LEGISLATIVE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

ABATE of Arizona was formed as a corporation on 3/23/1988. Thirty-four years of fighting for the rights and freedoms for Arizona motorcyclists. We've had a tremendous amount of success over the years.

So, what has ABATE done for YOU? Is it time to join the fight?

Take a look at the list:

2022 Two-wheeled motorcycle Operation (Lane Filtering) is the latest accomplishment for Arizona motorcyclists. Passed with only 4 no votes in both chambers. [Read more about Lane Filtering on page 11 of this edition.]

2021 Advocated against the adoption of California emissions standards in Arizona;

Continuation of the Motorcycle Safety Fund for 4 years; [The Department of Transportation is required to deposit \$1 of each motorcycle registration fee collected in the Motorcycle Safety Fund through June 30, 2025, instead of through June 30, 2021]

Helped pass HB2110 CIVIL PENAL-TIES; TRAFFIC; MITIGATION; RES-TITUTION -- [If a "monetary obligation" (defined) is imposed on a person at sentencing, the court is authorized to order the person to perform community restitution in lieu of the payment of the monetary obligation. The court is required to credit any community restitution performed at a rate equal to the state minimum wage, rounded up to the nearest dollar.];

and 5 other bills including Civil Asset Forfeiture, Conviction, Procedures and CDL changes that benefit drivers [includes extending the commercial driver license (CDL) renewal timeline to every eight years.].

2020 Helped pass repeal of the \$32 highway safety fee;

introduced lane filtering;

Advocated against the adoption of California emissions standards in Arizona

2019 Anti-profiling; encouraging prevention Memorial [a written statement of facts or a petition; Encourages state and local law enforcement agencies to take steps to end motorcycle profiling] unanimously passed 60-0 in the House; Mandatory helmet law with fees attached defeated once again;

Helped pass the Texting while driving, prohibition and enforcement, statewide hands-free law signed by Governor April 2019;

Helped pass legislation excluding "sling-shot" type 3-wheeled vehicles from class M applicability signed by Governor April 2019

2018 Introduced Anti-profiling legislation;

Introduced Class M license requirement to register a motorcycle;

Stakeholder for Lane Splitting Bill; Advocated against the adoption of California emissions standards in Arizona; Helped pass "Pam's Law" [This law improves public safety by imposing stricter penalties on those who drive with a suspended license and commit traffic violations that result in serious injury or death.]

2017 Successfully prevented mandatory helmet legislation;

Reestablished Motorcycle Safety Fund for 5 years;

Helped pass the Teen texting bill; Helped pass the Civil Forfeiture changes [Modifies civil asset forfeiture to require the property owner to have been convicted of an offense and for the state to establish the property is subject to forfeiture by clear and convincing evidence.] **2015** Eliminated restriction on handlebar height

2013 Eliminated yearly motorcycle emissions testing in Maricopa County

2007 Eliminated yearly motorcycle emissions testing in Pima County; Removed cap on Motorcycle Safety Fund

2004 Established veteran plates for motorcycles

2002 Established Arizona Motorcycle Safety Council

2001 Established Motorcycle Safety Fund

1997 Established handlebar height elevation to shoulder height

1993 Helped prevent mandatory helmet legislation in Arizona

1992 Opened HOV lanes to motorcycles
