

## From Military To Civilian – A Seamless Transition

When members of the Armed Forces of the United States finish at least one year of their tour of deployment they need to enroll in the Veterans Administration (VA) program to obtain any VA Health Benefits they may be entitled to receive. Enroll PROMPTLY by following these steps:

Obtain a copy of your service medical records prior to discharge.

A veteran has 2 years, after separation, to apply for service-related medical conditions After two years the process becomes more difficult.

If you require medical assistance from the VA after separation/discharge, bring with you a copy of your medical records, a copy of your DD-214, and two forms of picture identification.

Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in your medical records.

Enroll in the VA IMMEDIATELY. Do Not Procrastinate!!



Summary: Suzuki Motor USA, LLC (Suzuki) is recalling certain 2023-2024 DL800DE motorcycles. The rear tire may crack or deform, resulting in tire tread separation. Tread separation may cause a loss of vehicle control, increasing the risk of a crash.

Potential Number of Units Affected 1,688

Remedy: Owners are advised not to ride their motorcycles until the remedy has been completed. The remedy is currently under development. A letter informing owners of the safety risk was mailed July 29, 2024. Owner notification letters are expected to be mailed July 26, 2024. Please refer to the recall report for a complete list of model names. The rear suspension pushrod may buckle under load. A rear suspension pushrod that buckles may pinch the main chassis harness, damage the coolant reservoir, damage the rear tire, or cause the motorcycle to bottom out under load. Any of these scenarios can increase the risk of a crash or injury. Potential Number of Units Affected 1,773


