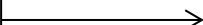

1) MORNING PRAYER  
 Most highly favoured lady, filled with grace to be the Virgin Mother of Christ and of His members because You believed, You are the figure of the Church and You shine before it as a sign of hope and consolation, O Mary Immaculate. Pray that Your children may be faithful to the grace of their Baptism in times of temptation, testing and persecutions. O loving Virgin, ask for them the Spirit of Your Son, so that, united to the Redeemer, they may become true witnesses seeking the fullness of the Kingdom. We pray that the Church, Virgin and Mother like You, may by the virtues of her only Saviour be fully open to her mission, in order to reveal to the humble the riches of divine mercy, and show to all people that she is the sacrament of union with God and of unity among men and women.  
 2) EVENING PRAYER: "Memoriae"  
 Remember, O most loving Virgin Mary, that it is a thing unheard of, that anyone ever had recourse to Your protection, implored Your help, or sought Your intercession, and was left forsaken. Filled therefore with confidence in Your goodness, I fly to You, O Mother, Virgin of virgins. To You I come, before You I stand, a sorrowful sinner. Despire not my poor words, O Mother of the Word of God, but graciously hear and grant my prayer.
