Voters' Assembly Minutes Sunday, April 23, 2023

The chairman, Larry Onesky, called the meeting to order at 10:15 am followed by a prayer from Pastor Scheer.

The minutes of the November 13, 2022, Voters' Assembly meeting were read and accepted as presented.

Three members will be applying for membership at the end of the meeting: Mark Forrester, Michael Golden, Irene Walters.

School

Cheryl has 18 preschoolers not 16 as printed on the report.

Outlook for 2023-24: Currently Pastor Scheer has re-enrollment papers for 40 students.

Julie Metzger-Rader is assuming more responsibilities as principal and already has a calendar for the new school year. She plans to have the Christmas program on a Wednesday evening to possibly coincide with an Advent Service. She and her husband, Tim plan to transfer to Holy Cross from Faith Lutheran in Avon.

Cheryl Poppe reported that her Preschool parents were disappointed that preschool would not be reopening in the fall.

Someone has inquired about using the preschool building for a Day Care facility, but nothing has been established.

Pastor has 6 more Sundays to preach and lead worship. The Altar Guild will need to revisit many of the duties Pastor has assumed since and during COVID. Discussion followed in which it was established that a meeting will be needed to transition into additional duties by members.

The school has been paying the church secretary's salary for a few years. This may have to change. The current secretary will only work 1 day a week during the summer months. Pastor Scheer will need to instruct an individual on how to do the bulletin. This will involve contacting the vacancy pastor regarding hymns, readings, and other items related to the services.

The organist issue has been resolved. Celeste Stonebraker will play for at least a year beginning May 14. Hon Ki will be relocating to Texas. However, an organist is needed for June 4, Pastor's last day to preach at Holy Cross, since neither Celeste, nor Hon Ki is available that Sunday.

Holy Cross will be hosting a concert by the Ashland University Choir on Monday, May 8. Pastor Scheer will distribute posters that he has obtained announcing this event. Holy Cross is also hosting a meal for the choir members at 5:00 pm prior to the concert. Those interested in helping should call Ed and Suzanne Himmelein who are preparing the dinner.

Call Committee: Larry Onesky moved that we form a Call Committee; Kathy Nehrenz seconded the motion. The motion passed.

School Line of Credit: Larry Onesky moved that the Voters approve a Line of Credit for \$60,000 for 1 year needed for the school to meet payroll during the summer months. Kathy Nehrenz seconded the motion. The motion passed. Church Finances review.

Board of Elders:

A meeting between the Elders, Deacons, and those interested in serving on the Altar Guild needs to be scheduled. Larry would like a list of Altar Guild duties. Diane will provide the previous list of duties. Larry stated that Ed has agreed to deacon. We could still use a few more deacons.

The Board of Elders is responsible for forming the Call Committee.

Discussion followed regarding congregation members' thoughts about a new pastor and Holy Cross' services/activities in the future.

Thank you to Cheryl for having the preschool sing at the service this morning.

Board of Christian Education:

Charline Mueller reported that the Board will provide corsages and robes for the confirmands, and refreshments after service for those attending Confirmation Sunday, May 28,2023.

Board of Property:

The Preschool building is being considered for a Day Care facility. Cheryl Poppe said that one advantage to this would be an After-School care program available for our day school students. Larry said that more information will be forthcoming once this solidifies.

Since no names have been submitted so far, Bishop Hardy will start working on a list. Larry stressed that those on the committee need to know that the entire process is totally confidential. In fact, those on the committee will need to sign a Confidentiality Agreement. Committee procedures were discussed. Alan asked if anyone would like to volunteer to be considered for the Call Committee. The Board of Elders is responsible for selecting the Call Committee for a pastor. Leslie Dolsen, Lynn Gold, and Kathy Nehrenz, would like to be considered. Larry Onesky will be an ex-officio member. Once the Board of Elders has established a Call Committee, it must be approved by the Voters' Assembly.

Michael Gold asked if there has been any contact with a church regarding a merger. Larry says there has been no activity in this regard. Discussion followed.

Nominating Committee

Larry stated that approximately one-half of the Board of Directors have terms expiring. At least 5 people are needed for the Nominating Committee. Larry Onesky cannot be on this committee. The following volunteered to be on the Nominating Committee: Alan Apelt, Robin Hellisz, Pat Loomis, Keith Monson, Cindy Rambert. Kathy Nehrenz moved that nominations be closed, and we elect all five. Motion passed. Larry Onesky will provide a list of eligible voters to the committee.

Call Committee

In accordance with the bylaws the formation of a Call Committee must be first approved by the Voters.

ARTICLE II

<u>CALLING OF PASTORS, TEACHERS, DIRECTOR(S) OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND OTHER SYNODICALLY CERTIFIED WORKERS</u>

FORMATION OF CALL COMMITTEE(S)

Upon authorization by action of the Voters' Assembly, a Call Committee shall be organized. The Board of Elders shall select candidates to serve on the Call Committee for the calling of pastors or other synodically certified workers. The Board of Christian Education shall select candidates to serve on the Call Committee for the calling of teachers or directors of Christian education. Upon approval of the Call Committee candidates by the Voters' Assembly, the Call Committee shall be formed. The Call Committee shall solicit recommendations from the congregation for the called office.

NOMINATIONS

At a meeting of the Voters' Assembly properly convened, the list of candidates received from the District President for the called office shall be presented by the Call Committee. Nominations from the floor shall not be permitted.

School Line of Credit

This loan is "owned" by the church because the school has no assets. The school uses the loan to pay teacher salaries and other expenses starting in August and pays the loan back once State of Ohio vouchers and other income starts coming in a few months later. The loan is being renewed for \$60,000 for the upcoming year. LCEF requires Voter approval for the renewal.
