

### From Military To Civilian – A Seamless Transition

When members of the Armed Forces of the United States finish at least one year of their tour of deployment they need to enroll in the Veterans Administration (VA) program to obtain any VA Health Benefits they may be entitled to receive.

Service members need to enroll PROMPTLY and do it NOW by following these steps:

- Obtain a copy of your service medical records prior to discharge. Do not take any shortcuts when separating and do this immediately. Any idea of hurrying to get home may cost you time and money should you require VA Healthcare at any time in the future.
- A veteran has two years, after separation, to apply for medical conditions that are a result of their service in the military. After two years the process becomes more difficult.
- If you require medical assistance from the VA after separation/discharge, bring with you a copy of your medical records, a copy of your DD-214, and two forms of picture identification.
- Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in your medical records.
- Enroll in the VA IMMEDIATELY. Do Not Procrastinate!! Know your rights and your responsibilities. If you are not sure, ASK-ASK-ASK-ASK-ASK!!! Ensure that your transition is smooth. Know what you need to do, and DO IT!
- Join a veterans service organization American Legion, DAV, Rolling Thunder®, VFW, AMVETS, Marine Corps League, Alliance of Marine Corps Vets, etc.

That's all there's room for, so for now ...







another. The car or motorcycle breaks down & you need a tow. Aggravating but manageable. You call a service & they come get you. Right? Well, hopefully.

A friend of ours found herself in this situation. Her truck died and she got to the side of the road. BUT... here in AriZona we are all too aware of cell phone 'dead zones'. She was in one of these 'zones' and she couldn't make a call. A tow truck happened to come along and she waved it down. On the trip into town the driver commented that she was lucky she waved. After she shared her story with us, I called Michele of Arizona Motorcycle Towing and had a VERY informative conversation with her on this topic.

There you are ... on the side of the road needing help... in the heat... in the desert... and you can't get a call out. Some drivers are hesitant to stop. Hopefully they'll get into town & pass the word along that there's a stranded motorist out on the highway.

Now to add insult to injury... you see a tow truck rolling up the road. Woo Hoo!! Salvation! The driver can see you clearly. The truck has no load already on it. But he or she drives right on by. So now your thinking... WTF!!!!!?

Did You Know that it is illegal for a towing company to stop for a disabled motorist? It is called 'soliciting business'. If the driver pulls over, they and/or the company can be ticketed. If you find yourself in this situation YOU MUST WAVE THE DRIVER DOWN! *Then* they can stop & render assistance.

While speaking with Michele she shared some other information that can be very helpful for people caught on the side of the road to know.

- ◆ Even if you can't get a phone call out, you MAY still be able to send a text. Get a text off to a friend who can get the 'rescue operation' underway.
- ◆ Call 911. Even if you can't get a phone call out in a 'dead zone', 911 reception usually works.
- ◆ If you are traveling in the HOV lane when you break down and have to pull off to the inside median, a tow truck cannot come in and pick you up. You have to be on the right-hand shoulder. NEVER try to cross the road on your own. Call 911 and explain that you are stuck in the median. DPS will come do a 'traffic break' to make way so you can safely push your vehicle to the right & off the road.

Here are some additional suggestions Michele

- ➤ For couples who each have their own cell phone, use two different carriers. Sometimes one will work while the other won't.
- ➤ If DPS / LEOs stop to assist, you can tell them you want to call a certain provider, rather than who is next in their 'rotation'. You may need to be insistent, but they can do it. This is especially important when it is your motorcycle needing a tow. {Specialty cars... classics, customs, rear-wheel drive, etc. also have specific needs that a standard hook-style tow truck may be unable to handle.} So always keep the number of your favorite service with you.
- ➤ When you call your Roadside Service provider, you can tell them you want to call a certain provider, rather than who is next in their 'rotation'. Again, you may need to be insistent, but they can do it.
- ➤ You can call your favorite motorcycle or auto towing service from where you are stuck. Once the tow

is complete you can submit the paperwork to your Roadside Service provider for reimbursement.

If you do not have a Roadside Service you can call anyone to do the tow and pay them directly for it. If you leave the vehicle or do not have the money to pay someone to transport it, your vehicle will be towed to an impound yard where you'll need to pay the tow plus the associated impound fees. Then you still need to get it towed home or to a shop. That entails another round of fees. It can all add up fast. So it may be worth your while to look into Roadside Service providers.

While this didn't start out to be a commercial or a promotion, after what we learned it seems to be drifting that way. Some organizations, like AMA and AARP, offer coverage for both your motorcycles & autos, which is helpful in our community. Others carriers cover autos but charge extra for motorcycles. Michele added that Geico has a motorcycle-specific roadside coverage as does a company called Motorcycle Towing Services. Our AMA [American Motorcyclist Assn] membership includes Roadside. It's a pretty cool benefit, built in. It's something to research, to make the best choice for your needs. When considering coverage cost, keep in mind how many miles of travel are included per tow {you'll have to pay for any excess miles to your destination} and ask about what may be listed as "uncovered services".

None of us ever want to be in this type of situation, but if you are it's all good stuff to know.



# AZ IIn Remembrance - Louis Charles Le Compte Jr. 7 December 21, 1952 - April 3, 2018







We did not know Louis, but what we've learned about him while preparing this remembrance makes us wish we did. Many thanks to his sister Mary Le-Compte, long-time friend George Diaz, and family friend Carla, for sharing their memories with all of

A native of Tucson, he was a graduate of Sunnyside High School and a retired electrician. He's described as a 'true 24/7 bikers biker'. He was active in community fundraisers for underprivileged children and families.

Carla shared, "I don't believe anyone referred to him as 'Louis'. His close family members called him 'Louito' (as in Little Lou) when he was very young. Other than that, he was Louie. His most common nickname was 'Southside Louie'.

"Tucson used to be pretty spread out, and people tended to spend most of their time in whatever patch of Tucson they were living in. They socialized with others in their area, patronized businesses in their area, and attended schools in their area.

"Once Louie bought his motorcycle, he was all over Tucson and the surrounding areas. Although he primarily rode with the south side guys he had grown up with, he also never hesitated to ride alone, and in no time he became acquainted with everyone, everywhere. I imagine that's how he came to be known as 'Southside Louie'.

"The original south side friends formed 'Los Vatos Southsiders', of which Louie was a long-time member. Los Vatos hosts a yearly 'Christmas in July' fundraiser and accepts toy donations. The toys are then distributed to needy children in the commu-

Later he would become a founding member of Los Hermanos MC; and was a member until his

death. In a sad set of circumstances, Louie was one of 3 LHMC brothers to pass on within weeks of each other; Monkey before & Cheech after.

Louie was a teenager who George met in 1968 or '69, before he left for Viet Nam to serve in the Army. When George got back from 'Nam in '72, he & Louie started hanging around together & have been very close old friends ever since. He said Louie was "a wild man with a big heart who was a straight shooter" noting that they "went through a lot of crazy adventures together."

George called Louie 'Historian' because he had a very good memory. He could accurately tell you about people, places, & events from years before. If you needed to know about something about someone, Louie was who to ask. Carla agreed, "One of the most amazing and unique things about Louie, in my opinion, was his careful attention to detail and his unfailing memory. While the rest of us forget details during our lifetimes, Louie could describe with shocking accuracy every bit of life he ever experienced. He could describe the geography of Tucson right down to where each saguaro had stood, prior to development. He could recall in intimate detail every interaction or shared experience he had had with any of his numerous friends."

George described Louie as "old school to the bone." He had just been awarded a pin by his Club to recognize his 50 years of continuous riding. He took no breaks for the various reasons that people sometimes have for parking their bikes for years and then later returning to the road.

Carla recalled, "He loved that old pan/shovel and was loyal to that bike for over forty years. He always kept it immaculately clean and running well. Best of all, he was always riding. The weather in Arizona can reach some grueling extremes, but not enough to keep Louie off his bike."

She added, "Louie was very generous with his time, knowledge, and genuine friendship. If someone needed help moving, he could be counted on to help. If they needed help working on a car or motorcycle, he was right there. And if they just needed someone to talk to, Louie would lend an ear. He was never too busy for a friend."

Mary reminisced, "Louie had a knack for gift-giving and a mischievous sense of humor." One time he gave a girl friend, a woman in her 20s, a jar of deep-wrinkle cream. ©

On the night of April 3, Louie was delivering flyers to announce a benefit for the family of Monkey who had died the week before. A stop at the home of his friend George would be his last before the wreck.

On a dark section of road that was under construction Louie was in a single-vehicle wreck that claimed his life. Without going into a lot of details; this is another example of a very experienced rider getting caught up in road hazards and being unable to maneuver to safety. Please take this as a reminder to BE AWARE as you ride that shit can happen ... regardless of your experience level.

Family & friends recently held a ride in Louie's honor; placing a cross at the location where he died. Louie was part of a large & loving family; with a wide circle of friends. His Spirit lives on, in the hearts of those who remain.

We respectfully add our condolences to those being extended to Louie's loved ones.

ABATE is an acronym. In Arizona it stands for American Brotherhood Aimed Toward Education. It is a state-level MRO {Motorcyclists Rights Organization}. Most if not all states have at least one MRO ~ many organized in the ABATE name.

Regardless of whether you are member of <u>ABATE of Arizona</u> or even if {until now} you have been unaware of ABATE-AZ; if you ride a motorcycle in AriZona, ABATE-AZ has an integral impact on you and your bike. While many scooter folk are out just 'enjoying the ride' ABATE volunteers {along with their fellow MRO's} are doing the heavy lifting on behalf of the rest of us.

ABATE represents cruisers to sport bike riders; hardcore bikers, weekend warriors, motorcycle enthusiasts, patch holders, independents, and all in between. All Bikes & All Riders are welcome.

By being a member, you add your name to the list of concerned motorcycling citizens who are represented at our State Capitol. As with all lobbying groups, power is in numbers. The more names on the MRO roster, the stronger position our Lobbyists have when speaking with Representatives about motorcyclists' issues.

Over the years, the ABATE-AZ Legislative Team has worked at the Capitol to address issues like Protecting our Freedom to Choose regarding helmet use (continuous); Handlebar height restrictions (eliminated 2015); HOV lanes access for motorcyclists (granted 1992); and Eliminated emissions testing in Pima County (2007) & Maricopa County in 2013. This was the LAST county in the COUNTRY to require such testing! During the 2018 legislative session, ABATE introduced anti-profiling legislation and lane-splitting legislation. 



The Friends of the Kids {FOTK} organization has been assisting the White Mountain Apache Children's Home in White River, AZ for over 10 years. Through the year they collect school supplies, home essentials, foodstuffs, and gifts for in-need children. My thanks to Mike Kyzer, FOTK Board of Directors Secretary / Treasurer for his help with this report

Summer in the Valley is HOT. Riding in the White Mountains is BEAUTIFUL. They've wisely chosen their annual delivery trip to coincide with the White Mountain Bike Rally that takes place at Hon-Dah Casino. This year that meant the weekend of June 22-24.

The 11th annual Friends Of The Kids Ride to deliver the donations to the Shelter took place that Friday, the 22nd. Riders from the Valley & from the north met in Payson for breakfast & then continued as a group up to White River. There were over 20 participants. Mike explained, "The ride is supported by, but not limited to, people from many motorcycle organizations. The main supporters are Superstition H.O.G. & Superstition Harley-Davidson, and Grand Canyon H.O.G. (Flagstaff). Plus we have support from Logan Roberts from Grand Canyon Harley-Davidson in Mayer. And we had new support this year from The Indian Motorcycle Riders Group."

The entourage included a trailer chock-full of goods... Diapers & other baby needs, non-perishable foodstuffs, paper goods, and all the other kinds of supplies it takes to run a house. FOTK sends thanks to Mark and Theresa from HoggDoggs for the loan of the trailer! Thanks also to the Bob Block Family for the gently used yard toys for the kids.

Children from infant to 17 years are cared for at the home. The number of kids in residence at any time is always changing. Mike noted that "When we were there this June there were approximately 10 children being assisted by the shelter."

We learned that they are "approximately \$2500 shy of our goal of \$7500 to start the playground project." And there are "fundraising events in the works for this fall to finish that project."

### MPP - Charges Against Key Motorcycle Rights Activist Dismissed in Waco

As the McLennan County District Attorney's Twin Peaks debacle continues to crumble, an important and previously prolific motorcycle rights activist has emerged from the dust. Thomas Paul Landers, along with most of those arrested in May 17, 2015, has had all charges against him related to the Twin Peaks tragedy recently dismissed.

Paul, although very relieved, is still angry about the continued prosecution of innocent people also arrested and jailed that day that continue to face the prospect of life in prison for being ambushed at a political gathering.

#### Mass Arrests at a Political Gathering

On May 17th, 2015 I arrived home after a 350 mile ride following a club event in Oregon, to my son telling me to watch CNN because they were reporting a shooting at a biker event in Texas. I began watching the news coverage and immediately called my friend Paul Landers when I realized it was a COC meeting. Paul is a prominent motorcycle rights activist and always attended COC events in Texas, so I immediately began worrying about him.

Paul answered the phone from the parking lot of the Twin Peaks. I asked him if he was alright. He said he wasn't injured but didn't know what was going to happen. We hung up, and the rest of the story has been a 3 year nightmare for Paul and nearly 200 others arrested, jailed, and held on \$1-\$2 million dollar punitive bonds. Paul's nightmare ended Monday, May 14th, 2018 when his charges were dismissed by the McLennan County District Attorney. In fact, most of the charges have been dropped against most individuals.

But, unfortunately, the nightmare is not over for 24 individuals re-indicted and charged with rioting, three of them also charged with murder. And because a murder occurred, the sentence can be enhanced to the same level of life in prison.

#### The Persecution Continues for Many

The McLennan County DA's office refuses to let go, has shifted from organized crime to rioting, and persists in charging individuals that irrefutably "retired" from any conflict and still others acting in self defense of themselves or others.

Take the examples of Marshall Mitchell and Jacob Carrizal, both obviously not guilty for different reasons. Marshall Mitchell never engages in any conflict, can be seen shaking a Cossacks hand on video, and quickly "retired" from the area of the ambush and gunshots, just as most that were able. Jake Carrizal, on the other hand, was unable to retreat from an ambush in which he clearly acted in self defense, as the video, his mistrial, and reports of overwhelming support for not guilty from most jurors demon-

#### The Good Fight Continues

The fight to free those that are not guilty must not end. In fact, now is the time to further unite the motorcycle club community and continue the fight to protect the right to associate with a motorcycle club without fear of targeted prosecution. And now that the shackles on one of the most important motorcycle rights activists of our time have been removed, we all stand a better chance of succeeding. #FightTheGoodFight.



We learned that this year there was a total of 1282 registered riders (on approximately 1000 bikes). That is a record for this event. Congratulations! In addition to AriZona riders, others came from 9 different states: New Mexico, Colorado, Michigan, Florida, Oregon, Texas, California, Utah, & South Dakota. Karan commented, "So many of our riders are people that come back every year. We love seeing them and catching up with them. They are all great."

Karan specified, "We want everyone to know that this a family event for all ages." She continued, "Every year kids ride with their parents or grandparents and compete in the poker run if they are the passenger. One little boy, about ten, almost had the high hand in the poker run. There are no extra activities for the kids. They participate in everything the adults do. I think I only saw about 6 kids this year. I saw the kids out there dancing to the DJ we had and enjoying the Apache Crown Dancers that performed. I got a kick watching them dance at the concert to Tommy James & The Shondells. (We know they probably had no idea who he was). We want to always keep it family-friendly. I even vet the vendors to make sure their items are appropriate for all ages. I've turned down vendors who were selling 'adult only' items." All good stuff to

The Poker Run, held on Saturday, was about a 3 ½ hour self-paced ride. The route visited Molly Butler's in Greer, Trail Riders Restaurant in Eagar, Ye Olde Tavern in Alpine, Hannigan Meadow Lodge, with the final stop at Big Lake Tackle and Supply. The ride, which reaches elevations up to 10,000 ft., is through beautiful Ponderosa Pines, Blue Spruce Trees, and the beautiful White Mountain Apache Reservation. Karan shared, "We hear nothing but wonderful things about the people at the stops. These businesses go above and beyond to accommodate our riders and make them feel welcome. All of them graciously give of their time & we could not do this event without their support."


