



Arizona Bike Week's Peace Out, Prostate Cancer Ride took place this year on Wednesday April 5, 2017. This was the event's fifth year and the first official ride of ABW2017. It came about as a way for event organizer Shelley Martin to honor her father and grandfather, both of whom were taken by prostate cancer.

More than 250 riders participated in this selfpaced ride. Sign-in was at HD of Scottsdale, 15656 N. Hayden Rd, 85260. Stops were at the Bartlett Lake Grill, RnR Gastropub in Old-Town Scottsdale, Dirty Dogg Saloon, and of course Westworld to wrap the run. Westworld's attractions for Wednesday included a concert by Brett Michaels that evening, included in your ride entry fee.

The POPC Ride beneficiary is the <u>Prostate Can-</u> cer Awareness Project. Monies donated to the POPC

go to pay for free PSA screenings for men, through the Healthwaves testing laboratory. \$12K was raised by the event... which will go a long way toward this effort.

Shelley extends thanks to Harley-Davidson of Scottsdale, Chuck Franklin Law and Buddy Johnson for their support. She also thanks everyone who came out for their participation.

Men are encouraged to get prostate cancer blood screening starting at age 35. According to resources on the http://peaceoutprostatecancer.org webpage, PC can be overcome if it is caught early. The PSA [Prostate-Specific Antigen] is a simple blood test that you can get through your doctor, at one of Shelley Martin's events at Harley-Davidson of Scottsdale, or for \$35 dollars directly from a Lab near you. PSA level tests are being done on July 29 at HDoS

from 10a - 1pm, and again on November 18 ~ same place & time. This is a free test, covered by the Peace Out Prostate Cancer Ride organization. Appointments are necessary, so call 480-213-1920 to make yours. If you are unable to attend one of these upcoming screenings at HDoS, there is a link http://peaceoutprostatecancer.org/healthwaves/ which will lead you to instructions on where to go and what to do to get your screening paid for by Peace Out, Prostate CancerTM.

MPP - Motorcycle Clubs Successfully Pressure State Farm to Change Policy?

The MPP is pleased to report that the National Council of Clubs (NCOC) has successfully pressured State Farm Insurance to clarify that, as of June 19, 2017, it is no longer State Farm policy to deny coverage to "businesses engaged with motorcycle clubs." Although decisions to insure any business, including motorcycle clubs, are made on a case by case basis, State Farm says it has no general policy to deny coverage to businesses engaged with motorcycle clubs.

The NCOC approached State Farm because of a letter dated February 27, 2017 from State Farm denying coverage to a Veteran's motorcycle club because "we don't provide coverage for businesses engaged with motorcycle clubs." State Farm's original response was vague and avoided the explicit questions being asked by the NCOC, so the NCOC continued to press State Farm for clarification on its policy concerning motorcycle clubs.

The June 19, 2017 response from State Farm is, with one exception, clear and concise. There is still one question that has not been clarified. The original letter dated February 27, 2017 explicitly states that "we do not provide coverage to businesses engaged with motorcycle clubs." This statement in the February 27, 2017 letter is plainly stated and incontrovertible.

Clearly, according to the June 19th response, this is not State Farm policy any longer.

Did State Farm change this policy after the February 27th letter or was the February 27th letter an inaccurate statement of State Farm policy?

Regardless, State Farm is now explicitly em-

bracing the MPP's fight against profiling and discrimination as evidenced by the following:

June 19, 2017
The National Council of Clubs,

Thank you for reaching out to us regarding business insurance coverage. While we are not able to discuss the specifics of any particular application or customer's policy information, due to our customer privacy policy, we would like to clear up any misunderstandings.

To be clear, it is not State Farm's policy to deny coverage to businesses engaged with motorcycle clubs. We offer a variety of business insurance options to help small businesses succeed. However, as previously stated, for clubs and organizations seeking business insurance, including motorcycle clubs, we review each applicant's eligibility individually. Some organizations may or may not be eligible for coverage. Again, we are not able to discuss the specifics of any particular application, however, we can tell you that it is not State Farm's policy to deny coverage to businesses engaged with motorcycle clubs.

Additionally, State Farm supports the motorcycle community, and offers individual motorcycle coverage for eligible vehicles licensed for use on public roads. For more information, please see our website.

We appreciate all you do along with other projects that aim to address profiling and discrimination. At State Farm, we're committed to an inclusive environment where all our associates and customers are treated with respect and dignity, and differences are valued.

The back story ... This is a followup to the May

2, 2017 article entitled "State Farm Insurance Says No Coverage For Motorcycle Clubs" which shared that the MPP received a copy of "a letter from State Farm Insurance notifying a chapter of the Legacy Vets Motorcycle Club in Florida that the insurance coverage on their clubhouse was being cancelled."

The article goes on,

State Farm's explanation for the policy cancellation is "we don't provide coverage for businesses engaged in motorcycle clubs." The MPP personally verified the incident in a face-to-face conversation with the individual that provided the letter to the MPP. He is a member of the chapter denied coverage.

<snip> Recently, the National Council of Clubs, an organization representing the interests of motorcycle clubs and motorcyclists nationwide, wrote a letter requesting clarification of State Farm's policy based on the cancellation notice given to the Legacy Vets MC. The NCOC believes that no motorcyclist or business that supports motorcyclists should engage in business with State Farm if they choose to stand by a general policy of denying coverage to businesses engaged in motorcycle clubs.

From Military To Civilian – A Seamless Transition

When members of the Armed Forces of the United States finish at least one year of their tour of deployment they need to enroll in the Veterans Administration (VA) program to obtain any VA Health Benefits they may be entitled to receive.

Service members need to enroll PROMPTLY and do it NOW by following these steps:

- Obtain a copy of your service medical records prior to discharge. Do not take any shortcuts when separating and do this immediately. Any idea of hurrying to get home may cost you time and money should you require VA Healthcare at any time in the future.

- If you require medical assistance from the VA after separation/discharge, bring with you a copy of your medical records, a copy of your DD-214, and two forms of picture identification.
- Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in your medical records.
- Enroll in the VA IMMEDIATELY. Do Not Procrastinate!! Know your rights and your responsibilities. If you are not sure, ASK-ASK-ASK-ASK-ASK!!! Ensure that your transition is smooth. Know what you need to do, and DO IT!
- **Join a veterans service organization** American Legion, DAV, Rolling Thunder®, VFW, AMVETS, Marine Corps League, Alliance of Marine Corps Veterans, etc.

Richard {Dick} Melvin Tush ~ In Loving Memory


October 1, 1936 - April 22, 2017

Dick Tush was born on October 1, 1936. He passed away peacefully in his sleep on April 22, 2017 shortly after moving from Show Low, AZ to Hollister, CA. His health had been declining for a while.

He was born in Pittsburgh, PA and loved to go back & visit his old friends and haunts each vear.

We've known Dick Tush for more than 20 years. Over those years we've ridden together, broken bread together, slept under each other's roofs, and shared times both good and less so.

We met Tush around 1996 ~ during our tenure as state officers for MMA-AZ, when he was Manager of the White Mountain District. It was shortly after he moved from California to his new life of retirement in Show





Low, AZ.

As Vice Chairman, Bruce would work with him through personnel and other District issues. As State Membership Director, I would work with him on memberships. He kept me busy, too; as he was always signing up people and businesses. He was fantastic at it.

As Editors for the Motorcycle Patriot and later for AZ Rider, we got to know more about him from his writings. He would drive me crazy when he TYPED EVERYTHING IN CAPITAL LETTERS! ©

You could tell from riding with him and watching his ramrod straight back that he was a motor cop. He was very proud of his time with the San Jose Motor Unit. He would share great stories of past exploits, both in the military {USAF} & civilian police forces. He described himself as a regular old-style neighborhood 'cop on the beat' type officer. I once asked him what kind of cop he was. He answered ... "The type you hoped you'd meet."

One of the many organizations he was part of in San Jose was the Municipal Motorcycle Officers of California (MMOC). Among other activities, he would cook & coordinate the food for conventions & fundraisers.

Carrying that forward to civilian life, he would, on a much smaller scale, host parties & BBQs for friends over July 4, during the Christmas holidays, and other occasions.

We will miss our lengthy conversations. Many an hour were spent at 'Casa de Tush' sitting around his big dining room table, visiting, drinking coffee, swapping stories,

discussing topics large & small, 'solving' the problems of the world, & philosophizing. He spoke so fondly of his children and grandkids. We'd go on that way from early in the morning on 'til the day was half gone and that was just fine.

Other days we'd all be up and out the door for a ride and of course socializing around Da Mountain ©

While at times he could be an irritating fellow ~ lol ... He is a dear and irreplaceable friend who we will miss so very much.

Saddle Up for Kids

The AZ Bike Week 5th annual "Saddle Up for Kids Ride" took place on Friday April 7, 2017. It is organized by HOGZ United Charities, Inc to benefit AZ's 'Camp Courage', a summer camp for youth burn survivors. My thanks to HogzUC President Ken Gray for his help with this report.

300+ riders gathered at H-D of Scottsdale for registration & breakfast, included in your ride fee and hosted by the Waffle House. While this isn't specifically a 'Family-friendly' event, there are parents / grandparents who sometimes have minors riding with them. They are welcome to come along.

The day's ride offered two options, a longer ride of about 235 miles, or a shorter ride of about 100 miles. The same map was provided to all riders, so there is no distribution available as to how many took which route. It was a self-paced poker ride, with the understanding that you had to be at the last stop by 5:30 to get in on the raffles and prizes. A \$300 prize to the high-hand winner & \$200 to low hand were good incentive ©

The long run went up into the mountains and

had stops at Jakes Corner in Payson, Sportsman Chalet in Strawberry, then to Camp Verde south on I-17 to Peaks & Valleys, with the last stop at WestWorld for AZ Bike Week activities.

The short run stayed more in town. This option was appreciated, because sometimes there are riders who wanted to support the cause but don't have the time needed to take the whole ride.

Ken explained that this organization is a 501c3 and all of their board members are volunteers. No salaries means all monies donated go to the cause...



Burn Camp Ride to Camp

Thank you to Lori Klauber, Secretary/Treasurer for Wind & Fire MC #113 for sharing this day with all of us!

The Burn Camp Ride on June 5th had 84 participants. This ride is not a poker run. It is a ride to deliver the money that we and our sponsors raise throughout the year for the burn camp, to take tours of the camp, and to spend some time with the awesome children who attend this camp.

We raised approximately \$35,000. Since 100% of our donation goes directly to the children, we purchase things that the camp needs to make the camp a fun experience for them. This year we purchased gifts for the archery program, 3 trikes and 2 pedal cars for the bike program, hydration packs and boonie hats for all of the campers and counselors, small flashlights on lanyards for the children to find their way when at night, and two 15-man tents for the overnight camping program. We give the balance to the burn foundation as restricted funds to be used toward the rental of the camp and food for the children for the week that they are at the camp. It cost between \$1200 and \$1500 per child to attend the camp. The children pay nothing.

The ride leaves Fire Station 56 on Carefree Highway, goes to Wickenburg, stops at the Chevron at Vulture Mine Road, then to Yarnell via Highway 93. There's a stop in Wickenburg for a tribute to the Granite Mountain 19, then up Yarnell Hill and a stop

at Fire Station 1 on White Spar Road in Prescott. We pick up more riders and then out Old Senator Highway to Pine Summit Camp.

This year we had the honor of having Scott Pasmore from Channel 3 News and Barry Caraway on the ride.

Our donors are pretty generous. There were 50 raffle prizes including a 50" flat screen TV, a two-night stay in Laughlin, golf foursome, baskets filled with goodies, \$450 window tint, \$250 auto detail, DiamondBack tickets, chiropractic adjustments, food gift certificates, Wet & Wild gift certificates, bowling gift certificates, Walgreen gift certificates, and many more.

The winners for the ride are all of the participants as they get to see how the camp helps enrich the lives of the children who attend. We have adults and children who participate in this ride. It changes your life and makes you appreciate what we have and joyful that you can enrich the lives of the children who have been through so much.

The children who attend this camp are all burn victims. Many of them have been burned by someone they know. Some you can hardly tell that they have been burned, as their clothing hides their scars; and some are missing limbs, noses, ears, etc. It is an honor and privilege to be able to participate. Our ride is open to all who want to participate. Our only request is that you wear a helmet into the camp. The minors who participate in the ride seem to enjoy it.







June 11, 2017 ... Fatal Motorcycle Collision ~ Tucson ... According to Sergeant Kimberly Bay of the Tucson PD Public Information Office, "On June 11, 2017, around 2:00 p.m., officers from Operations Division East and members from the Tucson Fire Department responded to a report of a serious injury single motorcycle collision in the 8200 block of E. Tanque Verde Rd. Upon arrival, they located an adult male motorcycle rider with obvious signs of trauma. Paramedics treated the male but he succumbed to injuries and was pronounced deceased on scene.

"Detectives from the Tucson Police Department Traffic Investigations Unit responded to the scene to continue the investigation. They interviewed witnesses and collected evidence. They learned the rider of a 1998 Harley Davidson motorcycle was eastbound in the 8200 block of E. Tanque Verde Rd. Witnesses observed the rider travel in and out of both lanes at a high rate of speed. As the rider moved from the curb lane to the median lane, he struck the raised median. The rider then crossed over the median and crashed into the westbound curb lane. The rider was wearing a helmet but it dislodged during the collision.

"The motorcycle rider has been identified as 60-year-old Ricky Jay Broschat. Next of kin has been notified."

6-14-2017 ... Recall ~ NHTSA Campaign #: 17V380 Front Brake Line may Rub and Leak Potential Number of Units Affected 1,139

Summary: Piaggio Group Americas, Inc. (Piaggio) is recalling certain 2016-2017 Moto Guzzi V7 III Racer 750, V7 III Stone 750, V7 III Special 750, V9 Bobber and V9 Roamer motorcycles. The front ABS brake hose may rub against the engine's secondary air system connection, possibly resulting in a brake fluid leak. A loss of brake fluid can lengthen

the distance needed to stop the motorcycle, increasing the risk of a crash.

Remedy: Piaggio will notify owners, and dealers will secure the front ABS brake hose to prevent it from rubbing. Any hose that has already been damaged, will be replaced. The repairs will be made free of charge. The recall is expected to begin in June 2017. Owners may contact Piaggio customer service at 1-212-380-4433.

6-23-17 ... Fatal Motorcycle Wreck ~ Tucson. According to Sergeant Pete Dugan of the Tucson PD Public Information Office, "On June 23, 2017, just after midnight, officers from Operations Division South were dispatched to the 5300 block of East Valencia Road for a report of a serious injury collision involving a motorcycle. Rural Metro Fire was also dispatched due to the incident location being near city and county borders. Fire personnel treated the motorcyclist on scene and then transported him to Banner University Medical Center with life threatening injuries. Shortly after arrival at the hospital, the motorcyclist sadly succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced deceased. He has been identified as 63-year-old Michael Ray Fischella. Next of kin have been notified.

"Detectives with the Tucson Police Traffic Investigations Unit responded to continue the investigation. It was determined that Mr. Fischella was eastbound in the 5300 block of East Valencia when he struck a guardrail on the south side of the roadway. Mr. Fischella was thrown from his black 2011 Yamaha motorcycle. It is uncertain why contact was made with the guardrail. Speed does not appear to be a factor and Mr. Fischella was wearing a helmet at the time of the collision.

"Anyone with information about the collision is asked to [contact] 88-CRIME."

In 2017 the Patriots Tour will be escorting the flag across Arizona July 13-15. The flag will be in Flagstaff July 14, and Mayor Coral Evans has pledged City support for celebrations and events. Dan Smith - Regional Commander, and Rick Bitzer, NOP Arizona State Chairman, both feel it is gratifying to know where money goes when you donate, and in this case 100% of the money raised in Arizona stays in Arizona.

Arizona Bike Week turned 21 this year, with events taking place from April 5-9, 2017.

Concerts included Bret Michaels, Credence Clearwater Revisited, Korn, & Alice Cooper with Co-op; with a good mix of local talent added to the headliners. Music on the RockYard and Handlebar Saloon stages, vendors, rider exhibitions, flat track racing, an auction, and *more*, gave attendees plenty of things to do.

Thank you to Lisa Cyr, of AZ Bike Week, for her help in sharing this story with you.

Saturday's weather offered mid 70's in the morning with light cloud cover keeping things comfortably cool for walking around at WestWorld as the day progressed.

The HD of Scottsdale Motorcycle Drill Team put on an impressive performance in the Bike Arena. A dozen riders were all in continuous motion on full-size HD touring bikes.

The Bike Show was actually 3-in-1... Three different competitions going on at once... Baddest Bagger, Ms AZ Bike Week – for women-only, and a general entry BadAZ Bike Show. There were lots of good looking rides in the mix! While we may not always agree on the designs, we definitely admire the imagination, artwork & talent of the owners, creators, & builders.

This was the 6th year for the Busted Knuckles Stunt Show {http://harley-stunts.com} to be here performing. King Tony always puts on a good show ~ blending balance, agility & showmanship. He & his team have some amazing tricks. And each year they do what they can to one-up themselves!

The FMX Freestyle Motocross riders were awesome to watch... but the indoor setting was difficult to photograph. Leave it to say that next year you DEFINITELY want to check them out!

The Flat Track Racing in the HellRacers Dome was a three-day event, with 16 classes running. Saturday was the biggest day, with 105 racers. For those who were hesitant to attend this indoor venue, we learned from Lisa that "The first day of racing last year we had some trouble with ventilation until we figured out which doors/windows needed to be opened. I was in there a few times this year and there didn't seem to be any noticeable fumes."

Camping has become a big thing during ABW ~ with a 'Best Campsite Contest' being sponsored by <u>Law Tigers</u>. Other activities included factory demo rides, TEAM AZ Safe Riding demos, a motorcycle auction, and of course.... The Vendors ©

201 unique vendors were all set up in the upper parking lot, offering a wide array of items & services.

There was a lot of the to-be-expected stuff ~ leather goods, apparel, head & eye covers, jewelry, helmets, lawyers, insurance, tattoo, pinstriping, & such. Plus some higher-end items like sound systems & custom leather apparel. Among the more unique offerings were virtual reality headsets and the gals were enjoying demos of at-home fingernail fashion designs.

Here are some details about some of the AZ Bike Week rides that visitors have come to expect and enjoy...

The *T-Bar Trail Ride* took place on Thursday April 6. This ride benefits breast cancer charities. After signing in at WestWorld Scottsdale the route took riders on a tour of select gentlemen's clubs around the Valley before returning to WestWorld to enjoy all that AZ Bike Week has to offer, including the CCR concert. 547 participated in this year's ride, generating a \$12,471 donation to the Bikers for Boobies organization.

Friday's *Dry Heat Run*, hosted by the Hamsters custom motorcycle group, starts at Paul Yaffe's Bagger Nation in Phoenix. Proceeds of this event benefit Lifescape Children's Care Hospital. This is the primary charity of the Hamsters organization. A scenic ride, including lunch at the Roadrunner in New River, ended at WestWorld where Korn was the night's





headline concert. The Hamsters Charity Group reported that \$21,000 was raised by this event.

Friday was also the day for the *Saddle Up For Kids Ride*, which you'll read about on another page.

The *Hand in Hand Ride* to benefit Phoenix Children's Hospital took place on Saturday April 8th. 724 riders gathered at PCH on Thomas Rd in Phoenix. Breakfast onsite is part of the entry fee. Plus riders have the opportunity to interact with some of the young patients they are riding for before rolling out toward WestWorld. The night's entertainment includes the Co-op Concert with Alice Cooper in the RockYard. \$20,000 to Phoenix Children's Hospital was raised from this Hand In Hand Ride.

Arizona Bike Week made about \$35k in donations to the various charity rides in tickets and other contributions. In addition to the above events and others you'll read about in these pages, AZ Bike Week Charities {http://abwcg.org} participates in & receives donations from activities during ABW such as the silent and live auctions that took place. Arizona Bike Week makes donations to the organization's fund for use in the community services projects they work on throughout the year. This year they received over \$17k from the event.

Lisa shared that overall attendance was around

90k. While this is a drop of about 5%, Lisa noted that such a change is not unexpected following an anniversary year. Based on zip codes derived from ticket sales, about 59% were from out of state ~ including quite a few from various countries in Europe. Cool. Lisa clarified, "While we of course sincerely appreciate all those who travel great distances to attend our event, we still consider our local biker community to be the heart and soul of Arizona Bike Week. They are the building blocks from which this rally was built." In addition to AZ, we observed plates from CA, CO, IN, MO, NM, NV, OR, TX, WA, & WI.

Lisa and the AZ Bike Week team send along thanks to, "As always all of our sponsors, vendors, suppliers and most of all, our loyal attendees are what make this event possible. We continue to use the event growth to provide a bigger and better rally each year, with more attractions and elements. This year I'd like to also thank our social media followers who so faithfully share our posts. This provides tremendous assistance to us in getting the word out." Lisa continued, "FX Promotions is a small but mighty team that works year around to produce the biggest motorcycle party of the year. Our business model is unique in that we offer an all-inclusive ticket price.

We don't have different levels of passes where you pay more for concerts or VIP areas. We believe that everyone who attends should get to see everything and in doing so are able to keep prices lower overall.
