From Military To Civilian – A Seamless Transition

When members of the Armed Forces of the United States finish at least one year of their tour of deployment they need to enroll in the Veterans Administration (VA) program to obtain any VA Health Benefits they may be entitled to receive. Enroll PROMPTLY by following these steps:

- Obtain a copy of your service medical records prior to discharge.
- A veteran has 2 years, after separation, to apply for service-related medical conditions After two years the process becomes more difficult.
- If you require medical assistance from the VA after separation/discharge, bring with you a copy of your medical records, a copy of your DD-214, and two forms of picture identification.
- Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in your medical records.
- Enroll in the VA IMMEDIATELY. Do Not Prograstinate!!
- Join a veterans service organization American Legion, VFW, DAV, AMVETS, Marine Corps League, Rolling Thunder®, etc







NHTSA Campaign #: 24V713000 Insufficient Side and Reflectors/FMVSS 108

Summary: Royal Enfield North America Limited (Royal Enfield) is recalling certain 2023 Himalayan, Classic 350, Meteor 350, Hunter 350, Super Meteor 650, Int 650, and Continental GT 650 motorcycles. The side and rear reflectors are not sufficient. As such, these lights fail to comply with the requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard number 108, "Lamps, Reflective Devices, and Associated Equipment." Without the proper reflective equipment, it may be difficult for other road users to see the motorcycle from the rear or side, increasing the risk of a crash.

Potential # Units Affected 4,017 Remedy: Dealers will replace the side and rear reflectors, free of charge. Owner notification letters are expected to be mailed October 30, 2024. Owners may contact Royal Enfield's customer service at 1-866-600-1122.

NHTSA Campaign #: 24V719000 Incorrect Tire Pressure on Label/FMVSS 120

Summary: Harley-Davidson Motor Company (Harley-Davidson) is recalling certain 2018-2019 Softail FXBB Street Bob and 2018-2019 Softail FXLR Low Rider motorcycles. The front tire inflation pressure on the VIN label may be less than the stated front gross axle weight rating (GAWRs). As such, these motorcycles fail to comply with the requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard number 120, "Wheels and Rims - Other than Passenger Cars." Incorrect tire pressure information may result in overloading the front tire, increasing the risk of a crash.

Potential # Units Affected 12,929 Remedy: Harley-Davidson will mail labels with installation instructions and owner's manual inserts to owners, free of charge. Owner notification letters are expected to be mailed mid-late November, 2024. Owners may contact Harley-Davidson customer service at 414-343-4056. Harley-Davidson's number for this recall is 0628.





AMA Enduro Champion, Pioneer among women riders, Motor Maids Co-Founder. Inducted into the Hall of Fame 1998

Dot Robinson is considered a pioneer for promoting motorcycling for women in the middle of the 20th century. In 1941, Robinson helped form the Motor Maids, an organization for women who enjoyed motorcycling. Robinson also opened doors for women riders in the competition arena. A regular competitor in endurance runs in the 1930s, '40s and '50s, Robinson's desire to race came under attack. Attempts were made to prevent her from participating in the sport she loved. But she persevered and was allowed to compete, making it possible for other women to race in later years.

Robinson was born on April 22, 1912, in Australia, and was a motorcyclist even before her birth. When her mother went into labor with Dot, her father, James Goulding, loaded Dot's mother into a sidecar rig and dashed off to the hospital.

amateur racer and his designs were renowned for their reliability. Goulding moved to the United States to expand his sidecar business. The Goulding family made America home in 1918 and eventually settled in Saginaw, Michigan, running a motorcycle dealership. Dot grew up around motorcycles and started riding at a young age. She

met her future husband, Earl, while she was in high school.

"Everyday after school, Earl would come to the shop to buy one part or another," Robinson recalled. "By the time we were married, Earl probably had enough parts to start his own store."

The Robinsons were married in 1931 and both participated in endurance runs and races. Dot earned her first trophy in 1930 at the Flint 100 Endurance race. After the couple made a record transcontinental run together in 1935, Harley-Davidson asked the Robinsons if they would like to run a dealership. Soon afterward the couple moved to Detroit and opened a successful Harley-Davidson dealership, which they ran until 1971.

In 1934, Dot entered her first Jack Pine National Endurance Championship in her home state of Michigan. By 1940, Dot won the famous Jack Pine in the sidecar class, becoming the first woman to win in AMA national competition. She repeated the feat in 1946.

While attending the Laconia national in 1940, Dot was approached by a New England rider named Linda Dugeau about starting a women's riding organization. Within a year, the Motor Maids was established. The organization was instrumental in convincing many women to try motor-


cycling for themselves. Motor Maid activities were covered extensively with a monthly column for years in American Motorcyclist magazine. In the 1950s, Dot began wearing her trademark pink riding outfits. She turned away from the traditional black leather outfits after movies of the day portrayed black-leather-clad motorcyclists as outlaws.

After the Robinsons sold their dealership in 1971, the couple traveled extensively by motorcycle. Dot's favorite trip was a 6,000-mile excursion through the country of her birth, Australia. Earl died in 1996, but Dot kept right on riding until January of 1998 at the age of 85, when knee replacement surgery made it too difficult to get on and off her sidecar rig. She figured she had totaled a million and a half miles in her years of riding.

Dorothy Robinson passed away on October 8, 1999. She was 87 years old.

To Err Is Human - To Really Muck **Up Requires A Computer**

Two self-driving taxi companies embarrassingly made news this

week. First, while Vice-President Kamala Harris was in San Francisco, her travel was interrupted when a Waymo robotaxi got stuck in the path of the Vice-Presidential motorcade while trying to make a turn. The driverless vehicle had to be manually moved by police to unblock the route. That story comes on the heels of reports from San Francisco that parking lots with off-duty Waymo vehicles become confused and start honking at one another. Nearby residents have complained about the driverless cars honking randomly at all hours of the day and night.

In more serious news, General Motors robotaxi company, Cruise, will undergo more stringent oversight and pay a fine to settle claims by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) that it failed to disclose information about a crash involving one of its cars that struck and dragged a pedestrian last fall.

In October 2023, a Cruise robotaxi dragged a pedestrian nearly 20 feet before coming to a stop. The incident injured the pedestrian and resulted in a suspension of Cruise's license to operate in California. The case prompted Cruise to recall its automated driving system. According to NHTSA, two reports Cruise provided about the event failed to disclose post-crash details and were incomplete.

Remember that all three of these stories involved vehicles with no driver behind the wheel! The Motorcycle Riders Foundation remains committed to spreading the word about the protection that all roadway users deserve from being test subjects for this new technology. If the Vice-President of the United States can have her path blocked by a driverless car, what chance does the average biker have out there?

Glacier National Park or Bust!

A road trip shared by Jennifer Parker Sievers, the Motorcycle Princess

Come share my 11-day, 3700 plus miles, 7 states ride thru two of the West's greatest National Parks. Our goal was to ride Glacier National Park, MT; Beartooth Pass, MT/WY; Yellow Stone National Park WY; the Flaming Gorge, UT; Grand Mesa Scenic Byway, CO; Chief Joseph Hwy, WY; and to stop at 8 Harley-Davidson dealerships along the way.

The Plan. There were 2 of us on this ride. Our plan was a little different. We decided to blast up to Glacier National Park in Northern Montana just 30 miles south of the Canadian border. We rode 1400 miles in 3 days from Chandler, AZ to Columbia Falls, MT; averaging about 475 miles a day. Arizona was 115 degrees on August 29; the day we left. We landed in Columbia Falls Montana {just outside Glacier National Park} on day 3 at 65 degrees. We brought the range of all weather gear: cooling vests, leathers,

chaps, thermals, heated jackets, and heated gloves.

We were worried because a foot of snow had fallen on the Pass of Glacier National Park Thursday late afternoon; but we were lucky because the snow melted the next day. By the time we rode GNP on Sunday, the high of the day was 84 degrees.

Glacier National Park was amazing. We started our day west of the park; leaving out of Columbia Falls. It's a great town to stay in. Then we rode just south of the park along Highway 2; which was an amazing road in itself. We decided to enter on the St. Mary side (East side of the Park) and head west. We entered the park and the Mountain views are beautiful. We pulled over and decided to hike to Bearing Falls, which was only a half a mile. We were in our motorcycle gear but it was so worth it. Beautiful is an understatement.

Then we got back on our bikes and rode to Logan Pass, the highest paved road in Glacier; where there had been

a foot of snow 3 days earlier. Then we rode the rest of the "Going-to-the-Sun" Road to McDonald Lake. We stopped for some yummy lunch sitting outside, which we can't do in September in Arizona, and enjoyed the views of the lake. Then we rode back to Columbia and walked to a fun outside bar and listen to Country music.

You get to park in front of your room and they have a bike wash area with rags. They also offer cooked to order breakfast. This town is the cutest. I want to go back and spend a long weekend there.

The next morning we rode Beartooth Pass and Chief Joseph Highway. Wow!
