Dear James,

I mentioned to you on Thursday last my concerns at the unnecessary diversion of scarce NHS resources through the NHS Hospital Guidelines on Gender self-determination which has been taken from the 2010 Equalities Act.

As I commented, these Guidelines are assuming an NHS responsibility which causes staff considerable concerns (I have data) but which are in force and must therefore be obeyed.

I write to request the lifting of these guidelines for the foreseeable future for three reasons following:

- 1. Hospitals are excluded from the 2010 Equalities Act; by issuing Guidelines the NHS seemingly ignores that exclusion which was passed by both Houses, thus placing the NHS above parliament.
- 2. Annex B of the NHS Guidelines are a direct contradiction to the Equalities Act; by quoting as justification of the Guidelines a filleted version of the relevant Article the NHS reaches an invalid conclusion. That is to say, a conclusion based on a false usage of the Act.

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3. The Self Identification proposal is not yet agreed either by parliament nor by <u>Government. It</u> is a highly contentious proposal which has resulted in physical violence, no platforming, job losses and closing of public meetings. The Government issued a limited (difficult to access and hard to understand) consultation paper a year ago and the 80,000 responses await publication and public debate. With these socially divisive aspects in mind the NHS Guidance is vastly premature.

In conclusion, I request a lifting of the NHS Guidelines while the pandemic continues and subsequently until parliament has decided after Public agreement or other reasons that the initial proposition should go ahead.
