

NCOM CONVENTION ROCKS NASHVILLE

Hundreds of bikers' rights activists from across America rumbled into 'Music City USA' to rock the country capital with the sounds of motorcycles and two-wheel politics, as the National Coalition of Motorcyclists hosted their 37th annual NCOM Convention, June 17-19 in Nashville, Tennessee!

Rising to the call for action on numerous topics of concern to all riders, concerned advocates from the ranks of Motorcycle Rights Organizations (MROs), clubs (Confederations of Clubs) and independent riders gathered to learn and share for the betterment of biking.

Agenda items dealt with legal and legislative issues, with special emphasis on telematics and the electrification of the vehicle fleet, protecting your digital data, and your personal Privacy.

Special Meetings were conducted for Women in Motorcycling, a Clean & Sober Roundtable, an AIM Attorney Conference, as well as the Christian Unity Conference and Confederation of Clubs Patch Holders Meeting.

NCOM board member Ed Schetter, a veteran of the auto industry and Executive Director of ABATE of Ohio, presented a "We Just Want Our Place on the Road and Safe Fuel" seminar detailing the impending advance of driverless cars and imminent demise (?) of internal combustion engines (ICE), relating the impact on the motorcycling community and our lifestyle.

Medical trainer EMT Dick "Slider" Gilmore expanded his First Responder and Golden Hour repertoire to include a new "Save A Biker's Life" presentation focusing not only on the health implications of diabetes in general, but also on special considerations specifically for riders, and was well attended and informative as always.

Slider's blood- and Sons of Silence M/C club-brother "Chopper" Gilmore was later honored during the Silver Spoke Awards Banquet with the Christian Unity award for his ministerial work. Other Silver Spoke Award recipients were: singer/songwriter David Allen Coe for Entertainment; Tommy Simpson of the Outlaws M/C and CMT/ ABATE of Tennessee receiving the Freedom Fighter award; and NCOM's highest honor, the Ron Roloff Lifetime Achievement Award was presented to Florida AIM Attorney Jerry "T" Theophilopoulos largely for his legal work with the clubs, COCs and ABATE of Florida.

Following the feast and festivities, and a lively auction to benefit the 'Freedom Fund,' NCOM Board Chairman James "Doc" Reichenbach, President of ABATE of Florida, adjourned the 2022 NCOM Convention with the announcement that next year's Convention is scheduled for Father's Day weekend, June 16-18, 2023 in Phoenix, Arizona, so check back at www.ON-A-BIKE.com for further details as they are announced.

FUEL TRANSPARENCY

Responding to a Biden Administration announcement that the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) would temporarily lift summer restrictions on the sale of E15 gasoline to the public, fuel containing 15% ethanol, U.S. Representatives Austin Scott (R-GA) and Rep. Lois Frankel (D-FL) introduced the Consumer Protection and Fuel Transparency Act of 2022 (H.R. 7731).

Many consumers, specifically owners of

motorcycles, ATVs and other small engine machines, are not aware that higher blends of ethanol can damage their engines and even void manufacturer's warranties, so H.R. 7731 would require more detailed labeling of gas pumps to warn about the harmful impacts of misfueling.

Concerned riders are urged to contact their Congressional Representative by calling the U.S. Capital Switchboard at (202) 224-3121 and ask for their support and to cosponsor H.R. 7731.

TENNESSEE WAIVES REGISTRATION FEES FOR ONE YEAR

If you own a motorcycle in Tennessee, or personal automobile, you should be aware of a new moratorium on state vehicle registration fees that the governor has signed into law. It affects motor vehicle renewals that are currently scheduled to take place between July 1, 2022, and June 30, 2023, so for an entire year Tennesseans have a moratorium on motorcycle and personal motor vehicle registration fees to the state (not any others).

It's part of Senate Bill 2491, which Governor Bill Lee officially signed into law on June 3,2022, and the whole thing is a larger budget appropriations bill, but it includes what could be a helpful provision for a lot of road users tucked inside it, by putting some money back into the pockets of most vehicle owners.


The waived fees will be for Class-A vehicles, which include motorcycles, and Class-B vehicles, which include passenger motor vehicles and motor homes, but not for commercial vehicles or electrics.

IOWA ATV RIDERS NOW HAVE GREATER ACCESS TO STATE ROADS

roads, and as of July 1, 2022, ATV and UTV riders in Iowa now enjoy greater use and access for their rides throughout the Hawkeye State.

The new law was the result of a 2020 survey completed by ATV and UTV owners, asking them which Iowa laws restricting off-road riding that they wanted to see changed. Riders wanted to be able to ride on more county and state roadways in order to connect trailheads, and they wanted the opportunity to ride in all 99 Iowa counties.

These changes don't give off-roaders unfettered use of the roadways, however, as vehicles are limited to 35 mph, must behave like other traffic, have operational headlights, taillights and brake lights, a horn, and rearview mirrors, and operators must be 18 or older and possess a valid license and insurance.

Riders also must take the most direct route to and from ATV parks and their home, with limited access to state twolane and county highways day or night, but are still not allowed on state fourlane or interstate highways.

NEW YORK GETS TOUGH ON NON-LEGAL ROAD BIKES

New York City officials bulldozed nearly a thousand non road-legal motorcycles, dirt bikes and ATVs confiscated by the NYPD, as the city and police force sought to remind citizens of the importance of abiding by the law.

Over 900 bikes and ATVs were crushed and flattened during a public bulldozing demonstration, making the statement that the seizure of unlawfully operated bikes on the street is "part of a public safety push by new NYC Mayor Eric Adams... "noting that [illegal motorcycles, dirt bikes and ATVs] are not only a nuisance and an annoyance to us, but they are extremely dangerous..."

The push to take action follows un-

deniable statistics; apparently over 2000 vehicles have been seized in 2022, making up a nearly 80% increase in seizures compared to the number of bikes taken by the law in 2021.

"We see them all the time, we hear them all the time at night. We see the large numbers that are moving throughout our streets, and we want to be clear that this is not acceptable," admonishes Mayor Adams, explaining that the reason for choosing destruction over sourcing or selling the machines "...because it keeps them off the street permanently."

NO MORE LICENSES REQUIRED FOR THREE-WHEELERS IN UTAH

The transportation and technology communities have been talking about autocycles for a few years now, with several states attempting to classify the strange new three-wheel vehicles that are not quite car but not a motorcycle, creating difficulties for riders and confusion at license bureaus.

Following much lobbying by autocycle manufacturers such as Polaris, many states no longer require operators to acquire a motorcycle endorsement on their license, such as in Utah, but like others their state defined an autocycle as having "a steering wheel."

That's about to change with House Bill 391, which Governor Spencer Cox signed into law, tweaking the definition of an autocycle just enough that Utahns won't need a motorcycle license at all to drive an "autocycle," steering wheel or not.

Christoffer-Rep. (Kay) son (R-Lehi), co-sponsor of HB391, explained that all the

bill does is adjust the state's definition of an autocycle from having "a steering wheel" to a "steering mechanism" and tacks on a provision regarding seat belts. So, the state's new definition says an autocycle is a vehicle "designed to travel with three or fewer wheels in contact with the ground; and is equipped with a steering mechanism, seat belts and seating that does not require the operator to straddle or sit astride the motor."

But that small amendment to the law is all that was needed to make some autocycles (with handlebars) more accessible to Utah riders without a special permit. Proponents also point out that because of autonomous vehicles, steering wheels are becoming obsolete, so passing HB 391 puts Utah ahead of the curve.

INTERNATIONAL MOTORCYCLE SHOWS (IMS) CIRCUIT CANCELLED

The COVID-19 health crisis has taken a toll on motorcycle manufacturers and dealerships, as well as riders themselves, but with all of the social distancing, masking, and vaccine mandates that events like the International Motorcycle Shows (IMS) has had to continually adapt to over the past two years, the 2022 IMS Outdoors powersports show tour has been canceled.

The original 2022 schedule was set to kick off in Colorado in June, with stops in Chicago, New York, Atlanta, Southern California, and elsewhere, but IMS officials cited in a press release the way "brands promote their products amidst the continued manufacturing and sourcing delays associated with the pandemic" as the main driver of the cancellation.


According to IMS, that shifting landscape doesn't allow the organizers to deliver an experience that meets its expectations.

For more than 10 years, Arizona Motorcycle Safety & Awareness Foundation (AMSAF) has played a leading role in the effort to reduce the number of crashes and fatalities as a result of distracted driving and a lack of motorcycle training.

AMSAF works with numerous business partners and sponsors including local businesses, healthcare entities, the State of Arizona, police departments, legal and other entities, and individuals, to help decrease the number of distracted and DUI-impaired drivers and to provide scholarships, statewide, to train motorcyclists how to ride more defensively.

"We could not complete our programs without the Governor's Office of Highway Safety grants," says Mick Degn, AMSAF executive director.

AMSAF steadily built its reputation after creating the first discounted training for motorcycle riders statewide.

" Too many riders have no formal training, which is dangerous in terms of defensive riding," says Degn. "This program gives them the tools they need and provides riders with their needed endorsement."

AMSAF next developed, and continues to promote, a Helmet Assistance Program that helps individuals garner a high-quality DOT full face or modular helmet for major savings. The program is growing in popularity and support, with 1,000-plus people already enjoying critical helmet safety. A myriad of motorcycle businesses and suppliers embrace the program.

The non-profit next became a spokesperson and committed supporter of Share the Road, a statewide Arizona effort to build an even stronger awareness about the need for Arizonans to share the road and not be distracted while driving. Share the Road is a statewide public awareness effort aimed at focusing Arizona motorists and riders on the critical need to be undistracted when driving.

Most recently, AMSAF began partnering with Accident Scene Management to help reduce crashes and fatalities at the scene of motor vehicle crashes. Accident Scene Management (ASM), DBA Road Guardians, is a non-profit organization

established in 1996. The mission of the organization is to reduce injuries and fatalities to motorcyclists through first response education. ASM is the world's largest and most recognized motorcycle trauma training organization. Its specialists teach academic classes to motorcyclists introducing a logical approach to minimizing injuries. Critical skills such as moving the injured, helmet removal, jaw thrust rescue breathing, and tourniquet, and all are demonstrated and practiced.

"Since the beginning, AMSAF has believed in education," says Degn. "Education, safety, and awareness are part of our expanding mission to help the community."

AMSAF's mission is to promote motorcycle safety and awareness and help reduce crashes and fatalities in Arizona.

Lane Filtering in Arizona is Coming Soon

BUT it ISN'T here YET! If you Lane Filter at this time, you CAN get a ticket! ABATE-AZ will announce when Lane Filtering becomes legal! Follow ABATE-AZ on facebook and read the ABATE-AZ MasterLink newsletter for all your State Motorcyclists Rights Organization {SMRO} news.

For now, we're gonna review what ABATE-AZ's Legislative Director Mike Infanzon has been explaining about Lane Filtering in Arizona...

> May 2022 Legislative Update ABATE-AZ *MasterLink*:

Expect to see motorcycles lane filtering soon, it will be legal under certain circumstances.

Lane Filtering is NOT the same as Lane Splitting. Legal for roads with 45 mph or less speed limit; NOT LEGAL on ANY Freeways.

ARIZONA – As the weather continues to get warmer, Arizonans can expect to see more motorcycles on the road — and more motorcycles means lane filtering will be legal soon.

ABATE of Arizona wants to remind drivers they can expect to see motorcycles lane filtering this fall, as well as remind motorcyclists of the conditions under which lane filtering is legal.

What is Lane filtering?

Lane filtering is when motorcyclists move between two lanes to the front of traffic that is stopped at an intersection.

Motorcycle lane filtering was made legal under certain circumstances in Arizona but it doesn't go into effect just yet.

Officials say the law for lane filtering was designed to prevent or reduce rear-end collisions between approaching vehicles and motorcycles stopped in traffic.

They added, unlike lane "splitting," lane "filtering" is intended to provide a "safety pocket" for motorcycles when encountering stopped traffic.

Since we have so many snowbirds in Arizona, some drivers may be surprised when they see motorcyclists who are lane filtering.

Officials emphasized that lane filtering between stopped vehicles on roadways with at least two lanes in the same direction and speeds of 45 mph and lower is legal in Arizona.



Having a motorcycle pass closely to your stopped vehicle can be startling. However, officials say if you're aware that lane filtering is legal and know to expect it, you can maintain an awareness of your surroundings and reduce the element of surprise.

When the law goes into effect, motorcycles will be able to lane filter in Arizona when the following conditions are met, according to officials:

The movement MUST be made safely;

The individual is on a roadway divided into two or more adjacent traffic lanes in the same direction of travel;

The individual is on a roadway with a speed limit of 45 miles per hour or less; this means it is never legal on the freeways; The vehicle being overtaken in the same lane is stopped;

The motorcycle is traveling at a speed of 15 miles per hour or less.

There is information available on what Lane Filtering IS and what is ISN'T. These are important distinctions that EVERY motorcycle pilot needs to know... To be SAFE and to avoid a ticket.

ALSO ... This information NEEDS to be shared with your NON-riding friends & family members who will be in their cars & trucks... to help reduce the surprise that some cagers may experience when they see a motorcycle rolling past them in stopped traffic.

Lane Filtering in Arizona

Arizona's new lane filtering law (SB1273) allows a motorcycle to travel between lanes of traffic in very specific instances:

Here are some things you, as a motorcyclist, need to know:

NO FREEWAYS

This is not the California "lane splitting" law! The Arizona law only allows lane filtering on surface streets with a speed limit of 45 MPH or slower.

NOT EVERY STREET

Only on streets that have 2 or more lanes in the same direction.

NOT MOVING

You may not pass a vehicle in motion. You may only overtake a vehicle between lanes that is stopped.

NO SPEEDING

The maximum speed for a motorcycle traveling between lanes

And (you'll want to do this anyway) you must recognize that you can move between lanes safely before beginning lane filtering.

Here's a couple more things you should know:

This law is for 2-wheeled motorcycles. Sorry Trike, Spyder, Slingshot and Ural sidecar riders.

Make sure you tell all your non-motorcyclist friends and neighbors about the law and what to expect. It will help keep them and every motorcyclist safe.

THIS LAW DOES NOT GO INTO EFFECT UNTIL 90 DAYS AFTER THE CURRENT LEGISLATIVE SESSION ENDS.

The current session is scheduled to end on May 13. But very often sessions are extended. That earliest the law will become effective is August 13 of this year.

NOTE: It will **NOT** be legal yet in August!

Safety Tip from Old Koots On Scoots - Unsecure Loads

Following Behind Work Trucks - Weekend Warriors - Vehicles With Unsecure Loads

For the most part, we try never to follow behind any vehicle pulling a trailer (landscapers – people moving furniture) or what we call 'weekend warriors' (people loaded up to go camping / boating).


