

presented to children according to their age and skill level. Dr. Montessori discovered that children preferred these educational materials over toys and they would work with them repeatedly to satisfy an inner need they have in order for them to learn certain skills that will prepare them for their later life, and become Normalized. She also created a special environment for children, everything in it prepared according to the child's size. This was her experiment on children like a Scientist perform experiments in a laboratory. But Dr. Montessori believed that children would better perform if she placed them in an environment they were comfortable with, which is like a home. Then she observed them, presenting materials representing whenever necessary, leaving them to work with the materials on their own.

Dr. Montessori said, "We must help the child to act for himself, will for himself, think for himself; this is the art of those who aspire to serve the spirit."



Current Scientific research have proven that a Montessori prepared environment, a prepared adult and Montessori materials, aid children with their Executive Functioning; paying attention, controlling behavior, and thinking flexibly for their success in Kindergarten and beyond.
