#### MUSIC MATTERS: 2020/21 - the final rehearsals and a 'big band' finish:

#### Rehearsal Snap-Shot & Diary Record - 30<sup>th</sup> June - 14<sup>th</sup> July 2021:





^ Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> June 2021 – Rehearsal #7 2021: A good turn out of 25 on another warm summer's evening at Broadhurst Park. Debut for James Wilson on Trombone (see Band News section page 5) with Alan turning our attention to the end of season concert.





< Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> July – Rehearsal #8 2021: An early start / early finish rehearsal to accommodate England's Euro 2020 Semi Final against Denmark. Every credit that we still managed a turnout of 23 and with only one more rehearsal

before the concert it was important we were able to meet to keep momentum going. **The flutes** are pictured in the rustic setting by the FC Tractor with **Stuart** (Bass Clarinet) finding the trailor a good perch for his instrument case . This was to be our last week with bell covers; clearly visible on **Joe's** trombone, nearest the camera above right. They have served us well even though never strictly required outdoors and the decision to dispense with them for outdoor use at least, was universally welcomed.

Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup>
July – rehearsal #9
2021 (the 16<sup>th</sup> and final one of the 20/21 season):
The set list (left) was handed out and a fantastic turnout of 32 (our highest for a



rehearsal of the entire season) saw **Alan** work us through the playing


order until handing over to **Joe** to conduct the last two numbers of the first half set, whilst Alan joined the bass section on his trademark Tuba. Welcome back to Carole on Alto Sax for her first physical rehearsal since March 2020 although she has been pretty much ever present on Zoom for our FC United sessions. Really thorough workout this evening and we were now as ready as we could be. Final arrangments for the 'big night' were relayed and uniform ties and badges were handed out at the end to those who needed.

#### Blowing away the Lockdown Cobwebs - End of Season Summer Concert - 21st July 2021:



The last evening of a prolonged heatwave and Broadhurst Park basked in the high 20°s as the band and audience arrived at the home of FC United for our first full band outing

since the summer concert of 20<sup>th</sup> July 2019 – two years and one day ago – wow! So much has changed in all our lives and in and around our band since then. Welcomed by our CCB Event Officers, Karen and Mary, pictured left, resplendent in their CCB Hi-Vis vests, the band, all 33 of us, were informed of their West Stand seat positions on arrival and the audience, numbering 55, were shown to dedicated seating in the Main Stand. A fantastic evening was enjoyed by all and the feedback we have received has been magnificent. It was certainly a significant and emotional milestone to be back be playing to a live audience and I'll let the pictures do the talking. Didn't we look the part! #### A TRIBUTE TO – Cyril Weinkove; 17<sup>th</sup> April 1938 – 14<sup>th</sup> July 2021

On the evening of Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> July, Cyril Weinkove passed away suddenly at his home. On behalf of Crumpsall Concert Band, sincerest condolences extend to his wife Liz, sons Robert, Ben and Andrew and the wider Weinkove family in the UK, South Africa, New Zealand, USA and Canada and to all his many friends & colleagues; may he rest in peace and all hearts be comforted in this wish.



Cyril, 83, had been an active, inspirational member of our band for over two decades and was a loveable character and friend to all. He served the band with that trademark grin, sense of humour and excellent musicianship on his beloved clarinet and bass clarinet whilst also serving 'his stint' on the Band Committee some ten years ago. Even through lockdown and illness, Cyril was until, relatively recently, still an active participant with the band; his remarkable grasp of technology (the first time I had ever seen an i-Pad used instead of physical sheet music) enabled him to participate on regular Zooms and our first 4 Lockdown recordings between April and September 2020. The montage below encapsulates Cyril's time in the band and I hope helps recall many happy memories.


Just before Cyril passed, close friends and fellow band stalwarts, Derek Farnell and Alan Bernstein had met at Cyril's house to play as a trio and whilst the first attempt was a 'work-in-progress' they were due to meet again on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> July for another go, this time all playing clarinet. Sadly this was not meant to be, however on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> July, Alan and former band member Eva Kahan did meet up with Cyril and played as a clarinet trio. Speaking with Alan at Cyril's funeral last Thursday, "He, [Cyril], loved it " and this I am sure will provide some comfort to his wider musical family. #### Memories of Cyril - by Julie Thompson (Tenor Sax) & Hilary Hill (Oboe) and other band tributes:



I will miss Cyril a great deal, his infectious smile and cheerful disposition could always be relied upon at band practice. I spent many hours with him attending band committee meetings at Derek's house, where he would participate with an upbeat optimism which made many a meeting more enjoyable. My fondest memory of Cyril was when we were in Bremen (Band trip to Germany, August 2011 Pic left), which we visited the day after our joint concert with a German band in Bremerhaven. We were being taken on a guided tour of the beautiful historical Bremen town centre, which had very narrow maze-like walkways, imagine a German version of York. It quickly became apparent that we would have to take it in turns to be on 'Cyril watch' as he had a tendency to lag behind or wander off looking at something that had caught his eye. Not wanting to go home with less band members than we came with, we realised we needed to keep a close eye on him, gently reminding him that the guide had moved on and that we needed to keep up with the others. It was a real pleasure and honour to know Cyril, he will be missed at every rehearsal and concert, my thoughts are with his family and friends at this difficult time. Julie

Some of you already know that Cyril Weinkove suggested I take up a hobby or past interest to prevent the 'mischief' of idle hands (eating food) in 2005. Cyril was my hospital consultant. On finding out at a discharge meeting that I had a very old oboe which hadn't been touched since school he had me hand it to him for him to take it to be serviced. We met the following week at Crumpsall Concert Band and he became my front row friend at band; the rest is history. (*Pic: King Cyril and Queen Hilary – Ordsall Hall Gig Dec 2019>>*) "Caught in the act" (*St. Trinian's motto*) I have many memories of Cyril a kind, clever, fun-loving and very generous gentleman. I can still hear Cyril's Ealing comedy Margaret Rutherford Headteacher voice calling the mischievous band (St. Trinians) to order. This was just one of his many voices. Cyril was at the centre of much fun and laughter in Bremerhaven Germany (2011). On the ferry we heard the tannoy more than once calling for 'Mr Weinkove'. For starters, Cyril mistakenly selected the coach driver's suitcase to take on the ferry overnight and not surprisingly the coach driver wanted it back. On stage, during the concert, Cyril's mobile phone rang which fortunately most people didn't hear. He said it was his architect! One evening



out Cyril placed a heart shaped ring on my finger with a number on it. It turned out that was how you paid the bar tab in Germany and all I had to do was wave it at the waitress during the evening for our table. Cyril was quick to own up in rehearsals even when on some occasions it wasn't him. These confessions often deflected the spotlight from other band members and nurtured a fun rehearsal environment. Our best tribute for Cyril would be to continue having fun and laughter with Crumpsall Concert Band. Hilary (Oboe)

That is such sad news x (Jo, Flute). Sad news, he was a lovely gentleman. Jane (Trombone). That is very sad news, he was very friendly and welcoming in my first couple of weeks at band last year! He was very technically adept and had all his music uploaded to his iPad. Cyril loved playing music and was in numerous small

ensembles on top of playing in the band. We spent many entertaining hours at Cyril's house playing trios and quartets. Liz was always very patient with us all invading the house (loudly)! Alan and Cyril always made a good comedy double act during our rehearsals and would bounce off each other. Whenever we had a gig to go to Cyril would always check that I was ok getting there and would offer a lift. A gentleman through and through. I will very much miss Cyril. #### CCB HQ Move 2021 – From St Matthew's Parish Hall via FC United to Methodist Church Crumpsall:







**Update #1:** As announced to those present at our summer concert, after 28 years use of St Matthew's Parish Hall as our HQ and rehearsal space, your committee has used the enforced, prolonged absence from indoor rehearsals to assess our options for the future. This unique opportunity has allowed us to look strategically and in detail at what the band's requirements might be as we move forward towards our 4th decade. We have certainly

not rushed into any decision or taken a knee jerk approach and indeed started to look at alternative options around 6 months ago. Only after much deliberation back and forwards, have we emerged with a solution that we believe will serve the band's aspirations well for many years to come. This includes a strategic sustainable model for the band such as a training band option and for this and similar development opportunities we required exclusivity of tenancy on our chosen evening as well as unrestricted all year-round access to our stores. Both of these key measures will be satisfied by our move to MCC whilst becoming a diminishing option at the increasingly busy St Matthew's Hall. Both ourselves and the Parochial Church Council of St Matthew with St Mary recognise and respect each other's position and both parties will continue to interact and operate to the benefit of our respective communities and the wider community of Crumpsall and our surrounds. Further details and practicalities of the move will be included in the next issue (Update #2) and if anyone has any queries or would be free to assist in the physical move, likely to take place towards the end of August please let us know.
