




Highlights from 2023/24

Typically our band season mirrors the academic year, starting in September, and can therefore be divided into 3 distinct 'terms'. Before we look at the events during term 1 of 24/25, it's worth setting the scene with some highlights from 2023/24.

You may recall that 2023 marked the Band's 30th Anniversary with celebrations focussed around a trio of Showcase Concerts; bookended in the Spring (1st April) and Autumn (25th November) with concerts at MCC, with the Summer Spectacular held at the Ukrainian Centre on 16th July.















Highlights from 2023/24 Cont.

On Sunday 30th June, staying within Manchester 8, we held our summer concert at the Irish World Heritage Centre, Cheetham Hill; the first time we had used this venue that was familiar to many of the audience and band as the venue had been utilised as the local mass vaccination centre during the COVID pandemic. The concert was a success and the Training Band once again featured too. Despite the success of the concert, in a later survey of band members and audience reviewing the 23/24 season, the concert was seemingly the least favourite of the three showcases held during the season.



Your generosity helped me purchase a high quality vintage (1976) B&H Sovereign cornet that I now play in Radcliffe Brass Band having joined them just before my

60th.

By coincidence 1976 was a poignant year for me as, having played a bugle (without reading a note of music) in the $191^{\rm st}$ Scout Band / Crumpsall Scout & Guide Band for a year, I joined my high school band and began learning the cornet; marking the start of my chromatic banding journey.

Another successful season; a milestone one in the history of our band, just setting us up nicely for season 2024/25. RF



The 2023/24 season closed out with the band supporting Herristone Park's Summer Fair once again and we followed this with a short break from rehearsals with our end of season social taking place at the Woodthorpe on 17th July 2024.

I'd like to formally thank the band for their best wishes, cards and gifts (some as pictured below) as I celebrated my 60^{th} Birthday over a couple of weeks in July 2024 including at our social.







Season 2024/25 Review Part 1: September – November 2024

After a series of informal summer rehearsals and a brief break, rehearsals for season 2024/25, the band's 32nd, commenced on Wednesday 4th September. The immediate focus was to build towards the first performance of the season; the Macmillan Coffee morning held at MCC on Saturday 28th September.

The honour of opening our 2024/25 performance programme was handed to our **Training Band** who, just days later marked their first birthday having been founded on 4th October 2023. They played really well in the church foyer, providing a musical backdrop to the coffee morning. Thanks to all who played in the band and to everyone who supported the event.

As a band we had been looking to enter the National Concert Band Festival (NCBF) for several years but the heats have traditionally been held in December when the band are usually in the midst of a busy pre-Christmas schedule. This year the event was held much earlier than usual on Sunday 3rd November. Unfortunately, the planned Bavarian Evening for Saturday 2nd was postponed indefinitely, allowing rehearsals to fully focus on our NCBF programme. From the permitted list of pieces we chose the three movements of the English Folk Song Suite composed in 1923 by Ralph (Rafe) Vaughan-Williams and the more contemporary piece, Robert Smith's Encanto, composed in 1989.

The festival took place at The Crompton Academy in Oldham where, in total 15 bands would perform throughout the day in front of an adjudication panel and appreciative audience. We exceeded our debut expectations and scooped a Gold Award overall with some aspects of our performance even going Platinum. We received very positive and constructive feedback which will undoubtably help support our continued development.

A week later, the Band's Bugler's, Mandy, Phil, Ruthanna, Victoria and I, between us covered Remembrance Sunday at MCC and the following day, Armistice in Blackley Forest supporting Bowker Vale Primary School's Annual Act of Remembrance in partnership with the 'Friends of the Forest'. The school's Y6 pupils read some powerful poems ahead of our Bugles sounding Last Post, and, following the silence, Rouse. As



with previous years, it was a poignant ceremony and the school do fantastic work in ensuing the younger generation recognise the **importance and solemnity of Remembrance..... Lest we Forget**.

Several members of the band, who also play with other bands were involved with ceremonies across Greater Manchester on Remembrance Sunday and our youngest band member, **Alissa**, played Last Post on her cornet in her primary school assembly on Monday 11th. Very brave and good to see the future of Remembrance is being encouraged and assured by today's young people. At the other end of the spectrum, as always, I remain personally privileged and honoured to play each year; this being my 43rd consecutive rendition of the Last Post on Remembrance Sunday in Crumpsall, my first being in the grounds of MCC, representing Crumpsall Scout & Guide Band on 14th Nov 1982 playing alone, conducted by CSGB's Music Lead, **Derek Farnell** - seems like only yesterday ©.



Growing a Legacy

Introducing our Training Band, Launched 4th October 2023

Prompted by Derek Farnell's advice upon becoming our inaugural Honorary President in 2020, a long held ambition of the Band's Executive, to launch and develop a sustainable Training Band, finally became reality, fittingly, during our **30th Anniversary year**. Planning began in earnest in February 2023 with the intention of commencing rehearsals in June. However Training Band 1st public appearance - 2nd December 2023 wisdom dictated that longer should be spent in planning and preparation to ensure a successful launch. Four weeks after the end of the summer break the Training Band was finally launched on 4th October and held its first public appearance at our HQ playing a simple selection of festive music (in unison) after just 9 rehearsals, during MCC's Christmas Fair - pictured top right.

We began 2024 with ambitions to develop the repertoire introducing 4 part harmonics using the 'Ernie Waites Level 1' series Training Band 1st formal concert 20th April 2024

for beginner to intermediate wind bands. The Training Band, with support from Concert Band mentors, worked really hard in preparation for their first formal appearance playing a spot during our Spring Showcase Concert on 20th April 2024 after just 25 rehearsals - pictured bottom right. At an hour each, 25 rehearsals is a little over 1 day in total.

The second formal showcase of our Training Band was part of the wider Summer Concert at the Irish Centre on 30th June 2024 and demonstrated still further progression as we performed the final three pieces from the Level 1 series compiled by Ernie Waites. So ended a very successful inaugural season and every credit to the aspiring musicians and their mentors (from the concert band) for their dedication and commitment. Subsequent performances by our Training Band during the 24/25 season are covered elsewhere in this review.



Season 2024/25 Review Part 2: December 2024 — April 2025

The band enjoyed (and endured) another busy festive season, providing the music at events held at MCC. As well as these, we played at other Christmas dates in the local community, including Herristone Park's Fair, Tree Light Switch On events in MCC's grounds organised by 'Cleaner Crumpsall' and at St Thomas's in Lower Crumpsall, St Matthew's Carol Service (Carols by Candlelight) under the baton of guest Conductor Michael Fawcett (Radcliffe Brass Band), and finished off our run of 'gigs' with Carols for patrons at the Woodthorpe Hotel on Thursday 19th December, pictured right.



In amongst all these dates, we were honoured to be asked to play for Together Dementia Support's Christmas Concert held at the iconic, historic venue of Manchester Cathedral on Sunday 15th December. The band played for the opening and close of the event, and three carols for the 'Carol-oke'.



The top three chosen by the audience were Silent Night, O Little Town of Bethlehem and favourite, Away in a Manger. We thank the charity for inviting us to be a part of such a wonderful afternoon of music, with very poignant messages about the amazing impact music and song can have on people living with dementia. This was brought still closer to home as we watched one of our stalwart supporters Margaret Humphreys sing with The Choir That Can!

A further Crumpsall Connection:

The Cathedral Concert was opened by the Deputy Lord Lieutenant (The King's representative), Carl Austin-Behan, a Crumpsall Lad and former member of the 42nd Manchester Boys Brigade band (St Matthew's with St Mary's Church,

Crumpsall) in the 1980's. Carl is pictured above front and centre with the band in front of the magnificent Christmas Tree in the Cathedral and right addressing the congregation.




Season 2024/25 Review Part 2: December 2024 – April 2025 (Cont)






After the festive break, both Training and Concert Bands were back in rehearsal on 8th January. The Training Band performed the first event of 2025 holding a well-received concert interactive workshop for Crumpsall's Rainbows, Brownies and Guides (and their families) Monday 3rd February – something they hope to repeat later in the year.

Then it was full steam ahead finalising the set for our Spring Concert (once again featuring both our bands) held at MCC on 5th April 2025 and billed as Top of the Pops. Music from our Concert Band included selections from Simon & Garfunkel, Queen, Aha, Led Zeppelin, ELO, Neil Diamond, Stevie Wonder, Tom Jones and David Bowie. The Training Band set comprised the theme from Eastenders (a hit for Anita Dobson) and the world wide smash hit by Celine Dion – My heart will go on – the love theme from the blockbuster film Titanic. The concert was another sell out success and the scene was set for our summer term.



AGM 2024/25 and meet your Executive Committee for 2025/26

At our 24/25 AGM, held following a shortened rehearsal on Wednesday 30th April 2025, we were pleased to welcome two new additions to the Executive Committee, Julie Thompson and Angie Barrett both of whom expressed interest when the invitation was issued to all members several weeks in advance of the AGM. We also expressed fond farewells to long serving committee colleague Nicky Kay (2012-2025) and Ruthanna Stamp (2022-2024).



The Exec now boasts the experience of two former Chairs, Julie and current Vice Chair Barbara Shaw who served as the first Chair of the band from our formation in 1993 to the turn of the century. **Angie**, being relatively new to the band, brings a fresh pair of eyes and bucket loads of enthusiasm to our Executive dynamic and so we move forward with enhanced optimism with some important challenges facing us in the months ahead - not least the recruitment of a new conductor following Maren's retirement announcement at the AGM – see the Conductor update later in this issue.

A long overdue revised Constitution was also approved as were the previous year's accounts and grateful thanks to all Exec colleagues and those undertaking non-Exec support roles that help to keep the band on track; working tirelessly throughout the year, often behind the scenes. RF

Season 2024/25 Review Part 3: May — August 2025

And so, to the final term of our 32nd season:

Broughton House, Sat 10th May 2025

Whilst the festive season is a short but intense period of performances for the band our second busiest period, in a standard year, is the summer term. This year the nation has celebrated and commemorated the 80th Anniversary of VE (Victory in Europe) Day with the actual anniversary being on 8th May. Fittingly, on Saturday 10th May, our summer term engagements began with a performance at Broughton House Veterans Retirement Home in Prestwich where we shared the bill with Vera Lynn tribute artist **Sarah Dennis**, dubbed the Veteran's Sweetheart. The band, (conducted by **Dominic Ferguson**), and singer alternated two sets each with ours featuring traditional marches as well as Swing the Mood and Vera Lynn Medleys. It was a lovely afternoon, patriotic setting and a privilege to entertain the veterans, staff and other guests. Thanks to Broughton House for making us so welcome and to alto sax player **Carole** for coordinating arrangements for the event.

Concert in partnership with Together Dementia Support (TDS), Fri 16th May 2025

The following Friday, the band performed an afternoon set at MCC for those living with dementia and supported by TDS staff, volunteers and carers with much of the music chosen by the group. Music included: Stupid Cupid, Congratulations, Singing in the Rain and medleys featuring classics from Elvis Presley and Neil Diamond. The concert was facilitated by grant funding obtained by the band from Forever

Manchester to work with the TDS charity and thanks to Caroline for preparing and submitting our bid. Grateful thanks



to Committee Colleagues **Caroline**, **Julie** & **Angie** for organising and co compering this event and to guest conductor **Mike Fawcett** of Radcliffe Brass Band. Everyone had a great time and a touching moment was captured of an impromptu dance in the aisle during our rendition of Elvis's 'Can't help falling Love'. Fingers crossed, all bodes well for a repeat event in the future as we continue to develop our partnership with TDS.

Bandemonium, Bury Town Centre, Sat 14th June 2025



Making our 7th appearance at this annual event in Bury Town Centre, we were once again sited on 'The Rock' outside M&S and The Range where we played 2 sets between 1 and 3pm. The footfall was generally good on a day that despite warm sunny spells always threatened wet weather. The rain held off

for the vast majority of our performance. However, with two pieces to play the heaven's opened and we cut the set short to give us a

Our audience certainly played their part with great singing and flag waving during Cockney Cocktail, Vera Lynn Medley, Land of Hope & Glory and others. It was all captured for posterity for a creative arts film covering amateur creative enterprises across North Manchester which premiered at the Irish World Heritage Centre on 19th August – see article later in this issue.


