## HOW DOES MONTESSORI PREPARE CHILDREN FOR WRITING? (Continued)



When children enter the Montessori environment, we help them, to expand their hand-eye coordination, focus, and concentration. Initially, these skills are learned through various activities in the Exercises of Practical Life area. It is vital for little children to obtain these skills, because without them they would be in a chaotic state.

Then they are guided to strengthen small muscles, wrist movement as well as lightness of touch and we progress into the Sensorial area. Simultaneously, we train their ears to distinguish various sounds and later present them various sounds sandpaper phonetic with symbols in Sensorial as well as Language areas. Concurrently, children introduced to tracing various shapes using colour pencils to form various controlled shapes with movement. Finally, the use of chalkboard and chalk gives the child an opportunity to actually form shapes of letters.



However, according to Dr. Montessori, writing is not just the mechanical part of writing. It is also, how a person learn to put together the symbols of letters together to form words.

"Summing up, we may say that the two mechanical factors of writing are resolved into two independent exercises, that is, drawing, which gives the hand the ability to handle the writing instrument, and touch the letters of the alphabet, which serves to establish a motor memory along with a visual memory of the letters."
