BOOK REVIEW THE LAGUNA

The Laguna Madre (Spanish for "Mother Lagoon") is considered the jewel of the Texas Gulf Coast. This long, narrow body of water is only one of six hypersaline lagoons worldwide. It is both a playground for outdoor aficionados and a sensitive habitat for many aquatic and avian species. The Laguna stretches south from Corpus Christi beyond the Texas / Mexico border into Tamaulipas, Mexico. According to the National Park Service, the Laguna Madre accounts for 80% of all Texas seagrass beds and is historically the most productive bay fishery in Texas.

As a young man who grew up in the Rio Grande Valley, the Laguna Madre shaped Andres Spinetti's life in dramatic ways. He started fly fishing when he was twelve and developed his casting and fishing skills under the mentorship of renowned fly fishers, including Tim O'Brien and Rick Hartman. With their tutelage and guidance, Andres began exploring the Laguna and discovered his creative side when he completed his first film project, Madres Padres, in 2020.

In 2023, he started *The Laguna Podcast*; at the time of this publication, he has interviewed almost fifty knowledgeable and influential personalities associated with fly fishing and conservation along the Gulf Coast of Texas. According to Andres, "Through the podcast, I have been able to meet and create rapport with some of the industry's titans, which in turn has allowed me to finally put together a project I had only ever dreamt about: LAGUNA. It's a coffee table book that illustrates the stories told by many of the people I am proud to call my guests on the podcast. It includes 288 pages, over 320 images, and 14 short stories from people who share the same passion."

This beautiful book is an homage to the Laguna Madre. The photographs bring into focus the people, places, scenery, and wildlife that further define this habitat's uniqueness, and the 14 stories offer musings from thought leaders in the fields of fly fishing, conservation, boat mechanics, art, and life.
