






Rick worked with Myron to establish Behrendsen's Custom Cycles. The two of them "had a blast and went places that lots of people only dream about. Rick was a

very creative person. He's also the guy that found me my first chopper, which started my life in motorcycles. Rick was and will truly be missed. I love you man. Have a sidecar ready for me."

He was 'the counter guy' at Chandler Custom Cycles, and right-hand-man to owner Harold Fischer since the day he purchased Behrendsen's Custom Cycles. Harold shared, "After spending 21 years working together, there is not a day that goes by that I don't think of him. He was like a brother to me."


Most recently, Rick was an integral part of the transition when Harold sold Chandler Custom Cycles to Hugo Robles ... helping to create the KickAZ Cycles that we know today. Hugo wrote, "Rick was very enthusiastic about the direction we are heading as KickAZ Cycles. On behalf of the KickAZ Cycles team we

share his enthusiasm and promise to carry on his legacy."

Potential Number of Units Affected: 5,938 Components: SERVICE BRAKES, HYDRAULIC Summary: BMW of North America, LLC (BMW) is recalling certain 2019 C 400 X, 2018-2020 G 310 GS, and 2017-2020 G 310 R scooters and motorcycles. The front and rear brake caliper pistons may corrode, possibly causing the piston to stick or drag in the caliper bore. A sticking or dragging brake could affect braking performance, increasing the risk of a crash.

Remedy: BMW will notify owners, and dealers will replace the front and rear brake calipers, free of charge. The recall is expected to begin October 4, 2019. Owners may contact BMW customer service at 1-800-525-7417.







## Recounting the Worst Motorcycle Wreck in AZ History



First in a series of installments

by survivor Ernie Lizarraga

My name is Ernie Lizarraga and this is the story of the worst motorcycle accident in Arizona history and me being able to ride again.

This is the first part of my story...... It was Thursday March 25, 2010. I had taken a vacation day from work as a Phoenix Firefighter because the previous day I had worked as a safety officer for mountain rescue training that had been going on at Lookout Mountain. After hiking up and down the mountain I thought I deserved a good relaxing motorcycle ride. At about 11a, I was riding north on the I-17 going to meet friends for lunch at the Roadrunner Restaurant in New River, a town north of Phoenix. They had all met at a QT gas station on the corner of Union Hills Rd. and Cave Creek Rd. at 10

with KSU at 10:30. I wasn't going to make it in time so I told Dayle who was leading the ride I would go directly to the Roadrunner and meet them there. Afterwards we were going to do some riding.

At Exit 232 for New River, I stopped at New River Road, turned east then north for 400 yards to the Roadrunner. Going thru the restaurant parking lot I rode through the gate in the wood fence surrounding the back of the restaurant; where there is bike parking and outside dining. I saw I was the first one to show up. I parked on the north end, shut her off, walked to the dining area, chose a long wood table to sit at, and ordered up a drink.

I probably wasn't seated for more than 10 minutes when I heard and saw about 10 bikes come riding through the gate, kicking up a little dust as they came through. My friend Dayle was leading with

friends Julie, Todd, Margie, Janet, Steve, and unfamiliar bikes behind them. Once they walked over we gave some hugs and I was introduced to Jason, Terry, Will, Dan, Steve, and Clyde.

After everyone was seated I learned Clyde was a Viet Nam Vet with two tours under his belt and was a commander for a Naval Special Warfare Unit. Dan was currently in the Army National Guard. Me being a veteran from Special Forces and having some time in the Arizona Active Reserves, we had a lot to talk about. Steve invited us to his house the following Sunday for some of his much talked about Louisiana BBQ.

We discussed riding to Bartlett Lake after lunch; about 40 miles east, by taking New River Road. It goes along the restaurant in an east-west direction. We decided to go west. It's the longer route, more scenic and no stops the first 9 miles; and there's generally less traffic. We weren't in any hurry. At 75 degrees and no wind it was perfect for riding and that's just what we were going to do.

After chow, about 12:30, we all mounted up, rode out thru the wood gate and got onto New River Road. Dayle was leading on her red Vulcan 800 Classic with custom paint of a Dreamweaver on the gas tank and personalized plates that said "SMYLN". Next to her was Todd on his Victory. Behind them were Julie on her Harley Sportster 1200 Custom, Jason on his Triumph Bonneville, me on my Kawasaki Drifter, Terry on his Ducati, Steve on his Road King, Clyde on his Harley Softail that had a small American flag tie-strapped to the sissy bar, Dan on a VTX 1800 Honda, Margie on her 750 Honda, and Janet on a Harley Low Rider. Riding sweep was Bill on his '88 Harley.

After going under the I-17 overpass we rode 9 miles before we came to our first stop of the ride at the Carefree Highway. We made a left turn then 6 miles to a stop light at the I-17 overpass. Here, Janet and Margie got on the I-17 and rode south into town. They both had to work that afternoon. They didn't realize it but they were probably the two luckiest people on earth that day. A dump truck pulled up and stopped to our right side. In a little over a minute that dump truck was going to make a big impact on our lives, for the ones lucky enough to survive the impact.

Friends of the Kids is a grass-roots group of big-hearted bikers that found a cause they could dedicate themselves to and make a real difference. The focus of their attention isn't big, splashy, or mainstream. It's a humble home with a righteous mission. Friends of the Kids supports the White Mountain Apache Tribe Children's Shelter in Whiteriver, AZ. The Shelter is run by the Apache Behavioral Health Services.

My thanks to Gloria & Mike Kyzer for sharing their story with us & our readers.

Back in 2008 there was a group of riders who became aware of the needs of the Shelter. Donations began primarily with school supplies. Since then, these Friends of the Kids {FOTK} steadily became more organized, including becoming an IRS 501(c)(3) and incorporating as an AZ not-forprofit. Their most-recent accomplishment is becoming certified as an Arizona QCO (Qualified Charitable Organization) per the AZ Dept of Revenue. That means if you make a cash donation to FOTK, you can claim a tax credit on your AZ Personal Income Tax return. Cool!

All the fundraising they do through the year goes toward their annual Friends of the Kids Ride. They load up school supplies, household necessities, groceries, baby needs, & more. This time it was some \$2500 worth. Riders roll in to Payson from East Mesa, Mayer {GCHD}, and Flagstaff; meeting for breakfast before making the final trek together to Whiteriver. This year's delivery took place on Friday June 21st. About 35 riders and passengers plus a few folks in cages escorted the truck & trailer.

Each year, in addition to the types of donations listed above, the FOTK team undertakes special projects on behalf of the Shelter... Over the years they have supplied a new washer & dryer for the home, new beds & mattresses, painted the house, brought in a landscaper for major yard cleanup, repaired the roof, & the list continues. Their efforts are very inspiring.

Congratulations go to FOTK on completing their goal of building a playground! We learned that, "Over the past 2 years we raised about \$15k and then got matching funds and donated labor to build an ~\$30k playground at the Shelter this year. The {June 21} event at the shelter included a dedication of that playground. They have a swing-set, slide, half moon climber, and merry-go-round, all on an Engineered Wood Fiber (EWF) safety bedding." From their FB page, "Thanks to the generous support of people like you, Apache Behavioral Health Services, Grand Canyon HOG, the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community, HOGZ United Charities, and many others, the kids now have a place to play in their back yard all year long."

In June, there were 16 kids staying at the Shelter. That's its maximum capacity. The Shelter stays at or nearly full most of the year. The kids at the shelter range in age from infant thru 12 years. Apache Behavioral Health Services also coordinates care for minors above 13 years.

After delivering their donations, the group continued on to Hon-Dah Casino in Pinetop-Lakeside for the annual White Mountain Bike Rally. Once they got there, in addition to having all kinds of fun, their 2020 fundraising efforts immediately got under way. Friends Of The Kids raised almost \$1,100 to kick off next year's campaign! Outstanding!

Supporters of FOTK include Superstition Harley-Davidson, Grand Canyon HOG, and HOGZ United Charities. Plus, individuals from all walks of life step up with donations large & small.


Cash is used to fulfill needs on the Shelter's 'Wish List'. Creative items such as quilts and other artwork have been raffled; as have HD-branded goods... including a bicycle and a leather jacket. 

The American Dream Act Arizona eliminates all property taxes on the Arizona primary residence of US citizens over the age of 65. "Our volunteers are having a good time collecting signatures", according to Lynne Weaver, Chairman of the initiative. "Voters are happy for the opportunity to sign the petition and they heartily support the initiative. Volunteers get a lot of positive reaction and its very rewarding. They also hear about people's experiences trying to keep up with their ever increasing property taxes and how this initiative will help them. It's important we succeed and support Arizona seniors. It's the right thing to do."

Property taxes have no relationship to ability to pay and are especially difficult for seniors on fixed income.

Any Arizona registered voter can sign the petition, not just those over 65. There are several ways to help the initiative succeed.

You can volunteer to circulate petitions. Some collect signatures from friends and family. Others go to their local library to get signatures or take petitions to their meetings and social events.

You can donate to the initiative at https://www.americandreamactaz.com/donate/. This is an all-volunteer team working on donations from individuals. There is no paid staff and donations are needed to pay for printing, postage, promotions and other operating expenses.

You can tell others about the initiative. The more word spreads about the American Dream Act Arizona, the more volunteers come forward and the team keeps growing. The signature collection deadline is July 2020 to qualify for the November 2020 General Election ballot.

Chapters are in Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Maine.

Fundraisers around the country have been taking place, to assist with burial & medical expenses, as well as the financial stresses that such a loss of a loved one can have on a family.

On July 13, the New Hampshire Fallen 7 Poker Run took place; riding out of & returning to Desert Wind Harley-Davidson in Mesa. It was presented by the dealership's East Valley HOG Chapter. Riders started gathering at 7am. Lou with Hard Drive donated 30 cooling neck scarves to the first 30 registered. The first of the riders pulling out at about 8am; after opening ceremonies, including a Color Guard. The goal was to have all riders back in before noon & the worst of the heat.

Thank you to Jennifer Sievers for your help with this article. She explained, "So I was approached by multiple riders throughout the community to see if there could be something done for the Fallen 7 Jarhead Marine Riders in NH. So I got with DWHD and East Valley HOG. We decided to put together a Poker Run in 2 weeks for the Fallen 7. DWHD sponsored the event and EVHOG put the event together.

"We quickly reached out to the American Legion Post 27 in Apache Junction and they without hesitation stepped up to the plate and offered their Post as the first stop of our poker run. They offered a breakfast for the riders and all the proceeds would also go to the Fallen 7. Then we asked the Marine Corp Recruitment Station at Power and Southern in Mesa if we could stop there on our run and they agreed. The third leg of our stops was at <u>DT Mesa</u> Fest Artists Emporium, on MacDonald in Downtown Mesa. They are a non-profit organization and they jumped in to help.

'We were able to get an awesome flag line with a line of 20 flags for the riders to ride thru as they left the dealer, provided by the <u>Patriot Guard Riders</u>. We had Emily Wishman sing a beautiful version of the National Anthem.

"We were able to raise just under \$4500 to donate to the family members of the Fallen in NH. We had about 175 riders & passengers on the ride in 114

degree heat. We were so happy so many showed up on this hot day to give back to our fellow Brothers and Sisters on the road. We even had YUMA HOG ride up from YUMA to attend this poker run and give back. That says a lot."

Once the riders returned to DWHD from their 40-mile excursion, there was a bike wash tent, with all donations going toward the cause. Most everyone gravitated indoors to the cool where Desert Wind HD was hosting a lunch that people could enjoy while waiting to hear who the ride winners were.

Erica aka Siren of American Patriots RC, holding a straight to 8, won the High hand \$300 DWHD gift card. Donna 'Niner' Horn had the Low hand & collected a \$150 DWHD gift card.

Drawings for raffle prizes were pulled from the players cards. Raffle goodies were donated by DWHD, EVHOG, Artists Emporium, & Jerome Director of Yuma HOG.


