

We learned about the <u>Patriot Guard Riders</u> October 17 Honor Flight Mission from Bob Block. He is a Patriot Guard Rider as well as a <u>Superstition H-D HOG</u> member.

We are so appreciative that he was able to share some information about this landmark event with our readers. B&B

The Honor Flight has been taking WWII and Korean War Veterans to Washington DC to honor them with a free trip so that the Veterans can visit all the memorials that are in Washington. The Patriot Guard Riders is always invited to stand a flag line in the terminal when the flight returns.

October 15, 2019 was the Arizona Honor Flight's Inaugural all Viet Nam Veterans Flight to Washington DC. I wanted to put the word out so there would a good size group to be at Sky Harbor Air Port when they returned to give them the Welcome Home they never got.

Superstition HOG had 15 bikes with 19 people leave <u>Superstition HD</u> and ride to Sky Harbor to meet up with the Patriot Guard Riders at the Special Events Parking Lot. After a short briefing they all rode into a reserved parking area at Terminal 4. They gathered the flags and went into the terminal where the families were waiting for their loved ones to return.

According to <u>Honor Flight Arizona</u>, there were 24 Viet Nam Vets plus their Guardian escorts on this trip.

The three-day trip for the Veterans is a very busy time. It's hard to imagine but this is the schedule. It goes something like this:

Oct. 15 - Fly out of Sky Harbor to Baltimore. Bus ride to the BWI Hilton Hotel. Dinner at the Hotel and receive room assignments.

Oct 16 – 7am breakfast at the hotel. 7:45 board a bus to Washington DC. 9am arrive at the National Archives for a private tour. 11:15 Tour the FDR Memorial. They are given a box lunch to eat. 12:20 Viet Nam, Lincoln, and Korean Memorials are visited. 1:50 the WWII Memorial. At 3:20 it's on to Arlington for the changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown. 4:35 they visit Iwo Jima Marine Corps War Memorial. 5:15 they are taken to Fort Myer for dinner. 7pm it's off to the Air Force Memorial. 8:30 back at the hotel.

Oct 17 - 7:30 Breakfast at the hotel. 8:45 Fort McHenry. 11:00 back to the Baltimore Airport. Lunch is served at the airport after they go through security. Fly Home to a great Welcome Home and their waiting families.

I am so glad we had a great turn out for the return and they got the Welcome Home they deserved.

LiveWire Demo Day at Superstition HD



Excitement was in the air & anticipation high on Saturday October 12, 2019 at <u>Superstition Harley-Davidson</u>, as the HD Demo truck rolled in to provide demo rides on the new <u>LiveWire</u> motorcycle.

Since the demo truck has been in town, a brief concern was registered in the media regarding a production halt on this bike. So let's get that handled & out of the way first. In a statement we requested & received 10-23-19 from Harley Davidson Motor Company, we learned that, "After completing rigorous analysis this week, we have resumed LiveWire production and deliveries. Customers may continue riding their LiveWire motorcycle and are able to charge the motorcycle through all methods. Temporarily stopping LiveWire production allowed us to confirm that the non-standard condition identified on one motorcycle was a singular occurrence. We take pride in our rigorous quality assurance measures and our drive to deliver the world's best motorcycles."

So *NOW* ... let's talk about the *BIKE*!

91 riders queued up for the opportunity to test ride the latest, all-electric innovation created by Harley-Davidson.

After presenting their motorcycle endorsement at sign-in, pilots took a 'pre-ride' on a LiveWire which was set up on the Jumpstart stationary stand. The LiveWire offers twist-and-go acceleration that takes you from 0-60 in 3 seconds. The motor instantly produces 86 foot-pounds of torque. This introduction gave them an idea of what to

expect & a feel for the differences they'd experience on the real thing.

The escorted ride took 4-5 LiveWires out at a time, for about a 5-mile run.

Upon their return I had the opportunity to speak with some of the pilots. I approached riders of different ages to get their opinions. Regardless of age or the style of bike they normally ride, all the responses I received seemed positive. Even comments like 'Definitely different' and 'No shifting felt odd' were offered with a smile & nod. Numerous times I heard that it is very responsive, 'as you back off of the throttle it slows right down'. From some younger riders I heard 'Awesome', 'Amazing', 'Unexpected' and 'Sweet'.

Height came up a few times in the comments. The seat height is a little tall for some. We observed some riders on their tiptoes.

One rider shared that he thought it was great. He was very surprised while at the same time admitting he had been unsure what to expect. The acceleration was unbelievable. He's been watching the LiveWire since the first generation; thinking it was very interesting. Now, he's 'impressed'.

A 'crotch-rocket' rider came in, and numerous people commented that it would be interesting to hear his thoughts on the LiveWire. We learned that the set of the handlebars felt odd to him. {The posture of a sport bike rider is somewhat different from a cruiser or street rider.} He continued that he liked the performance and the bike had good torque.

A younger fellow, who currently rides a Dyna Street Glide and has had other HDs as well, considers this the best HD he's ridden, especially for handling. 'It has extremely positive handling. It's a badass bike, with unexpected power. Braking is instantaneous & very positive.' He described it as fast without that crotch-rocket 'oh shit' feeling that you can get on takeoff. Like a Tesla but on two wheels. He also shared that he got accustomed to the differences from a traditional bike to the electric pretty quickly. It was comfortable. At a stoplight he would look down to be sure the bike was still running, it was so quiet. He stated that it was one of the most amazing rides he's been on. And he was ready to get back into line ⁽²⁾ He'd buy one today... if it weren't for the price tag.

With MSRP starting at \$29,799, the LiveWire will likely spend time on many a wishlist before landing in garages. BUT, it is interesting to see the future and what it may have in store.

AZ Rider Recounting the Worst Motorcycle Wreck in AZ History



Third in a series of installments by survivor Ernie Lizarraga

The one biker the dumptruck did not take out was Will.

While this is going on, less than a mile away E56 is on N. 23rd Dr. for a fall injury. The Captain, Garry Pfaft, hears the call come out on his radio but Engine 56 isn't dispatched because of the call that they are on. Garry walks outside and can see the smoke, so he runs back in the house and tells the Paramedics Mike Estrada and Pat Burcham that he's going to the fire without them. He will pick them up later at the hospital that they'll go to with the patient. He jumps in the truck and has the Engineer Richard Sutter drive to the fire. They are the first ones to arrive on the scene and it looks like a battle ground with bodies laying in the middle of the street. Injured people are on the side of the road and in wrecked cars. He knows other units will be arriving soon. He has Richard direct water to the hose he's pulling to fight the fire, then all of a sudden officer Mike Smith comes running out of nowhere to help him.

Back on 23rd Dr. the patient decides she doesn't want to go to the hospital. So Mike and Pat have her sign a refusal, grab their medical boxes, and start running towards the accident scene. After running a couple of blocks they reach Carefree Highway and see a police car, so they flag him down and catch a ride the rest of the way in the back seat.

As Capt. Garry Pfaft and officer Mike Smith are fighting the fire, Daisy Mountain E145 drives past them. They stop and conduct their triage. First they run to me, Jason, and Dayle in the road; then to Terry, Julie, Will, and Todd on the side of the road; then to the people across the street in the cars that were hit. They determine me and Dayle need to be worked on first so they run back to us. A few minutes later other fire apparatus start arriving and soon there are about 50 to 60 EMTs and paramedics on scene. After a few minutes Daisy Mountain Paramedic Jeff Henricks notices a Maltese cross with a Phoenix bird tattoo in the middle on my arm and a Fire Department union sticker on the bike laying next to me, so he yells out, "Do any of you Phoenix guys know our patient? We think he might be a Phoenix Fire Fighter." Danny Walls off of Ladder 50 comes running over but doesn't recognize me due to the blood and swelling on my face. He pulls out my wallet and sees it's his Captain and the same guy he goes riding with.

A few minutes later there are 6 helicopters circling just above the scene and two of them are medical, looking for a place to land.

Medical Native Air lands on 27th Drive just north of Carefree and Airevac lands on Carefree east of the scene. Dayle is put into Native Air and I'm put on to Airevac. After my helicopter lifts off, a Paramedic on scene that knows me and my brother-in-law Vince Marinez who is also a Phoenix firefighter calls Vince up and tells him what has happened and where I'm being flown to.

Vince calls my sister. My sister calls my wife Lorri at her work. When Lorri hears she runs out to her car and drives the 3 miles to St. Joe's Hospital. When she gets there she runs to the front desk. They tell her I did arrive by helicopter but she can't see me right now. They tell her the hospital has been contacted by the media asking about a firefighter Captain injured; but the hospital will not be giving out any information. Fire Department Chaplain Father Carlucci was talking to the Doctors and he was told I might not make it past the day. He finds Lorri and comforts her. Lorri's devastated.

Sacred Mountain Point of Pines Ride

For those who arrived at Apache Gold Resort in San Carlos for the Run to the Rez by the morning of Friday October 18, the schedule included the Sacred Mountain Point of Pines Ride. This ride is about 140 miles round trip; reaching nearly 7000 feet elevation from our 2,650' starting point.

100+ riders gathered for the 10am departure.

First stop was in Peridot, at Noline's Country Store. Riders topped off their gas tanks and Dr John called them together for a road review.... This was particularly important for those who'd never taken the trip. He warned that while the entire route is paved it is not well maintained. There are sections of the road that are in rough shape. Watch for potholes & rough patches. He also shared that there were no worries about getting 'lost'. There's only one road in & out © Then it was time to roll.

This is one of those times when I am so glad to be a 'traditional gal' who rides behind her 'ole man. I knew that Bruce was busy taking in and focusing on a new road; the condition of which he'd already been warned about. I, on the other hand, could be taking in some of the wonderful views.... Wild flowers, flowering prickly pear & chollas, and other natural beauties of the mountains and flatlands. There were even trees sharing their autumn colors... a treat to us Valley dwellers. It was windy at times. Parts of the road indicated that a light rain had recently fallen. Just a hint of ozone remained in the air. Other times you'd feel the sweet combination of chilling air & warming sun.

We passed a sign announcing we'd arrived at Barlow Pass; having climbed to 6,644 feet. Some of the road was indeed rough ... but it was all do-able. It was similar to the old Route 66 segments that are still open. The views were amazing!

As we climbed, about 10 miles from our destination the pack pulled over to the side of the road. Here, a Spiritual Leader named Manuel Cooley shared some history about and significance of the Nantac Rim & Point of Pines. He reminded us that Life is a learning process © He emphasized the importance of sharing history forward to younger generations. While his words were likely directed most pointedly toward his fellow Native Americans; it is also true that we all have history that can be lost to time if not protected... familial, ancestral, historical, and cultural.

Lunch was ready at the top of the mountain, at a camp of the Point of Pines Cattle Associations. Thank you for the use of your property! Once all the bikes were parked, you could hear the murmur of the breeze through the tall pines. It was SO peaceful! Everyone in line for lunch received a raffle ticket. The Fry Bread was delicious © Raffles were drawn during lunch. Winners received a purse with \$50 in it, a man's wallet holding another \$50, a \$50 gift certificate for the Apache Prime Steakhouse, and a leather jacket. Congratulations to each of you!

As people finished their lunches and concluded their conversations they departed back down the mountain at their own pace. We got back to Apache Gold about 3pm.


On our return ride we passed other bikers on the side of the road. A short time later, with dread, we saw emergency vehicles coming the other way. Thankfully, it was announced later that the rider was at the trauma center but was doing okay.

This is a restricted area. Visits require a permit. We appreciate the invitation and opportunity to be there and to share in the history and community that was imparted.

AZ Rider MPP ~ PA Biker's Firearm Illegally Seized After Major Injury Accident

The MPP has reported extensively about the alarming trend of law enforcement and government officials charging individual with crimes, or having personal property seized simply for belonging to motorcycle clubs. Many of these instances are clear violations of the US Constitution. The following is a report about a Pennsylvania man's ordeal. He has zero criminal history and is a legal Pennsylvania and Utah Concealed Carry Permit holder. While riding his motorcycle he was struck by a truck in a traffic accident. His firearm, nonsensically, was confiscated under the guise of being evidence in the investigation of a traffic accident. Such incidents highlight the urgent need for legislation addressing the practice of motorcycle profiling as recently urged by the unanimous consent of the US Senate.

The Incident

On May 11th, 2019, a member of the Pagan's Motorcycle Club was traveling on Rt. 291, just outside of Philadelphia. A pickup truck driven by an uninsured, out-of-state driver pulled out of the left-hand shoulder of the road and hit the member's Harley-Davidson motorcycle. He was thrown approximately forty feet from the motorcycle, receiving multiple, major injuries. Fortunately, traveling behind was a member of the Brookers MC, and his wife, both former EMT's. She helped keep the victim calm and stable until an ambulance could arrive. While waiting for ambulance and police to arrive, the Pagan's MC member gave the Brookers MC member his legally owned handgun to safely

secure. The Bookers MC member placed the firearm in his truck inside the locked glove box. Once medics arrived and took over the scene, the victim's jacket was unzipped and, according to the Bookers MC member's wife, a Chester police office noticed a Pagan's t-shirt, remarking "oh, he's a Pagan." While being loaded onto the ambulance for transport to a local hospital, another Chester police officer noticed the victim's empty firearm holster.

The Seizure

The Chester officer asked the Bookers MC member if he knew where the firearm was. He informed the officer that he had taken possession of the firearm and would transport it to the victim's home. The officer falsely stated that it was illegal and that he was required to seize the firearm. The Bookers MC member responded that he has a current and legal Concealed Carry Permit in the state of PA, and it is legal for him as such to take possession of said firearm. The officer demanded the firearm while he spoke with a supervisor about the law. The Bookers MC member complied and gave the officers the firearm. The officer returned to his squad car, and left the scene within five minutes, taking the firearm with him.

The Realization

After five days in the hospital with serious injuries, including head and brain trauma, the victim was cognizant enough to speak with his wife about the accident. He was informed that the police had indeed seized his firearm. When he spoke to a member of the Chester police department, he was told that his firearm was sent to Delaware County District Attorneys Criminal Investigation Unit (CID) for ballistic testing. He was told that he would have to petition the DA's office for the return of his legally owned firearm.

4th Amendment Violation

"The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized."

Despite being the victim of a careless, reckless driver, having not committed any crime, the Pagan's MC member had his legally owned firearm confiscated by law enforcement officials simply due to his association with a Motorcycle Club. This is a clear violation of his Constitutional rights to free from unreasonable seizures.

Silence from Law Enforcement

The MPP attempted to contact the agencies involved to no avail. Neither Captain Stubbs of the Chester Police Department, nor Sgt. David McDonald or Chief Joseph Ryan of the Delaware County District Attorneys office responded to telephone calls regarding the seizure, or of any policies of either department that would dictate the seizure of personal property.

After going through the extensive red tape required to regain possession of his legal firearm, after it was illegally seized, the Pagan's MC member was finally successful.

Conclusion

The targeted harassment of Motorcycle Club members in Pennsylvania is nothing new. These situations only highlight the necessity for passage of an Anti-Motorcycle Profiling law. Members of the MPP and the National Council of Clubs are working with local and federal officials towards the adoption of such laws.

We should not, cannot, and will not stand for the erosion of our Constitutionally granted rights.



Pony Express Run with CVMA 32-1



On Saturday September 28, 2019, the <u>Combat</u> <u>Veterans Motorcycle Association Phoenix AZ</u> Chapter hosted their <u>2nd annual Pony Express Run</u>. This event raises funds for local Veterans Charities. It is a Family-Friendly event.

The riders again gathered at <u>Harley-Davidson</u> <u>Scottsdale</u> for registration. After breakfast, which was also sponsored by HDoS, riders departed on a self-paced ride which included stops at Cave Creek Guns and the Hideaway in Cave Creek. In regard to the route; Ghost, CVMA 32-1 Chapter Commander, explained that "due to road construction it was a shorter ride than we originally planned for."

We learned that there were a total of 165 riders. This is about double the participation of their inaugural ride. Congratulations! The event also had the support of more than 50 volunteers. Nice!

The ride format is based on the old Pony Express. Rather than the traditional card that you get stamped at each stop, for this ride you pick up a card aka 'mail' at each stop. You deliver the mail to the last stop. Those cards are all put into a pot & prize winners are drawn from those cards. It strikes me as a unique & clever approach to a riders game; and is apparently being well received.

There was a significant prize pool, with over \$6,000 in prizes awarded to participants in the ride and through raffles.
