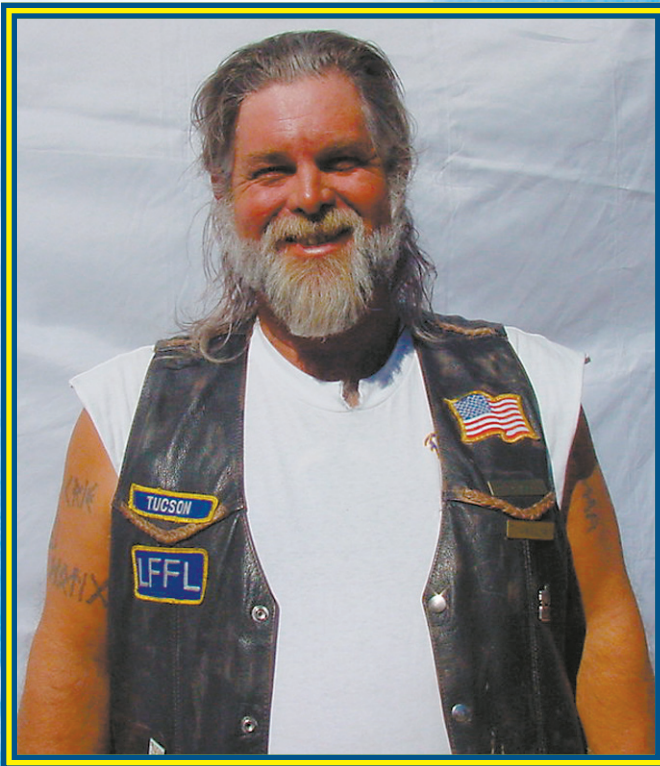


AriZona Rider Reporter is Killed by Stop Sign Runner

On the afternoon of May 3rd, Brian R Klein, 44, of Tucson, while driving his girlfriend's SUV on a suspended license, ran a stop sign at the corner of North Granada Avenue and West Davis Street, hitting Yankee and subsequently causing his death two hours later.



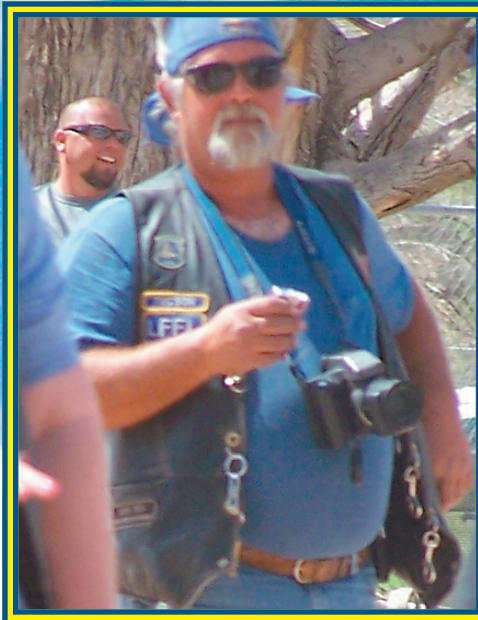
Randolph Gene Doughty 'Yankee'

Yankee had the ability to really tell a story. He had his own style and was easy to read. Kathy & I share an amusement about his unique approach to punctuation... but I figured out how to edit him in short time. In looking back over those four years we realize how much of our community's history he captured... Not necessarily earth-shattering, breaking news... but the moments that reflect the strength of a community ~ the camaraderie, the fellowship, the brotherhood. He truly enjoyed reporting and photography, and he was really good at it. We're so very glad that he chose to work with us and become part of our team.

He always had a cheerful tone to his voice, even if things weren't going exactly 'great'... with work, the truck acting up, school... his manner was positive. He had a hearty laugh that I hope I never forget the sound of.

On Saturday May 13 there was a Funeral Service for Yankee in Tucson, AZ. It was a bitter-sweet day. While it is a time of mourning, it was also a celebration of a beautiful life cut short. We saw people there whom we have not seen in a long time. We met people who we feel we've known for years, from the pictures that Yankee has taken. People attending the funeral overflowed the Chapel and

out into the parking lot. Strangers became friends based upon the common thread of Yankee being part of their lives.

There were wonderful stories, great memories, and heartfelt tributes... All shared in the desire to sum up a life lost to all and loved by many.

Clubs in attendance to show their support included Bikers For Christ, Bishops MC {NJ}, Christian Motorcyclists Ass'n, Cochise Riders, Crippled Old Biker Bastards, Disciples of Christ, Hell's Angels, HOG, Huns, IOOB, Limey Riders, Lost Dutchman, Lucifer's Crew, Nomaden Int'l, Old Pueblo Riders, Riders of Fire, Rough Riders, Scythe M/M, Sober Riders, Sons of Odin, Spartan Riders, Stoned Sober, Sun Riders, Unidos, Vietnam Vets / Legacy Vets, VIII Society, Wolf Pak, and Yaqui Warriors. After the Memorial Service there was a party at Shooters Restaurant. Yankee's instructions were that he wanted a party... so his Loners MC brothers obliged. The focus of the party, aside from the camaraderie and brotherhood, was an auction to help raise money to assist the family with Yankee's final expenses.
