Run For The Kids' Poker Run

Old Pueblo Riders (OPR), a not for profit 501c(4) motorcycle association, held a fund raising event for the Arizona State School for the Deaf and the Blind (ASDB) on 23 April 2022. OPR holds two major fundraising events for ASDB, typically a poker run event in the spring and a motorcycle raffle drawing event in the fall. For this year's April event, OPR held the poker run event at Shooter's Saloon and Grill located at 3115 E Prince Road, Tucson.

The "Run For The Kids" poker run included stops at Boondocks, Sun Riders MC clubhouse, Branding Iron, Territorial Inn, with the final stop being back at Shooter's. The event included music by the band South 40 and food by Servi Fiesta Pico, raffle baskets, and 50/50. We had nine vendors on display showcasing all kinds of great items to include spices,

candles, jewelry, knives, food, law services, and custom artwork. The Poker Run had 124 participants and we awarded winnings to both high and low hands.

We raised \$5181 at this event. We combined that money with money we raised at our Oct 2021 motorcycle raffle and were able to present ASBD with a check for \$4000 and an outdoor movie theater system that included a very large portable screen, sound system, DVD player, and 40 camp chairs, at a total cost of \$4652. The school specifically asked if we could donate the outdoor movie theater because their students are taught to live their lives just like anyone else and to not let their hearing or vision be any limitation to their enjoyment of life.

Our next major fundraising event is 22 Oct 2022 and will include drawing the winner of our motorcycle raffle for a 2007 Suzuki Boulevard C50. We will have food, music bands, raffle baskets, 50/50, vendors and lots of good times and

fun. It will be held at Shooter's Saloon. We will be creating the event flyers and posting details soon.

MOTORCYCLIST KILLED BY SELF-DRIVING CAR

"A motorcyclist was killed on I-15 in Draper, Utah when a Tesla crashed into the back of the bike," reported Fox13 News in Salt Lake City on July 24, adding that "the driver of the Tesla said he had the 'auto-pilot' setting on...he told police he didn't see the motorcyclist."

"Wow, and even in a driverless vehicle, the 'I didn't see the motorcyclist' gets a rider killed," commented NCOM Board Member Ed Schetter, who recently presented a "We Just Want Our Place on the Road" seminar at the National Coalition of Motorcyclists' NCOM Con-

vention in Nashville that examined the inevitability of driverless cars, relating the impact on motorcycling.

"Such an incident stresses our need to protect our space on the road, as I pointed out in my presentation," said Schetter, a veteran of the auto industry and Executive Director of ABATE of Ohio. "I wonder who the biker's family gets to sue? The Driver? Tesla? The Software Company? Sometimes you just shake your head."

UN SET TO ALLOW INCREASED SPEED FOR AUTONOMOUS **VEHICLES**

The United Nations (UN) is set to allow for an increase in speed for the operation of self-driving vehicles, as well as new tests focused on how well they can detect motorcycles.

Until now, the speed limit for the autonomous driving of vehicles has been 60kph (@37mph), but that is now set to increase to 130kph (80.7mph) thanks to an amendment to UN Regulation No. 157 adopted by the UNECE's World Forum for Harmonisation of Vehicle Regulations. The amendment also allows for autonomous lane changes, and is set to be implemented from January 2023.

The regulation also states, according to the Federation of European Motorcyclists' Associations (FEMA), that "all tests that need to be conducted for a system like ALKS (Automated Lane Keeping System) or LCP (Lane Change Procedure), have to be carried out with a passenger car target as well as a powered two-wheeler target."

This means that, although the autonomous technology is able to operate at a higher rate of speed, the safety for bikers when approaching an autonomous vehicle should now be improved upon, because their ability to detect motorcycles should (hopefully) be improved.

HONDA DEVELOPING LANE ASSISTANCE SYSTEM FOR THE BIKES OF THE FUTURE

Recent patent filings from Honda for camera- and radar-enabled lane assist for motorcycles across its roster would keep their bikes in-lane via AI.

"Lane assist" is a commonality now in modern cars, but not so common in motorcycles, as electronic aids which detract from the actual riding of the motorcycle for the person holding the handlebars are generally avoided by

the manufacturers, who do not want to lose their core enthusiasts, which is also why autonomous technology has not advanced far in the two-wheeled world, especially compared to the much larger automobile market and tech-hungry car culture.

Honda is developing their lane-keeping assist system (LKAS) with the aim of making accidents a thing of the past, but if they are to reach their goal of slashing car and motorcycle deaths by half in the next eight years and bring the number down to zero by 2050, we can expect to see a massive influx of rider-assistance systems like this in the very near future.

The plan combines driver assistance tech with a predictive AI computer system that can spot situations which lead to driving errors before they happen, and is intended to be introduced in the second half of this decade.

Further ahead, the intention is to introduce "Safe and Sound Network Technology" that allows cars, bikes, roadside furniture and even pedestrians (via their phones) to communicate, allowing a

server to create a virtual model of traffic movement to predict and prevent accidents before they even start to unfold. The system is scheduled to be phased in from the 2030s.

THE UK WANTS TO BAN THE SALE OF NEW FOSSIL FUELED MOTORCYCLES

The government of the United Kingdom has launched an open consultation, called "L-category vehicles: ending sales of new non-zero emission models," in which they announce a sales ban for new non-zero emission motorcycles from 2035: "It is important that motorcycles do not remain fossil fueled as the rest of the transport fleet cleans up," states Trudy Harrison MP, Minister of State for Transport.

'L-category' vehicles include 2- and 3-wheeled mopeds, motorcycles, trikes, sidecar-equipped motorbikes, and quadricycles, and in the consult the government clearly states: "While cars and vans vastly outnumber motorcycles on UK roads, motorcycles are an important and size-

able vehicle population, with 1.3 million currently licensed in 2021. We do not want to see them remaining fossil-fueled as the rest of our vehicles clean up."

The British government has already committed to phasing out new cars and vans that run solely on petrol or diesel by 2030, and all new non-zero emission road vehicles by 2040.


Jim Freeman, Chairman of the British Motorcyclists Federation (BMF) said: "The BMF will oppose any proposals to ban the use of motorcycles powered by internal combustion engines while such vehicles are still capable of being run. We also oppose a ban on the sale of new internal combustion engine-powered motorcycles while there is the possibility of providing alternatives to fossil fuel and while the electric vehicle charging infrastructure does not adequately support electric motorcycles."

JURY ACQUITS TRUCKER CHARGED WITH SEVEN-COUNT MOTORCYCLE HOMICIDE

On the morning of June 21, 2019,

truck-driver Volodymyr Zhukovskyy admitted to driving under the influence of fentanyl, heroin and cocaine before crashing his 2016 Dodge Ram 2500 Tradesman crew-cab pickup into a pack of Marine Corps veterans riding their motorcycles near Randolph, New Hampshire, killing seven members of the Jarheads Motorcycle Club.

Prosecutors argued that Zhukovskyy, who had previous DUI convictions and should have had his license suspended, repeatedly swerved back and forth before the collision and told police he caused it. But the judge dismissed eight charges related to whether he was impaired, based on a contested blood test, and his defense attorneys blamed the lead biker for causing the accident, claim-

ing that "he was drunk and not looking where he was going when he lost control of his motorcycle and slid in front of Zhukovskyy's truck."

Following a 2-week trial, jurors deliberated for less than three hours before finding Zhukovskyy, 26, innocent on seven counts of manslaughter, seven counts of negligent homicide and one count of reckless conduct, setting him free after being held in custody since the accident.

This high-profile case has garnered staggering coverage across the country, and the surprising verdict has been soundly criticized by many, including New Hampshire Governor Chris Sununu (R) who said he shares in the "shock, outrage, and anger that so many have expressed" since the crash. "The Fallen Seven did not receive justice today, and that is an absolute tragedy," Gov. Sununu stated.

New Hampshire Attorney General John Formella said he believes the state proved its case. "Mr. Zhukovskyy should have been found guilty of the charges in this case and held responsible for causing seven deaths and numerous injuries," he said. "We thank the Court and the jurors for their service, and while we are extremely disappointed, we respect the verdict and our system of justice."

PETITION CALLS FOR PROPER PUNISHMENT FOR BIKE THIEVES

A petition has been launched on the Change.org website calling for tougher sentences for bike thieves. The petition was started by British biker, Xander James from Hull, U.K., and has already amassed thousands of signatures -- enough to draw attention of local news.

"As we know, motorcycle & vehicle theft is the highest it's ever been, this is partly due to the minimal sentences from the Crown Prosecution Service," explains James on his petition to the U.K. Parliament and Scotland Yard. "We need change. We can't safely park our vehicles outside our own homes anymore! But with the Crown Pros-

ecution Service handing out cautions & early release they keep doing it."

Along with tougher sentencing, James wants to see Operation Yellowfin receive more support from the Government, a police operational initiative which was launched locally in 2018 to tackle motorcycle crime and anti-social behavior.

STURGIS TRAFFIC DOWN, BUT STILL HIGHER THAN AVERAGE

The good news is; the Department of Transportation counted over half a million vehicles entering Sturgis, South Dakota during the 82nd annual Black Hills Motorcycle Rally week, but the bad news; that's down 4.4% from last year.

The city of Sturgis estimated the 2021 attendance at 555,000. Although down from 2021, the 2022 total vehicle count is still higher than the five-year average of 492,535.

Sturgis City Manager Daniel Ainslie told the Black Hills Pioneer that 2021 was far better than expected because people had been in lockdown during the pandemic and just wanted to get out and travel. "It was a significant Rally last year. It was actually the largest Rally we had other than the 75th for more than a decade," he said. "Given that last year was such a large Rally, it's not unexpected that numbers are down."

Some worried initially that gas prices -- which hovered near \$5 a gallon mid-summer -- might have deterred people from attending this year's Rally, but according to Ainslie; "With a lot of individuals that come here, no matter what, they're going to be coming. But, I think they are being a little more careful with what they are spending."

BONNEVILLE MOTORCYCLE SPEED TRIALS CANCELED DUE TO FLOODING

On August 13, 2022, the Bonneville Motorcycle Speed Trials organizers officially announced that the 2022 event is canceled. This year's speed trials had originally been scheduled to take place from August 28 through September 1, 2022, but due to flooding on the Bonneville Salt Flats, the BMST, FIM Land Speed World Records, and AMA Land Speed Grand Championship is officially canceled for 2022.

Heavy storm systems brought flooding to the salt flats, and when organizers did an aerial assessment of the state of the standard track area on August 12, they found that "the entire length of our tracks and beyond are flooded," and noted that "Although the area is drying, it is unfortunately not drying quickly enough for the event to take place."

GWRRA CALLS IT QUITS

Putting down their kickstand for good, the Gold Wing Road Riders Association (GWRRA) is waving farewell after 45 years of meeting the nicest people, and ceased operations following this year's

Wing Ding 43 in Shreveport, Louisiana at the end of July.

Founded in 1977 with the motto, "Friends for Fun, Safety and Knowledge," the GWRRA called itself, "the world's largest single-marque social organization for owners of Honda Gold Wing/Valkyrie motorcycles" that once boasted nearly 80,000 members across 53 countries, with 800-plus chapters staffed by 4,000 volunteer leaders.

GWRRA Founders Paul Hildebrand and Shirley Stevens-Garcia made good on the '60s era ad slogan "You meet the nicest people on a Honda" by creating a non-profit, non-religious, non-political organization "that advocated for rider education and safety, motorist awareness, and leadership training."

SAVE THE DATE - 2023 NCOM **CONVENTION IN PHOENIX**





When Filtering, Have You Ever Thought About...

A question from Arizona Motorcycle Safety & Awareness Foundation

Motorcycle Safety and Awareness Tips by Merlo Pile, AMSAF Advisory Board Member

By now, you've probably heard the news that motorcyclists may lane-filter through traffic. * Editor... as of September 24th, 2022

When the news was first announced, there were so many people confused as to what exactly lane-filtering means; especially what it is and what it is not. The major difference in lane-filtering between lane-splitting and lane-sharing is that in lane-filtering, the other surrounding vehicle traffic is stopped. Of course, there's much more to it than that... and it's up to you to understand fully the new Arizona statute on lane-filtering.

In doing your research, there are other aspects to consider that are probably not recorded in print (or video) that are shared from past experiences with other riders. So assuming that you do understand what lane-filtering is, have you ever thought about these aspects of lane-filtering?

How's your skill in maneuvering in limited spaces? Many still remember the u-turn box from their MSF Basic Rider Course; some are permanently scarred, mentally, from the fear of making u-turns... just kidding. But for those not afraid of the u-turn box to maneuver in limited spaces, they had one thing in common - they were fairly consistent in their clutch and throttle control. And others even added the coordination of the rear brake. When lane-filtering, you will need the smooth and precise operations (and coordination) of these three primary controls...clutch, throttle, and rear brake. And though you may not need to turn your handlebars, are you prepared to quickly turn them at slow speed while maneuvering through limited spaces? Remember your time and space margin is very small and may need to quickly turn your handlebars when lane-filtering – so something else to consider...

How will the car drivers react as you pass them? We learned at a very early age to wait in line. When we enter a classroom, or the school bus, or pick up our lunch tray, we learned to patiently wait in line for our turn. And even as adults, we wait in lines at the movies, concerts, banks, and let's not forget...waiting in line at the Motor Vehicle Department. We've learned not to cut in line; and that it is wrong and rude to others if we do so. So how do we feel when it is done to us? When someone cuts in line in front of you, how did that make you feel? When traffic is stopped at a red traffic light, these other car drivers are waiting (...patiently or not) their turn to proceed when the light turns green. And then here you are riding to the front of the line as you lane-filter.

Yes, they're supposed to be stopped, BUT will they actually try to stop you from getting to the front of the line by using their cars? Do you trust they're not going to hit you with their cars? Ideally, when they see you approaching (lane-filtering), they will give you more room to pass. And then there's also the possibility of drivers throwing hot coffee or trash, or even spitting out the window as you pass. I'm afraid that those drivers aren't willing to share the road and are ignorant to reason that it's NOT a matter of who gets to go first when the traffic light turns green. And so lastly...

What's your risk-offset? From the MSF Basic Rider Course, your risk offset is the difference between the risk YOU are willing to take and the skills you possess. If you have the skills to lane-filter safely, is the reward/benefit worth the possible consequences of the risk? Remember, the risk avoidance reason to lane-filter (when traffic is stopped) is being rear-ended by the oncoming car behind you. So if you're not going to lane-filter, are you in the proper lane position to quickly get out of the way in case the oncoming car behind you doesn't stop in time?

Lane-filtering is new to all drivers and riders, and as nice as it is to believe that all users of our public roads are willing to SHARE the ROAD...keep in mind that even the newness of the law is just yet another factor to consider in avoiding a motorcycle accident. It is your choice to lane-filter; don't let peer pressures, or running late to your destination, or anything else adversely affect your decision.



At last year's MRF Meeting of the Minds in Atlanta, Georgia the fate of the internal combustion engine was discussed. In fact, at the urging of ABATE of Illinois, the following language was added to the MRF's 2022 Legislative Priorities: "Work to ensure the survival of combustion engines. Including elimination of the California air quality waivers which threaten combustion engine production."

In October of 2021 California Governor Gavin Newson signed a bill into law banning the sale of all off-road, gas-powered engines, including generators, lawn

equipment, pressure washers, chainsaws, weed trimmers, and even golf carts.

And less than one year later we learn this, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) that governs motor vehicle emis-

Are you afraid of the dark?

August 30, 2022

With road fatalities increasing by 10.5% from 2020 to 2021, safety advocates are looking for causes. The Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS) has begun a nighttime test of vehicles that use automatic emergency braking (AEB) systems to address the high percentage of pedestrian crashes that occur on dark roads.

"As we expected, most of these pedestrian AEB systems don't work very well in the dark," says IIHS President David Harkey. You heard that right, out of the 23 brands of mid-sized cars and trucks, only 4 scored the highest rating of "superior" by the IIHS. When the same testing was done in daylight, 19 of the 23 vehicles received the highest score.

While pedestrians are the focus of

this study, motorcyclists are rightly concerned. All too often, motorists assume the technology in their cars is perfect and rely too heavily on it. This study shows that this new technology is far from flaw-less!

Motorcyclists are operating at higher rates of speed, with a different profile, and in closer proximity to other vehicles than pedestrians or other roadway users. If a car, with this new technology, can't see a pedestrian walking across the street at night directly in front of them, can it see a biker in the lane next to them?

This is one of the many topics we will discuss at the MRF's upcoming Meeting of the Minds in Des Moines, Iowa, September 21-25. To learn more about the MRF and the Meeting of the Minds click here.

- Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in your medical records.

The <u>Tour of Honor Ride</u> is one of the American Motorcyclist Association's Grand Tours. The flyer explains it in a nutshell.... 50 States, 500 Memorials, You, Your Motorcycle, and a Good Reason to Ride. The ride window is from April 1 to September 30... so you have 6 months to hit as many memorials, and even as many states, as you want. 1133 riders signed up for this year's Tour of Honor Ride.

There is a competitive aspect to the ride. A trophy is awarded to the first 3 riders who complete a 7 memorial tour within a State. There is also a trophy for the first 3 riders who visit all of the memorials within a Region. {You can see how this ride lends itself to those who wish to rack up **Iron Butt** miles.}

Riders photograph their ToH rally flag, motorcycle, and memorial together & then forward those pix to the rally

judges to receive credit for each stop.

The ride fee for this self-paced tour includes a donation to the charity of your choice to benefit Veteran and First Responder Charities. This year's options are Fisher House Foundation, Gold Star Family Memorial Foundation, and the Gary Sinise Foundation's First Responders Outreach.


This event is a means to pay respect to the people & events being honored at each memorial site; while learning about history, exploring new roads, and challenging oneself as a rider. There is no specified or required ToH route. Riders can select any route they want to reach the designated memorials. As the tour runs from 1 April to 30 September; riders also have the freedom to select the best time, based upon weather & other conditions of the state in which they'll be traveling.

Rick Ferguson, a rider based out of Queen Creek, took up the ToH challenge for the first time this year. "I have always wanted to participate and now can." He rode his HD Road King S.

Rick is one of those riders who will easily do 400 miles before breakfast. His favorite day rolls in at around 600 miles.

Asked what inspired him to participate, he replied, "I like to explore and I love history. This tour allows me to do both. I have the freedom to plot the ride and the timing to allow me to explore our wonderful state and nation while learning about the history associated with each site." Ride Journal Day 1, 8-3-22 ... Arizona Tour of Honor trip. Started in Queen Creek AZ.

First stop was in Marana at the Carillon Memorial in the Arizona Veterans Memorial Cemetery on Luckett Road. From there, rode to the Douglas Veterans Memorial on 16th Street, to Eagar's Veterans Memorial on 2nd St, and then to the St Johns Veterans Memorial on South Street; before parking for the night in Pinetop. 587 miles, 12 hours.

Ride Journal Day 2, 8-4-22 ... morning 6:35am... "It's with mixed emotions that I start today's ride. It's a rare sight in AZ for the state to be covered in rain, however, we are blessed this year with a good monsoon. I should clear the east-

ern half of the state by 10 am. I am off to Kingman by way of Prescott. Another great day in the AZ mountains."

Day 2, evening 7:20pm... "I really didn't think yesterday's route from the Mexican border to Northeast AZ through the White Mountains could be beat. Today rivaled it in every way. Chasing the rain all day provided me with clean, dry roads and cool weather. I started in Pinetop, through Payson, Campe Verde, then Mayer for the first stop, the 'Freedom is Not Free' statue at Henry Cordes Park. Took a fortuitous detour over Mingus Pass on 89A from Payson to Sedona. It is absolutely one of the craziest riding roads in the state! No pics on that section as the road was open and the twisties were calling me. Some pics through Sedona and Oak Creek and then to Kingman for my stop at the Doxol Disaster Memorial on Detroit Avenue. Made an additional stop

in Kingman at the 'Spirit of the American Doughboy' WWI Memorial. Each state's ride has K9 and Doughboy stops that participants can visit, as additions to the main route."

Ride Journal Day 3, 8-5-22 ... Traveled Kingman to Oatman on Rte 66. Rode through Lake Havasu City and Yuma. Final checkpoint of the run was the Long Ranger B-50 Memorial in Dateland {between Yuma & Gila Bend}.

Then HOME.... after 1467 miles in 3 Days.

Rick is currently planning his next Tour of Honor Ride, through New Mexico, as part of this season's run. We look forward to sharing that story in a future edition of AZ Rider.







Legal Lane Filtering Starts September 24 What Riders Need To Know

Lane Filtering is NOT the same as Lane Splitting. It is only Legal for roads with 45 mph **or less** speed limit; It is NEVER LEGAL on ANY Freeways; The pilot MUST be able to make the maneuver safely; The motorcyclist is on a roadway divided into two or more adjacent traffic lanes in the **same** direction of travel;

The vehicle being overtaken in the same lane is stopped; and The motorcycle can only be traveling at a speed of 15 miles per hour **or less**.
