* There are numerous websites offering information about ALS. From what we've gathered in a small attempt to offer perspective here, Lou Gehrig's Disease attacks the nerves in the brain and spinal cord that control your muscles. As your muscles get weaker, it gets harder to walk, talk, eat, and breathe. People with ALS still have full mental function. They have all of their senses -- sight, smell, hearing, taste, and touch. So, unlike some other diseases that debilitate the body & take the mind along with it; while the body of an ALS patient is shut-

ting down they are still completely aware of their condition & circumstances. This no doubt provides the potential to feel like a prisoner of your own body... Unless you devise a way to 'escape' your confines. Boris appears to have done just that © He travels all around the world by way of online friends and his Biker Wall of patches & other mementos.

Boris' heart and determination are inspiring to say the least. He's

a gutsy guy who isn't letting a bad turn of the cards quench his good humor or thirst for life. Rather than giving in to what has happened, he's chosen a more positive path and found a way to still be a part of the biker community.
