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R LATEST - An update on progress with recruitment and contingency arrangements:

Since our AGM on 13th April, the good news is we have so far received 3 high quality applications for the position of our Principal Conductor and all three have accepted their invitation to audition.

Audition rehearsals will take place on *Wednesdays* 1st, 8th and 15th June and a good turnout of the band, always important anyway, will be especially important for the auditions as member views will be a key component in the selection process. Early arrival to help set up and ensure we are ready to play at 7.30pm would also be appreciated, thanks. The format of the auditions (1 candidate per rehearsal) will be as follows:

- 19:00 arrival and initial welcome
- 19:10 pre-rehearsal prep time
- 19:30 rehearsal commences selected pieces to be advised in advance (based around our busy performing schedule)
- 20:05 refreshment break and a chance to circulate, meet and chat with members over a brew
- 20:20 Q&A with Committee members very much a two-way conversation (rest of band continue rehearsing)
- 20:50 observe the last 10 minutes of the rehearsal which ends at 21:00 and any further questions / comments.

After each audition, an e-form will be emailed inviting the comments and thoughts of members who wish to put these forward, whilst still fresh in the memory. Comments received will help inform the decision-making process.

Contingency arrangements:

With Alan's availability week to week being uncertain (the reason he has stepped back into a supportive / playing role) we are grateful



that Joeseph Atkinson has kindly agreed to provide stability as our interim conductor from 18th May for the remainder of the summer term. This allows us the opportunity to not only fulfil our busy programme of events, but the time to undertake a robust recruitment exercise as detailed above. In addition, **Dominic Ferguson** has kindly offered to support in a conducting capacity when available and if required too. We hope to make an appointment of **Principal Conductor** at the end of June with the successful candidate fully commencing the role from September 2022 when we begin our 2022/23 season, after a well-earned summer break. **Any questions please let me or a committee colleague know. MUSIC MATTERS: Power of Music, Programme Planning, Easter Reviews, Library Corner:

Music for the Summer Term – Programme Planning for the busy term ahead:



SOLD BLOOKER SO A proper glance at our Calendar Dates underlines our busy schedule during June and early July. It also underlines what we have all been missing for the last two years and that communities value as much now, than ever before, the contribution of live music to their events. This year in particular we have many events centred around the Queen's Platinum Jubilee too.

Some of the dates require less than a full band, others such as the Community Jubilee event 12/06, Bandemonium 18/06, Prestwich Carnival 26/06 and our Summer Concert 09/07 require full bands. In the coming weeks, therefore, we need to develop programmes of music adaptable to different band sizes and specific events.

All of this whilst managing the challenge of recruiting a new Principal Conductor and, seeking a percussionist to help us out at the larger events in particular. For many of the smaller jobs, the Tunes and Toasts book (100 pieces 'for all times') will be important along with some former pieces that have recently been reintroduced such as Klezmer Carnival and Tijuana Brass.

With Alan hopefully available as back up when required and in parallel with the aforementioned recruitment, we will be working closely with Joe Atkinson when he breaks for the summer from University and Joe is scheduled to take his first rehearsal on 18th May and lead us through the summer schedule of rehearsals and events. Joe's views on programme selections will be important during this phase and member input, sympathetic to the jobs we have lined up, will be considered too. With all of us pulling together in the coming term I am sure we can do ourselves justice in any setting, and regular attendance at rehearsals and events will be very much appreciated. RF

Performance Reviews – Good Friday & the Easter Sunday 'Eggstravaganza' event 2022:



The end of our Spring term , as is often the case, was signified by Easter / Passover festivals and the band was called upon twice over the Easter weekend of 15th – 17th April. 
Our Library is filling up nicely and still turning up historical scores:




A week before our first rehearsal of the current season last September, we moved 634 fully catalogued pieces of music into our new library in the band room at MCC. Thanks to the diligence of our Librarian, Sue Atkinson, a further 101 had been added to that total as at 13th April. As Sue works her way through unsorted pieces, occasionally, historical gems are revealed. The piece below is stamped as the former property of the Victoria Hall Silver Band, Ancoats, Manchester. Alongside the music was a picture and plan of the Hall, dated 16th August 1907. Further research reveals the following:

Opened on 30 September 1897 Victoria Hall stood in Daniel St, New Islington described as "the densest, neediest, and seediest quarter of

Ancoats." It was built on the site of Daniel Street Wesleyan Chapel, founded in 1835 and demolished in 1896 to make way for the building of Victoria Hall. The magnificent building fell into disuse and was demolished in 1956 and this is likely to have spelt the demise of the Silver Band that bore the Hall's name, around the same time. How we came by the music, there is no clue, but it is likely that it came via Derek Farnell through one of his many banding connections and thus found its way into our library to be duly sorted by Sue.

Committee News from the Peard Band Room - AGM Review and more from your Committee:

AGM 2020/21 held at MCC on 13th April 2022 – Key points and the election of your 2022/23 Committee:

Intro: Unlike the band season, which typically runs parallel to the academic year (September – August) the band's financial and administrative year runs parallel to the tax year (6th April – 5th April). Therefore, as we enter the final term of our 21/22 band season we begin the start of our 22/23 financial year.

Open to all members, our 20/21 AGM was held after a shortened rehearsal on 13th April with 22 in attendance. I provided a review of 20/21 in my Chair's Report and **Stuart** updated those present with our year-end financial position. Electronic copies of the AGM reports will be provided to all members shortly.

Committee Elections 2022/23: As a founder member of our band, I remain humbled and privileged to serve as your Chair once more and am delighted to confirm that fellow 2020/21 committee colleagues, **Stuart Atkinson, Sue Atkinson** and **Nicky Kay** have agreed to stay on in their roles too, and thank them for helping steer the band out of the pandemic restrictions and into a state, akin to normality, over the past 12 months.

Furthermore I am delighted, further inspired and motivated by the recruitment of two additional members joining our Committee; **Barbara Shaw** and **Ruthanna Stamp**, both of whom will bring complementary skillsets to support the management of our band as we move through into our 30th Anniversary year, which begins on 25th July 2022 ending on our 30th Birthday; 24th July 2023.

Barbara, the original Chair of the Band Committee in July 1993 and serving in this role for 8 years until July 2001, returns to support fundraising and the further enhancement of links between the band and community groups in and around Crumpsall. **Ruthanna**, who joined us on Trumpet last May, brings a youthful dynamic to our committee and, as you may have noted already, is keen to enhance our presence on social media, in particular Instagram, aiming to further raise our profile to reach a wider audience.

<u> A CCB Tribute to – Mrs Rosa Slater 31/12/1926 – 26/04/2022:</u>

On Tuesday 26th April, peacefully, whilst in hospital, 96 years young Mrs Rosa Slater passed away and our thoughts and prayers extend to her daughter Caroline and family and all her many friends, at this difficult time. Rosa's funeral will take place at Blackley Crematorium at 12 noon on Wednesday 11th May followed by the Woodthorpe Hotel where Rosa enjoyed many parties down the years. The family have requested no flowers please and not to wear black in support of a colourful celebration of Rosa's life. Thank you



Crumpsall born and bred, Rosa has been part of the fabric of the area and community for almost a century and will be fondly remembered as leader of the 7th Crumpsall Guides for many years and also an avid supporter of Crumpsall Concert Band and our forebears, the Crumpsall Scout & Guide Band. She

was also a long standing respected member of the congregation at Methodist Church Crumpsall and Crumpsall Park Methodist Church before that.

Rosa's vivacious laugh, registering many decibels, is one of the many memories of Rosa that all who knew and loved her will cherish. As a young girl, Rosa loved to dance, and play netball and represented Crumpsall Lane School in both. Being famously patriotic, Rosa joined the Wrens during WWII aged 17 and was ultimately stationed in Warrington as a wireless operator. After her service for King and Country, it was back to Crumpsall and Rosa married Jack and worked for many years in the NHS as a wages clerk (a fellow payroller, how about that ^(C)), based at Booth Hall Children's Hospital but it was her service to the community through her church membership and Guiding (alongside her late husband Jack who was Scout Leader) where Rosa will be most fondly remembered. In tribute here follows just a few of the many pictures depicting a fraction of Rosa's legacy and hope you enjoy the selection:

7th Crumpsall Guides:

Rosa, whilst inspiring her leadership colleagues, embraced everything that Guiding is about and championed her young charges, driving and encouraging them to fulfil their potential to the best of their abilities during their time in the movement and beyond. She mentored



so **many Queen's Guides and Baden Powell Trefoil holders down the years** and never tired of her commitment to their futures. A lasting and fitting legacy to a formidable leader of integrity and passion:

Dennis Featherstone. This group of guides would graduate to become the first ever Ranger Guide Unit at 7th Crumpsall under the leadership of Rosa and Jack's daughter Caroline Slater.

Pictured left are the same 5 Guides paying Rosa a surprise visit last Christmas, 52 years after becoming Queen's Guides. What a legacy and testimony to the positive influence Rosa engendered through her role in Guiding on this group of guides and so many others down the years as can be seen below:





Pictured here are the 7th Crumpsall Queen's Guide Class of 1983 at their presentation evening at Methodist Church Crumpsall on 17th June. Far left **Sue Scott** (now Harman), **Jeanette Smith** (now Gorner) and **Karen Smith** (now Fullen) as a proud Rosa tells a packed church all about their achievements. And the legacy marches on C.



Rosa never forgot the important role parents played either and Mums Enid Smith and Jean Scott were not to leave the presentation ceremony empty handed as pictured left. Enid and Jean both served as leaders in Cubs and Beavers and with the 434th Scout Group and Enid still supports the band's fundraising with her handmade greetings cards. Rosa, also cherished the support of her leadership colleagues (friends) and on the same evening presented fellow guider Margaret Lynch (who sadly passed away last December, as remembered in our December 2021 issue) with flowers and a certificate as thanks for all



her support in Guides as **Margaret moved on to become the Ranger Unit Leader** for the joint Ranger / Venture Scout group that went on to work so well together through the 1980's and early 90's.

Crumpsall Scout & Guide Band



Rosa loved the Scout & Guide Band and would always be afforded a place of honour at the top table at our Annual Inspections (as pictured left on 18th November 2005 next to her husband Jack as the Inspecting Officer, the Late Don Lord, delivers his verdict). Rosa very soon recognised the importance of the band as an activity for Scouts and

her Guides and understood how her young charges would benefit further from being involved in the

band. As the band grew and developed from a local parade band to appear on the National stage, Rosa was at the fore front, being with us every step of the way. In **April 1985** the band, on a three mile plus District St Georges Day parade (pic top right) got a soaking and Rosa, without any prompting, organised a Jumble Sale at MCC to raise funds. The next thing we knew we had a full complement of yellow waterproofs with our logo printed on the back and never went unnoticed or got wet again thereafter, as pictured right.







Rosa arguably inspired the performance of our lives – Royal Albert Hall, London, where Crumpsall Scout & Guide Band became Contest Class National Champions 21/03/1992: "At 2.25pm on we went into complete darkness directed across the stage and down the ramps to the famous red floor of the hall, by stewards holding torches. 'Come on Crumpsall' boomed and echoed from the vocal cords of loyal supporter and Guide Leader, Rosa Slater, from somewhere in the seats where our supporters were gathered, prompting many cheers and deafening applause." . (An extract from the 'Lynch Report' about our day in London – CSGB Band News April 1992 –by David Lynch) A special, inspirational moment of classic Rosa that still makes the hairs on the back of my neck stand on end when I recall the occasion. RF

Crumpsall Concert Band:



Following the formation of the independent Crumpsall Marching Band (that went on to become the Crumpsall Concert Band we know today) in July 1993, Rosa didn't hesitate to jump on board to actively support us through our formative first decade by serving as our Committee Secretary when many would have been contemplating retirement. Rosa, famous for organising her fundraising jumble sales did so on behalf of the band too.
