BIKERS AID HURRICANE VICTIMS

Dear NCOM Board; We have spoken with Doc (NCOM Board Chairman "Doc" Reichenbach) and he has given us the go ahead to solicit relief assistance from our affiliates. After helping our friends and neighbors, we are now ready to contact the motorcycle community to assist with a storm that has contributed to the greatest property loss in our nation's history.

We have responded to an effort led by Central Harley-Davidson in Austin, Texas. They are receiving donations and then trucking them to dealerships in the affected areas, principally Houston. We asked if we could get our organization's members to ship to their store and they said yes, but make sure the boxes are marked.

We see a great need with the cleanup efforts, so this is what we are proposing –

Phase 1 - Groups can order cleanup supplies from the box stores - Walmart. com, Target.com or even the Home Depots and Lowes. Package one type of item per box and then labeled (ex. attached hurricane relief - tarps, or hurricane relief the assistance offered from our awesome - surgical masks, etc.).

Phase 2 - We are coordinating with Motorcycle Resource Teams and bike clubs to volunteer at Central H-D and delivery points to load/unload boxes so the motorcycle shops can still conduct their daily business.

Phase 3 - Once delivered we will assist with getting the supplies to the areas in most need. Getting a group to set up at the Golden Triangle H-D shop and delivering supplies to neighborhoods in the affected areas.

Following is a list of needed supplies - extension cords, box fans, work gloves, tarps, box cutters, blades, nylon rope for tarps, bug spray, antibacterial wipes, disposable surgical masks, rubber gloves, shop vacs.

If folks would rather send money donations, a Houston organization that is networked with a multitude of churches and organizations in the state who are doing the relief work and gets the supplies that are needed in a very timely manner is www.somebodycares.org. Please check

continue in that role.

Newly-elected State Rep. St. Clair (D-District 9) says "People know me, and I'm going down there to represent my constituents in my district. As for motorcyclists, I'll be watching out on their behalf whether they're constituents or visitors to the state."

ILLINOIS LAW MANDATES STUDENTS LEARN WHAT TO DO **DURING A TRAFFIC STOP**

In addition to reading, writing and arithmetic, students in Illinois will now learn a possibly life-saving lesson; What to Do during a Traffic Stop.

The new state law, signed by Governor Bruce Rauner, is aimed at preventing a situation from escalating when teens are pulled over by police, and mandates that teachers dedicate instruction time to ensuring that students learn what to do and what not to do during a traffic stop, and how not to panic and do something that may seem like a red flag to cops.

"My hope is that if we uniformly require that driver's education include the protocol and what is expected when you interact with a police officer that things will not escalate," Senator Julie Morrison (D-Deerfield), who sponsored the bill, told the local station ABC 7.

NORTH CAROLINA TO PROVIDE

DRIVER INSTRUCTION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT STOPS

Similar to a measure recently adopted in Louisiana to teach new licensees how to interact with police during traffic stops, House Bill 21 "Driver Instruction/Law Enforcement Stops" has been approved unanimously by the North Carolina legislature and signed into law by Governor Roy Cooper on July 12, 2017.

HB 21 provides that "The Division, in consultation with the State Highway Patrol, the North Carolina Sheriff's Association, and the North Carolina Association of Chiefs of Police, shall include in the driver license handbook a description of law enforcement procedures during traffic stops and the actions that a motorist should take during a traffic stop, including appropriate interactions with law enforcement officers."

ARKANSAS BECOMES 37TH STATE TO REVISE SLINGSHOT **LICENSING**

Polaris Industries reports that Arkansas no longer requires Slingshot owners to have a motorcycle operator's license, thus making the Natural State the 37th state to classify the three-wheeler as a car for licensing purposes.

"When Slingshot was introduced to the market in 2014, most consumers were required to hold a motorcycle endorsement or license to operate it," the company said in a recent press release. "Because Slingshot does not feature handlebars or straddle seating, but rather offers a unique three-wheel configuration with a steering wheel and side-by-side seating, state policymakers have recognized the need to update their operator licensing laws."

Although Slingshot resides in the motorcycle classification which has long provided for three-wheel designs, operator skills are more similar to those required for a passenger car. "Our goal is to gain a unified classification and operator licensing scheme across the country to provide more opportunities and driving freedom for consumers looking for the ultimate thrill experience that Slingshot offers," said Rachael Elia, Slingshot Marketing Manager.

BANNED KNIVES NOW LEGAL IN TEXAS

A bipartisan House bill repealing the Lone Star State's 1871 ban on Bowie knives and other large blades has been signed by Governor Greg Abbott, dropping the carry of illegal knives such as "Bowie knives, daggers, dirks, stilettos, poniards, swords, and spears" from the Texas penal code on weapons, a crime which currently carries fines of up to a year in jail, a fine of up to \$4,000, or

From Military To Civilian – A Seamless Transition

When members of the Armed Forces of the United States finish at least one year of their tour of deployment they need to enroll in the Veterans Administration (VA) program to obtain any VA Health Benefits they may be entitled to receive.

Service members need to enroll PROMPTLY and do it NOW by following these steps:

- Obtain a copy of your service medical records prior to discharge. Do not take any shortcuts when separating and do this immediately. Any idea of hurrying to get home may cost you time and money should you require VA Healthcare at any time in the future.
- A veteran has two years, after separation, to apply for medical conditions that are a result of their service in the military. After two years the process becomes more difficult.
- If you require medical assistance from the VA after separation/discharge, bring with you a copy of your medical records, a copy of your DD-214, and two forms of picture identification.
- Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in your medical records.
- Enroll in the VA IMMEDIATELY. Do Not Procrastinate!! Know your rights and your responsibilities. If you are not sure, ASK-ASK-ASK-ASK-I!! Ensure that your transition is smooth. Know what you need to do, and DO IT!
- Join a veterans service organization American Legion, DAV, Rolling Thunder®, VFW, AMVETS, Marine Corps League, Alliance of Marine Corps Vets, etc.



both.

Still off limits for knives with blades over 5.5 inches will be places such as schools, correctional facilities, houses of worship, and bars that derive more than half their income from alcohol sales. Minors, under 18, will not be able to buy or carry a location-restricted knife.

New Hampshire passed the nation's first repeal of a switchblade (automatic) knife ban in 2010, and since then such knife restrictions have been repealed in Alaska, Colorado, Indiana, Kansas, Maine, Missouri, Nevada, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Texas and Wisconsin.

FACING BACKLASH, **CONFEDERATE MOTORS CHANGES ITS NAME**

When Matt Chambers created his company in 1991 in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, he chose to name it Confederate Motors "in a salute to good Southern principles," but in today's politically charged climate that associates the Southern Confederacy with racism and white supremacy, Chambers has decided to retire the name.

"The Confederate brand was no longer viable. I think we lost a lot a business with that name," Chambers told the Los Angeles Times, adding "We've missed out on branding opportunities. So, it's time to retire it."

The company is now the Curtiss Motorcycle Co., named after the father of American aviation, Glenn Curtiss, who gained fame competing with the Wright Brothers to dominate the skies, but who also famously built and raced motorcycles.

Their first model will be called the Hercules, the name originally used for Curtiss' motorcycles, and will be an electric sportbike.

BRITISH MOTORCYCLISTS RIDE ON PARLIAMENT TO PROTEST BIKE CRIME

Hundreds of concerned motorcyclists rode through London on Saturday, Sept 9th to protest a staggering increase in bike thefts, bike-jackings and brutal attacks on motorcyclists in the U.K.

The protest comes after acid was sprayed at six scooter riders in a 90 minute period in a series of attacks in London in July, with one victim suffering "life-changing injuries" according to police. Due to these vicious assaults, acid attackers now face life in prison, and prosecutors have been advised to impose sentences of up to four years just for carrying acid.

Other riders have had their bikes stolen from them by armed thieves. Recent crime figures have shown that vehicle theft has risen 18.6% nationwide in the

last year and 25.9% in London, which is a trend that has been plain to see for bike owners. The thieves are more brazen than ever, posting pictures of bikes they've stolen on social media.

As the police struggle with motorcycle theft, the army may be called in to address the situation.

Protest organizers '#BikersUnited' say 65 bikes are stolen a day in the capital, while riders increasingly face "violence, knives, acid and even death from the thieves."

Formed of a number of biking groups including MAG (Motorcycle Action Group), #BikersUnited says on its Facebook page: "We represent the 1,000s of riders of motorcycles and scooters in Britain and are protesting about the outrageous escalation of bike theft and bike jackings in our country."

STUDY SHOWS CAR DRIVERS ARE CONFIDENT THEY CAN TEXT AND DRIVE SAFELY

A recent study by Progressive Insurance reveals that about one third of car drivers feel confident in their own ability to text and drive, yet the majority believe distracted driving is the biggest cause of auto accidents and more than 90% say it should be illegal.

The report showed a sharp difference

in attitudes between younger and older drivers, with more than 60% of 18-34 year olds being confident in their ability to safely text while driving, compared to less than 6% of those 55 and older.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), 3,477 people were killed, and 391,000 were injured in motor vehicle crashes involving distracted drivers in the United States in 2015. Teens were the largest age group reported as distracted at the time of fatal crashes.

The study further showed that men think they are better at texting and driving, with twice as many men (21%) as women (11%) saying they are "very confident" in their ability to text while driving. Despite that confidence in their own abilities, some 88% of men and 97% of women think texting should not be allowed.

Among all drivers, more than 65% of individuals polled believe that texting/ looking at one's phone while driving is the most common cause of traffic accidents in the United States. And 83% of individuals believe police should be able to pull over drivers for texting alone. Yet at the same time, 34% of respondents said they were somewhat or very confident in their ability to text while driving.

Meanwhile, the study said the most common feelings evoked when seeing another driver texting is concern (62%) followed by irritation (50%), and these feelings didn't vary by age or gender.

MOTORCYCLE INDUSTRY WELCOMES BAN ON GAS **POWERED VEHICLES**

The Motorcycle Industry Association (U.K.) has welcomed reports of a ban on new fossil fuel-powered vehicles starting 2040, saying it will be a "tremendous stimulus" for bike makers.

The Government is due to announce a ban on the sale of new petrol (gasoline) and diesel vehicles from 2040 as part of an effort to tackle air pollution, according to several national newspapers. The measure is expected to include a ban on new hybrid vehicles and "could mark the beginning of the end of the prevalence of the internal combustion engine in automotive transport," reports www.British-DealerNews.co.uk.

The announcement will be in line with a similar commitment already made by

Steve Kenward, CEO of the Motorcycle Industry Association (MCIA), pointed out that no specific mention had been made of motorcycles but added: "I think there's a great opportunity."

"For all the congestion-busting abilities of motorcycles and the abilities to make electric bikes I think it's a tremendous stimulus for the motorcycle industry," Kenward predicts. "It's a tremendous commercial trigger to push on with electric motorcycles."

Motorcycles made before 2007 are already set to be hit by a £12.50 (\$16.10 USD) daily pollution toll for entering London beginning in 2020.

INTERNAL COMBUSTION ENGINE BANS COMING FROM EUROPE, ASIA

A growing list of countries plan to ban conventional vehicles running on gasoline, diesel or other fossil fuels. Several European and Asian countries have already laid out ambitious plans to eliminate fossil fuel-powered vehicles:

Norway & The Netherlands have designed the most aggressive plans, wanting to switch to electric vehicles by 2025.

India wants to get all of its vehicles switched to battery power by 2030, not only ending the sale of internal combustion vehicles, but will convert or replace all vehicles on the road.

France announced plans coinciding

with the G20 summit to have 80% of its fleet electrified by 2023.

Germany is pushing to end sales of gas and diesel cars by 2030.

China is increasing sales of so-called New Energy Vehicles by putting strict limits on the number of new vehicles that can be registered in major cities, exempting NEV models.

Sales of all battery-based vehicles dipped globally in 2016, and in the U.S. sales of hybrids, plug-ins, and BEVs (Battery Electric Vehicles) collectively accounted for barely 3% of the overall new vehicle market.

INDIA BECOMES WORLD'S LARGEST MOTORCYCLE **MANUFACTURER**

India has dethroned China from a long reign as the world's largest motorcycle manufacturer, having already overtaken China to become the largest domestic motorcycle market three years ago. The growth curve is continuing, as India's growing domestic market and partnerships with English and European bike builders have put the country at the forefront of worldwide two-wheeled production.

While overall new motorcycle sales in the U.S. have been about 500,000 a year, and around 125,000 are sold in the United Kingdom, the total sales of machines made in India for the last financial for this fiscal year is 900,000. year came to 17.6 million – more every three days than are sold in the UK in a year; more every 11 days than are sold annually in America.

Meanwhile, China's domestic motorcycle market has been in decline for five years as government policy has incentivized electric bicycle sales and denied motorcycles access to city centers across China.

Conversely, the relentless growth of motorcycle sales in India is beginning to reshape the global marketplace. According to New Atlas, sales within India grew 6.9% last year, thanks to a fast-growing 1.32 billion domestic population that is quickly urbanizing and emerging from poverty -- India has the fastest GDP growth of any major country. A massive India-wide road construction program is also fueling car and bike sales, just as it did in America a century ago.

Currently India's domestic motorcycle marketplace is dominated by sub-125cc scooters and motorcycles, but larger capacity "luxury" classes are taking an increasing share as the market matures. Royal Enfield, built in India for the past 62 years, sold more than 700,000 motorcycles last year, a figure nearly equal to the combined worldwide sales of Harley-Davidson, KTM, BMW, Triumph, and Ducati, and their production target

MILLIONS OF LICENSED MOTORCYCLISTS DON'T RIDE

Nearly 8 million Americans have a motorcycle license, but don't own a bike. These phantom riders, referred to as "Sleeping License Holders," have come to the attention of motorcycle manufacturers seeking new customers as baby boomers age out of riding; wanting to wake them up.

Many of these 'sleepers' were active motorcyclists who had things happen in their life that caused them to quit riding: marriage, kids, financial pressures, a job that demands most of their time or simply a change in interests. Others completed rider training, got their license, but never bought a bike.

All of which has led Harley-Davidson, Indian and other bike makers to devise new marketing strategies.

Harley has set a goal of attracting 2 million new U.S. riders in the next decade and says it's committed to introducing 100 new motorcycles over the next 10 years, including an electric bike, and that effort is expected to bring some sleeping license holders into bike ownership.

Indian Motorcycle Co. is also digging into why the sleepers aren't taking that next step to become motorcycle owners. "I think, collectively as an industry, we continues on page 11

need to answer that," said Kevin Reilly, vice president of motorcycle marketing for Indian.

The median age of U.S. motorcyclists is about 45, according to a report in *Cycle World* magazine, with an overwhelming number of new bike buyers over the age of 50.

'E-DUI' LAW TARGETS DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ELECTRONICS

Washington state has enacted a new 'E-DUI' law that imposes stiff penalties for driving under the influence... of electronic devices. Under their new distracted driving law, referred to as "E-DUI," drivers in the Evergreen State will no longer be able to use a cell phone or any electronic device while driving, even when stopped at a traffic light. The bill was drafted in response to a 32% increase in deaths from distracted driving from 2014 to 2015.

"Put the cell phones down, preserve life," Gov. Jay Inslee said on the steps of the Capitol in Olympia, according to *Q13 Fox News*. Inslee says the bill is called "electronic driving while impaired" for a reason. "When you are driving with a cell phone, you are a more dangerous driver than if you are driving drunk with a .08 blood alcohol level," he said.

The first citation will cost drivers

\$136, nearly doubling for a second offense within five years. Tickets issued for driving while using hand-held electronics will go on a motorist's record and reported to their insurance provider, says a website set up by the state explaining the new law.

In addition, according to the new law, drivers can also get a \$99 ticket for other types of distractions like grooming, smoking, eating or reading if it interferes with safe driving and you are pulled over for another traffic offense.

STURGIS-BOUND BIKE-RIDING MUSIC EXECS BECOME HIGHWAY HEROES

A group of Music Row power brokers bound for Sturgis from Nashville helped yank 10 people from their cars and trucks Aug. 4, 2017, just before fire raced through the scene of a crash in southern Illinois.

A semi-truck had plowed full speed into cars that had stopped for construction on the highway, explains a newspaper article appearing in *The Tennessean*, causing a chain-reaction eight-car pileup. Just in front of that pileup: A 10-person crew of music industry executives riding bikes from Nashville to the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally in South Dakota.

Two of the bikers, brothers from a talent agency who were paramedics for

10 years in San Diego, got in touch with 911 operators and immediately began organizing bystanders, while the amateur rescuers went quickly vehicle by vehicle pulling victims to safety: First, a family of six with children ages 6 to 11; then, a couple of guys in a pick-up truck, one with a bad head wound; finally, a woman, screaming, stuck in a car that looked like a crushed beer can.

The Nashvillians couldn't get her out of the car, so they got about 10 guys together and dragged the entire car, 3 feet at a time, across the highway into a grassy median away from the fire. And like in the movies they did so just before flames ripped through three vehicles that already had been emptied of passengers.


"It was a trip. I'm still tripped out by it," one of the highway saints was quoted as saying in *USA Today*. "There's no doubt, had we not sprung into action like we did, there would've been fatalities."

warn motorists to "watch for motorcycles everywhere," by checking mirrors and looking both ways when at intersections and changing lanes.

The state Department of Transportation, law enforcement and motorcycle safety groups created the campaign to counter a spate of fatal accidents.

Nebraska Highway Safety Administrator Fred Zwonechek said similar campaigns funded by federal motorcycle safety grants have been used in the past to push awareness. "You want to reach drivers, and this is a way to do it," Zwonechek told the *Journal Star* newspaper.

HARLEY-DAVIDSON POLLUTION FINE REDUCED

The U.S. Justice Department has rescinded a requirement that Harley-Davidson Inc spend \$3 million on a project to reduce air pollution as part of a \$15 million fine the Obama administration levied last year for selling illegal tuning kits that cause its vehicles to emit too much pollution.

Under direction from the Trump administration, however, the Justice Dept. has determined that the \$3 million to retrofit wood-fired stoves was not appropriate, saying: "The original consent decree would have required defendants to pay a non-governmental third-party organiza-

tion to carry out the mitigation project. Questions exist as to whether this mitigation project is consistent with the new policy."

The move followed a recent decision by Attorney General Jeff Sessions to halt a longstanding practice under which polluters could be compelled to pay for environmental or community projects, in addition to fines and direct compensation to victims.

Now, a bill working its way through Congress could make AG Sessions's policy law. The bill, sponsored by Representative Robert W. Goodlatte (R-VA) would prevent the government from using settlement money from civil cases for purposes other than direct victim compensation or remediation, like cleanups of environmental disasters.

OVER A QUARTER OF DRIVERS FEEL "BIKER ENVY"

If you've ever come across one of those drivers who seem determined to prevent you from passing on your bike, you may feel a sense of satisfaction in knowing that they're probably just jealous... and it's going to take them some time to calm down after they arrive late for work.

A recent survey has found that 27.8% of drivers experienced 'biker envy' when motorcyclists passed them in traffic and

it took them an average of 34.2 minutes to feel calm and in control again after getting to work late.

The survey of 2,000 commuters by British motorcycle insurer Devitt Insurance also found that employees lose on average 29.6 minutes of work a week because of heavy traffic, costing the U.K. economy £203,846,153 (\$261,351,152 USD).

Almost 13% had missed a job interview while stuck in traffic, while 32.3% said they would try to sneak into work unnoticed on arriving late. Here's a better idea: get a bike!



MILLENNIALS ARE NEGATIVELY IMPACTING MOTORCYCLING

U.S. motorcycle sales for Harley-Davidson, which represents about half of America's big-bike market, were down 3.9% last year, and investment management firm Alliance Bernstein recently

downgraded the Motor Company's rating while citing the millennial generation as a key contributor in the brand's

downturn.

"Our data suggests the younger Gen Y population is adopting motorcycling at a far lower rate than prior generations," AB analyst David Beckel told AOL's Business Insider. "Gen Y's are aging into the important 'pre-family' cohort of riders and Boomers are increasingly handing over their keys to the smaller Gen X population."

Millennials have surpassed Baby Boomers in numbers to become the largest generation pool in the United States, and these 18 to 35-year-olds grew up during a recession, which has impacted their spending habits.

"I think we have got a very significant psychological scar from this great recession," according to Morgan Stanley analyst Kimberly Greenberger. "One in every five households at the time were severely negatively impacted by that event. And, if you think about the children in that house and how the length and depth of that recession really impacted people, I think you have an entire generation with permanently changed spending habits."

BIKE-TO-VEHICLE (B2V) TECHNOLOGY TO PREVENT

MOTORCYCLE ACCIDENTS

Drivers involved in an accident with a motorcycle often claim they didn't see the bike. Their smaller size, quickness and maneuverability makes motorcycles more difficult to identify in traffic. Autotalks, the world leader in V2X (Vehicle-to-Everything) communication solutions, is launching its bike-to-vehicle (B2V) solution, a technology for the prevention of motorcycle accidents. The solution is based on the B2X (Bike-to-Everything) chipset developed by the Israeli company.

Research conducted by Bosch, a leading global supplier of technology and services, finds that motorcycle-to-car communication could prevent almost one third of motorcycle related accidents, which has encouraged the German company to develop what they call a "digital protective shield" for riders. Digital visibility would warn the driver of a car about a motorcycle's close presence, even when it's not visible to the human

The goal of the new technology is to prevent accidents from occurring, by providing warning notices on dashboards. The data would be exchanged by vehicle transmitters through public WLAN and ITS-G5. Potential hazards and nearby motorcycles would then show up on satellite navigation, including direction of

travel, position, speed, acceleration, and vehicle type.

Advantages of the Autotalks' B2V solution include simple integration, low power consumption, the smallest form factor, highest range of operating temperature and smallest physical size, which results in its resistance to the strong vibration and challenging environmental conditions of motorcycles.

OREGON ENACTS R-O-W LAW TO PROTECT MOTORCYCLISTS

A "Right-of-Way" or R-O-W law has been enacted in Oregon, as House Bill 2598 was signed by Governor Kate Brown on June 20, 2017. The bill also known as the "Milkman Mike Act" or the "Driver Responsibility Bill" will become law on January 1, 2018 and expands the offense of vehicular assault to include contact with motorcycle, motorcycle operator or motorcycle passenger that causes physical injury.

"This means that if a reckless driver injures a motorcycle rider or their passenger, the driver can be charged with vehicular assault and will be a Class A Misdemeanor," reports the Oregon Confederation of Clubs. The punishment can be doing time up to one year in prison and a maximum fine up to a \$6,250.

"This is a great win for Oregon rid-

ers!!," states the Oregon COC on their website (www.oregoncoc.org). "Now we have something that has some teeth in it to punish drivers who are determined to be 'reckless'. We have had too many brothers and sisters run down by car drivers getting a ticket for nominal money or no ticket at all. At best they get a slight bump in their insurance rates. And in the case of no ticket, their insurance company never really has a clue they have a high risk client on their hands.

"All it took was a sharp attorney (Oregon A.I.M. Attorney Christopher Slater) to do a very simple thing. He had the great idea to look to see if there is existing legislation. He found legislation that covered bicyclists and pedestrians (ORS 811.060). From there it was easy to add a few words...'motorcycle rider and passenger.' It was so simple it was brilliant. Much thanks to Christopher and his efforts. Many thanks to BikePac of Oregon and ABATE of Oregon who also worked hard to make this bill a reality.

"And may Milkman Mike rest in peace forever. This legislation is something he worked hard to achieve for many years. He was unable to see it done due to a health issue and we lost him several years ago. Mike was constantly working within the motorcycle rights community. He also worked as the coordinator for the Coalition of Independent Riders (COIR). He spent a great amount of time adding non affiliated and independent riders to his communication roster."

OHIO 'DEAD RED' LAW AMENDED *FOR BICYCLES ONLY*

During a lame-duck legislative session ending last December, the Ohio General Assembly passed House Bill 154, commonly referred to as a "Dead Red" law, allowing all vehicles and bicycles to treat a malfunctioning traffic signal as a stop sign and to proceed through a red light after a reasonable time has elapsed, as long as the intersection is clear and you must yield to oncoming traffic with the right of way. Signed by the governor, the new law was to take effect in March, but an amendment was introduced and fasttracked as an emergency measure to remove all motor vehicles (cars, trucks and motorcycles) from the law, and House Bill 9 amended the red light section to apply to bicycles only.


Under the language of HB 154, if drivers think they have waited long enough at a red light, they can go through it, explained Representative Kyle Koehler (R-Springfield), primary sponsor of the amendment bill HB 9 "To amend section 4511.132 of the Revised Code to specify that the alternative protocol for proceeding into an intersection with malfunctioning traffic lights due to a failure of a vehicle detector applies only to bicycles, and to declare an emergency."

Unlike when a stoplight is out or blinking because of a mechanical failure, there is no way for a driver to know for sure if an otherwise functioning light has been signaled to change, so legislators worried that the law would allow motor vehicle drivers to treat intersections like stop signs. Lawmakers rushed to fix the law, and HB 154 passed both chambers unanimously and was signed into law as an emergency measure by Gov. John Kasich, taking effect right away.

While ABATE of Ohio maintains that all Traffic Control Devices should be in good working order at all times and is working with the Ohio Department of Transportation to report/repair malfunctioning devices (Red Light Hotline (614) 387-0722 or biker.report@dot. state.oh.us), the organization reports that "Legislation granting motorcycles the ability to treat a malfunctioning traffic signal as a stop sign is planned for the

"I want to emphasize that AMSAF is a 501c3 non-profit and we look to raise money from State, Federal, Businesses, Community, individuals and events. This money goes to motorcycle safety and awareness and helping to get folks into Motorcycle training." He added, "Since we started offering scholarships, AMSAF has provided more than 2500 in Arizona to help educate riders." AMSAF is committed to helping reduce motorcycle crashes and fatalities here in Arizona.

The number one concern of applicants is affordability. Many folks are on tight budgets and can't afford to do motorcycle training. These Scholarships allow riders to get into a Training course where they otherwise couldn't afford it.

future."

Basically, "Dead Red" laws allow a motorcyclist stopped at an intersection who has not been detected by a traffic signal sensor to run the light legally, when done so safely. Currently, 20 states have enacted such laws, varying in specificity from 45 seconds to 3 minutes, or 1-2 cycles of the light, or "when safe": AR, ID, IL, IN, KS, KY, MN, MO, NV, NC, OK, OR, NJ, PA, SC, TN, UT, VA, WA, WY.

NEW JERSEY RECOGNIZES VETERAN RIDERS

On Thursday, June 22, 2017 the New Jersey Senate and the Assembly voted unanimously to pass Senate Bill No. 1750, and Assembly Bill No. 2729, to create a Veteran license plate for motorcycles.

This establishes "U.S. VET" plates for any honorably discharged Veteran. There will be an annual \$10 charge for these plates and all monies collected will be deposited in a fund to be used by the Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs for the support of programs benefiting New Jersey military veterans.

"When the Governor signs this legislation, it will end an over eight year campaign by ABATE for these plates," announced Frank C. Maimone of ABATE of the Garden State.

HAWAII GOVERNOR VETOES BILL FOR MOTORCYCLISTS TO USE SHOULDER LANES

Legislation to allow motorcyclists to travel on shoulder lanes in congested traffic passed through the Hawaii legislature but was vetoed by Governor David Ige on July 11.

House Bill 727, introduced by Representative Henry J.C. Aquino (D-Waipahu), passed both the House and Senate with only two 'No' votes, and would "authorize the operator of a motorcycle or motor scooter to proceed cautiously upon the shoulder of the roadway, in the same direction at a reduced rate of speed of no more than ten miles per hour" until the adjacent lane cleared.

The intent of the measure was to alleviate congestion and reduce the risk of injury or loss of life, but in his veto message, Gov. Ige countered that "There is concern that this will compromise road safety. The shoulder lane is designed to accommodate stopped vehicles and emergency vehicles on highways, and bicycles on arterial roadways. While the intent of the bill is to reduce risk or injury or loss of life, there is concern that allowing shoulder lane use to these types of vehicles will instead create more danger for the operators of these vehicles."

WHAT IF 10% OF DRIVERS

SWITCHED TO MOTORCYCLES?

In recognition of Ride to Work Day in June {annually on the 3rd Monday in June}, the Motorcycle Industry Association in the U.K. released figures highlighting the benefits for everyone if just 10% of car drivers made the switch to two wheels -- including a 20% increase in parking spaces, a 40% reduction in road congestion and financial savings from less cars on the road.

The figures come from a Belgian study, which modeled traffic for one of Europe's congested roads and found that if 10% of car drivers swapped four wheels for two, congestion for all road users went down by 40%. If 25% of drivers rode, congestion was completely eliminated.

The INRIX Global Traffic Scorecard calculated the cost of congestion to the economy at around £30 billion a year (\$39 billion USD) – a figure that would reduce if more people switched to two wheels. Drivers could gain up to the equivalent of four days (32 hours) annually stuck in traffic.

MPP_Pressure Causes San Marcos Police to

Condemn Motorcycle Profiling

San Marcos (TX)- The San Marcos Police Department (SMPD) has publicly rejected motorcycle profiling and discrimination in response to an inquiry regarding a recent Motorcycle Profiling Project (MPP) request that the SMPD cease and desist from recommending that private owners make their establishments unwelcome to motorcycle clubs by adopting "no motorcycle colors" policies. The department explains that such recommendations are the result of one well-intentioned but misguided officer's actions that are "not in line with the policies of the San Marcos Police Department." The SMPD reminds KXAN that the department "has a policy against profiling and discrimination" and "support[s] the rights of people to peaceably assemble regardless of their appearance, clothing or affiliation with any group."

Although, as of this writing, the SMPD has not directly responded to the MPP's request, *KXAN News* in Austin reached out to the MPP and the SMPD for comment, and ran a follow up to the original story exposing the SMPD recommendations. (click to view) In a statement sent to *KXAN*, in answer to *KXAN*'s inquiries, the SMPD rejects profiling and separates the agency from the recommendations that private owners exclude club members.

From *KXAN*- The full statement received from the City of San Marcos:

"A San Marcos police officer gave well intentioned advice to some local business owners in response to incidents that took place at their establishments. While well meaning, some of that advice is not in line with the polices of the San Marcos Police Department. In fact, the San Marcos Police Department has a policy

against profiling and discrimination.

Our department is here to serve and assist the entire community, that includes both business owners and their patrons. We are sometimes called upon to assist in situations that may arise at a business, and in some

cases to assist when a person is criminally trespassing. We also support the rights of people to peaceably assemble regardless of their appearance, clothing or affiliation with any group.

Our downtown, and our entire community welcomes all law-abiding citizens and visitors.

"Recently, the San Marcos Police Department (SMPD) made a prejudicial recommendation to downtown San Marcos businesses to implement a broad policy of discrimination against any individual wearing motorcycle-related insignia or colors."

"These recommendations amount to coercive pressure from a government actor to implement policies of discrimination. It is settled law that motorcycle

patches and colors Constitutionally protected by the 1st Amendment from acts of government discrimination. Prohibiting individuals from expressing themselves with patches or insignia exposes the government to liability under 42 USC §1983."


"As reported in the San Marcos Record, the President of the Downtown Association of San Marcos has publicly stated that the San Marcos Police De-

partment has seen 'an increase in the presence of the Bandidos Motorcycle Gang in the city and in downtown in recent weeks' and are 'recommending that downtown establishments to keep an eye out and consider implementing strategies to make their space unwelcoming to this group.' One of those strategies is to post dress code signage at the door to include rules against 'Gang related 'cuts,' 'vests,' or other insignia'" in addition to any dress code rules.^{1"}

"Private owners confirm pressure from SMPD recommendations, against their own wishes and economic well-being, are driving bikers NBC News affiliate KXAN (Austin) reports that Kristan Alvarez, owner of KnDs in downtown San Marcos, reports: 'I want bikers in here: I would love to see more bikers here. Like I said, we do sale biker stuff and I'm totally against it,' says Alvarez. 'I know a lot of bikers, Bandidos specifically and I just feel like they aren't all bad people, they shop here all the time and I want to welcome them here,' said Alvarez. 'I was a little upset that they were kind of pushing them away, I lose sales because of that.' 9"

"Cohen California establishes that individuals have the 1st Amendment right to wear clothing which displays writing or designs in public places.¹² The United States Supreme Court has long recognized and protected the right of an individual to freedom of association. Thus, a person's right to wear the clothing of his choice, as well as his right to belong to any club or organization of his choice is constitutionally protected."

National and Regional News

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. House unanimously approved a proposal Sept. 6 to speed the deployment of self-driving cars without human controls by putting federal regulators in charge and barring states from blocking autonomous vehicles, according to a Reuters report. The measure is the first significant federal legislation intended to speed self-driving cars to market. The bill would allow automakers to obtain exemptions to deploy as many as 25,000 vehicles without meeting existing auto safety standards in the first year. The cap would rise over three years to 100,000 vehicles annually. Manufacturers seeking exemptions would have to demonstrate that self-driving cars are at least as safe as existing vehicles. States could still set rules on registration, licensing, liability, insurance and safety inspections, but not performance standards.

State News

NEW YORK - Motorcyclists are reporting that the New York Police Department is towing their bikes after citing the owners for minor traffic or parking infractions and that some bikes have been damaged in the process. The NYPD claims on social media that at least some of these tows are part of the city's Vision Zero plan to eliminate traffic fatalities. In addition to the fine associated with the infraction, the owners have to pay \$185 for the tow and \$20 a night for storage until they retrieve their motorcycles. The AMA sent a letter to the NYPD protesting these actions and asking for a full explanation, but received no response.

Industry News

OCEAN VIEW, Del. - The electric scooter and motorcycle market is expected to reach \$55 billion by 2024, according to a report from Global Market Insights Inc. The report cites increased mobility for short distances, reduced carbon monoxide and nitrogen oxide emissions and the actions of regulatory agencies in several countries as factors in the market expansion. Electric scooter and motorcycle market includes both commercial and personal use cases. Logistics companies can use these products for their small delivery requirements. Food and beverage delivery sector is an attractive segment for this industry. The rental business also presents growth potential in the coming years, the report states.

FRANKFURT, Germany - Volkswagen's supervisory board does not back a plan to sell Ducati, even though several companies showed interest when Volkswagen initially floated the idea in April. According to *Reuters*,

five bidders were on a shortlist of potential buyers, including the Benetton family. Ducati reportedly received offers between \$1.52 billion and \$1.76 billion. However, half of VW's 20-member supervisory board rejected the sale of Ducati unless there are compelling financial reasons. VW's six-month financial results show the company doesn't need more money, according to *Reuters*.

International News

BARIPADA, India - Motorcyclists who are not wearing helmets will be denied fuel for their bikes under a pilot program launched in August. Police there say most of the motorcycle crash fatalities are youths who are not helmeted. Wearing a helmet while riding is mandatory, and service station owners have been directed by the government not to provide fuel to riders without helmets. Those not wearing helmets also are subject to a fine.
