REVIEW AND ACCEPT MINUTES

REGULAR BUSINESS:

Jon provided an overview of the fourth quarter market environment, noting the Fed loosened its policy stance with two rate cuts totaling .50%. This indicated that the Fed felt that the fight against inflation was progressing, but the pace of future cuts was unclear. Equity results were modestly higher for the quarter, with returns in the technology and communication services sectors dominating performance. The S&P index was up 2.4% while the small cap index was up only .3%. Large cap performance was due to performance of a limited number of stocks. The weight of the top 10 stocks made up 35% of the S&P index. This concentration helped push large cap returns above 20% for the second straight year. International stocks underperformed.

Jon discussed the portfolio performance noting that the small cap portfolio hurt overall performance. Baird, Hartford and PIMCO each outperformed their indexes.
