

The summer heat on the Valley floor presents serious issues for riders to address. The signs of heat exhaustion and dehydration can come on quickly. If you choose to ride during these months, we recommend getting some type of cooling gear; neck wraps, caps, & vests. Obviously we hope you'll start by checking in with our Advertisers to purchase these. Ride early, stay hydrated, trade your black tee for long-sleeved white. Keep your clothes ON. Avoid the temptation to ride in shorts and sandals. It's a foolish choice any time of year, but at 110+° temps you definitely do not want to go down and be on the pavement with nothing between you and the asphalt. Get off the road at first signs of headache or lightheadedness. By reviewing your hot weather protocols, it can be a safe and enjoyable summer of riding.



Arizona Bike Week's 23rd annual biker party was held April 3-7, 2019 at WestWorld in Scottsdale, AZ. With music {local & national}, rides, vendors, stunt riders, racing, beautiful bikes, sexy women, & more; most everyone will find something that appeals. Concerts in the Rock Yard were a huge draw.

There were about 75 thousand people through the gate, according to Lisa Cyr, Media Coordinator for the <u>AZ Bike Week</u> team. A bit more than 50% are out-of-town visitors. While there isn't a 'Furthest Traveled' stat, she did shared that, "We do have a growing contingent of European attendees each year."

Touring the Vendor Village & then the indoor arena showed all sorts of motorcycling-related goods & services... plus some that were an interesting addition. We hope they all did well. Having the HandleBar Saloon inside the exhibition hall allowed for listening to music while browsing and taking a break from the sun. The trio of Bike Shows held most everyone's attention on Saturday afternoon, ours included. There is always an amazing collection of iron art to view.

The camping area continues to grow. Lisa noted that there were 539 RV campsites and 74 tent campsites this year; home to a couple thousand revelers. There's always room for more O

Lisa sent along a note for us to share, "It was a great year! The weather gods were smiling on us. The attendees, as always, came out to have fun and there were no significant incidents. The concerts were amazing! Godsmack, without a doubt, will go down in the history books as one of ABW's best concerts. I'm sure everyone would like to see them back soon.



The Tattoo Contest offered some beautiful pieces to view. It would have been difficult to be a judge. Friday night's band was Broken Toys, giving partiers another good show. After wrapping at the arena we took a stroll. There was much camaraderie around the campfires. Yes \sim *campfires*. Fire restrictions had been lifted thanks to recent rain. Dust was down and the chilly nights could be offset by a warm fire. Nice. Saturday's People's Choice Bike Show brought out 47 contestants in 8 classes. It was a treat to walk the rows & check them out. Summary: Honda (American Honda Motor Co.) is recalling certain 2019 CB300R, 2018 CBR300R, 2018 CRF250L, 2018 CRF250L Rally, and 2018-2019 CMX300 motorcycles. The circlip, on the transmission's main shaft, may detach allowing for gear misalignment. A misaligned gear can shift the transmission from neutral into gear during engine start, potentially resulting in unexpected motorcycle movement or seize the transmission and rear wheel while the motorcycle is in motion. Both conditions increase the risk of crash or injury.






