Dear all,

As you may know, during the past few months I have struggled with my health. I also have responsibilities at Church and work, other musical commitments and caring responsibilities.

Recent deterioration in my health has meant that I have not been able to devote the attention to developing the Band that you deserve; so I could not take the band, or the Band/MD relationship, as far forward as I had hoped. This is not fair to the band. It is with regret, therefore, that I must resign as MD.

YOUR VIEW'S MATTER – final instalment from the questionnaire:

Recruitment & Sustainability. In terms of Recruitment we had lots of responses on how we might attract new players as follows:


- Word of Mouth we are our best sales force; please spread the word
- Posters in various key locations and via social media Caroline and Catherine have designed a fantastic recruitment poster (see right) and if you can display them at workplaces or communal venues please ask C & C for some copies and thank you.
- Contact past players always a good one to try if any of you are still in touch with any former players?
- Stalls at Community Events where we are playing we have several such events coming up which will be a good opportunity to spread the word and hand out posters.



In terms of sustainability, particularly looking at the prospect of potentially establishing a youth (feeder) band, whilst respondents thought this was a good idea for the longer term, there was also recognition of potential barriers. Some positive responses around partnering with local educational establishments got us thinking about a local collaboration with a rejuvenated Crumpsall Scout & Guide Band based at the Methodist Church; perhaps with some assistance from experienced CCB members? At our Committee meeting of 9th September this was supported as a 'slow burner' and please watch this space for future developments. In the meantime, if anyone feels this project is something they could support in helping local young people develop their musical potential, please let me know? There is a real historical precedent here of course; our Concert Band can trace its roots back more than quarter of a century to when it was formed from the ranks of the Crumpsall Scout & Guide Band in 1993; how fitting therefore if the two bands could be mutually supportive of each other to promote longer term sustainability of music making in the area.

IN MEMORY OF ERIC WILLEN – Sadly, **Eric** passed away, following a battle with illness, on 5th October 2019. Eric, a former professional trumpet player with a ballet company played regularly with the band from the late 2000's to 2015 and guested with us several times before becoming a regular member. Most notably, Eric guested with us at the prestigious Commonwealth Games Concert, Longford Park in Aug 2002 where we were the support band before the Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra took the stage. Our sincere condolences to Eric's family and friends at this difficult time and we celebrate and give thanks for Eric's life in music and time in our ranks.
