they've found jobs and more traditional homes. They, in turn, are doing what they can to guide homeless Vets to the camp, support the camp, and bring awareness to the issue of our homeless Veterans.



From Military To Civilian – A Seamless Transition


When members of the Armed Forces of the United States finish at least one year of their tour of deployment they need to enroll in the Veterans Administration (VA) program to obtain any VA Health Benefits they may be entitled to receive. Service members need to enroll PROMPTLY and do it NOW by following these steps:

- Obtain a copy of your service medical records prior to discharge. Do not take any shortcuts when separating and do this immediately. Any idea of hurrying to get home may cost you time and money should you require VA Healthcare at any time in the future.
- A veteran has two years, after separation, to apply for medical conditions that are a result of their service in the military. After two years the process becomes more difficult.
- If you require medical assistance from the VA after separation/discharge, bring with you a copy of your medical records, a copy of your DD-214, and two forms of picture identification.
- Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in your medical records.
- **Enroll in the VA IMMEDIATELY. Do Not Procrastinate!!** Know your rights and your responsibilities. If you are not sure, ASK-ASK-ASK-ASK-ASK-ASK!!! Ensure that your transition is smooth. Know what you need to do, and DO IT!
- Join a veterans service organization American Legion, DAV, Rolling Thunder®, VFW, AMVETS, Marine Corps League, Alliance of Marine Corps Veterans, etc.

"Our 33rd Annual Toy Run, held December 4, 2016, had approximately 1600 participants, with well over 1000 bikes and trikes in our procession. We started at the Blue Bar II in Parker at 12 noon sharp, with an escort by the La Paz County Sheriff's Department to the Bill Williams Bridge. 
"We collected \$725, 150 Turkeys, and 350 pounds of non-perishable items. What a great job we did.

Santa wants to try to thank all of my elfs:


