Who We Are

Arkansas Holistic Therapy (AHT) is an outpatient behavioral health clinic. We offer professional mental health services to children, adolescents, adults, and families that focus on the whole person- we integrate mental, physical, and emotional approaches to managing emotional and behavioral health. We believe that people are the experts of their own lives and can be healthy and successful when they are able to access and utilize the support and resources they need.

Our philosophy rests on four pillars:

What You Will Do

Under the direction of Arkansas Holistic Therapy's Director, the LMSW will provide a range of psychological assessment, diagnostic, therapeutic, and/or case management services for students and families, as appropriate to the specific expectations of this position. In addition to providing counseling, therapy, and/or psychotherapy to students and families, you will prepare treatment plans, discharge plans, follow-up care guidance, and provide therapeutic crisis intervention and emergency services as required. The LMSW typically works under the direct guidance of a clinical professional assigned by the Director.

Specific Responsibilities include:

- Provide appropriate evidence-based psychotherapy with individuals, groups and families
- Spend a minimum of 60-70% of time delivering direct clinical services in assigned LRSD school(s)
- Conduct psychosocial assessments and updates as needed
- Conduct intakes and assist in coordinating placements in residential programs
- Develop appropriate goal focused, person centered, treatment plans containing measurable goals and objectives; obtaining client and other stake holder (guardians, family members) input as appropriate
- Provide clinical consultation and support as needed to QBHPs
- Maintain communication as needed with external treatment teams and professionals
- Participate in quality and compliance reviews of all clinical charts
- Provide crisis intervention services
- Maintain accurate and timely client files and assure records comply with all applicable standards
- Document all meetings and calls with students and families
- Complete daily billing

- Provide input for program planning
- Attend weekly supervision, staff meetings, quarterly and in-service trainings
- Follow AHT's mission statement and core values
- Provide and/or arrange for therapeutic interventions as appropriate for patients or clients in a crisis condition and for those with serious disturbance problems
- Abide by the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) Code of Ethics guidelines
- Consult with other therapists and related professional and paraprofessional staff, as appropriate, in the performance of therapeutic and/or casework; refer clients to appropriate service agencies as required.
- Perform other duties as assigned to support the mission of the organization

What You Bring
