CONDUCTOR RECRUITMENT LATEST - An update on progress with recruitment:



The good news is we have received 3 high quality applications for the position of our Principal Conductor and all three have accepted their invitation to audition with us.

Audition rehearsals will take place on *Wednesdays* 1st, 8th and 15th June and a good turnout of the band, always important anyway, will be especially important for the auditions as member views will be a key component in the selection process. To present the best impression, early arrival to help set up and ensure we are ready to play at 7.30pm would be appreciated, thanks. The format of the auditions (1 candidate per rehearsal) will be as follows:

- 19:00 arrival and initial welcome
- 19:10 pre-rehearsal prep time
- 19:30 rehearsal commences selected pieces to be advised in advance (based around our busy performing schedule)
- 20:05 refreshment break and a chance for the candidate to circulate, meet and chat with members over a brew
- 20:20 Q&A with Committee members very much a two-way conversation (rest of band continue rehearsing)
- 20:50 observe the last 10 minutes of the rehearsal which ends at 21:00 and any further questions / comments.

Our first Candidate, on the 1st June, has selected to rehearse with us the following pieces as well as the set piece Disney at the Movies: Pop & Rock Legends – Neil Diamond and Eighties Flashback. Please ensure we are all sat down with the three pieces to hand and ready to play just before 19:30. Thank you.

After each audition, an e-form will be emailed inviting the comments and thoughts of members who wish to put these forward, whilst still fresh in the memory. Comments received will help inform the decision-making process of the preferred candidate.

Library Corner – Our Library continues to reveal its historical secrets:



Friedrich Feher's - The Robber Symphony: Sue, relentlessly sorting through our huge catalogue of music, has come across a historical gem which one day, may find itself in our pads? The Robber Symphony features in the film of the same name from 1936 (which is available to watch free on YouTube) and which I am reliably informed, features a bassoon player who bears a striking resemblance to Charlie Chaplin. The score originally belonged to the 'David Lewis Military Band' active in the 1920's and 30's which ties in with date of the score.

Also pictured is the back of the score featuring an advert to join the **Chappell Military Band Club** where, member bands could access a minimum of 24, 36 part pieces for an annual subscription of £2, 2 Shillings (£2.10) and additional parts at 2 Shillings and 2d (12p). *'Better Value Impossible'* as the advert boldly claims. If we didn't have such a huge back catalogue, maybe this is something we could have signed up to ?

CRUMPSALL CONCERT BAND – Band Heritage Series Part 20: 1979/80 (Part 3):

A new decade dawns; a pivotal one in the context of our band's heritage and we pick up with Part 3 of the 1979/80 season following on from Part 2 back in issue 6. To recap, 1979 saw the Scout & Guide Band rocked by two events that were to leave the band rudderless; Firstly the band's founding bandmaster, Tom Lock, sadly passed away early in the year and his successor, Andrew (Andy) Robinson moved away from Crumpsall, due to work, at the end of 1979. The band recovered and the summer term of the 1979/80 season saw them back out on the streets of Crumpsall with, for the first time, a Chromatic Dimension to our brass section. Three of

the bugle section; **Chris le Carpenter, John Mills and myself**, played cornet in our **High School (***Moston Brook***) Band** and were keen to supplement our Scout & Guide Band repertoire on local parades. Of course all the bugle tunes were still playable on cornet (the cornet plays as a bugle as long as no valves are pressed) so in essence our repertoire was expanded. John and I even handwrote march cards for us and my book , as pictured left, survives to this day. Mainstays of the Chromatic repertoire were, *Men of Harlech* (as pictured),

Toreadors Song, John Brown's Body and Marche Militaire. Note, although a Scout & Guide Band, at this time we were still known as

the **'191st/434th Scout Band'**. Pictured right is the 9 strong band on parade, summer term 1980 for **St Matthew's Church Platinum Jubilee Parade (1910 – 1980)** wheeling off Cleveland Road into Tansley Road outside the Parish Hall. We appear to be leading the **191st Scout Group** contingent.

<u>Front Rank:</u> Phil McConville, Gillian Collison, Ian Phair – side drums <u>Middle Rank:</u> Linda Collison Cymbals, Mike Robinson – Bass Drum, *Unknown* drummer. <u>Back Rank:</u> Chris le Carpenter, John Mills, Rob Fullen – Cornets. This is the only known photo of the three cornets on parade as this was quite a short lived diversion, but good fun while it lasted, with the band reverting to



bugles during the 1980/81 season which is where our story picks up next time, in Part 21. Thanks for reading. RF

Committee News from the Brand Band Room - Update from our latest Committee Meeting:

On Monday 23rd May, Your Committee came together via our old friend 'Zoom' to plan and discuss a two item agenda;

- 1. Yes / No decisions for Summer Term events and programme development
- Pending Conductor auditions x 3 ; early to mid-June 2022

A summary of key decisions and discussion points are as follows:

- Following members advising of avilability for our summer term programme of events (thank you) we decided that all but the first event on the list, Radcliffe Carnival on 4th June, would be viable although we are urgently seeking a percussionist for the full band jobs. We also decided that if we could get sufficient numbers, a two hour extra rehearsal on Saturday 4th June, instead of the carnival, would be a good use of the time, particularly to help Joe rehearse the summer programme having only just got back from University. We also discussed the general contents of our summer programme pads and Joe began to firm this up at our rehearsal on 25th May. - 2. We reconfirmed the format and timings for the forthcoming audition rehearsals to be held on Wednesdays 1st, 8th and 15th June. We also decided on a set piece that each of the candidates would rehearse with us and then the provision of List A and List B containing four other pieces on each from the list of music scheduled to be included in our summer programme pads. These lists were firmed up at our rehearsal on 25th May with candidates required to select one of their choice from each list. Details of these lists were communicated to our first candidate and their selection can be found in the Conductor Recruitment Latest section of this newsletter on Page 2 above.

laking Memories as time 'marches' on – What were we up to as a band in May '19,20 & 21?:

May 2021: Our 9th and final and probably our best produced (certainly the most amusing) Lockdown Recording, the **Muppet Show Theme**, was released on 15th May ahead of returning to outdoor rehearsals at FC United's Broadhurst Park Stadium on 19th May 2021 where **Alan** conducted us for the first time since 11th March 2020. An understandable slow start: 19 of the band cautiously registering to attend in person.



May 2020: With the initial lockdown kicking in before we had managed to arrange our 2020 Spring Concert, our first gig of the year was a virtual affair as we merged early lockdown recordings **Celtic Crest** and **Mamma Mia** with an introduction from yours truly (filmed outside our then deserted rehearsal hall at St Matthew's during our 1 hour allocated for daily outdoor exercise) submitting the combined video to the **Cheetham Cultural Festival's Spring Fling** that was streamed as if live, on Sunday 31st May 2020.



May 2019: A bit like this year, we had no gigs during May 2019 but we were seekeing membership music preferences. This was to help our relatively new conductor **Rosie Kingham**, select pieces from our library that were reflective of the membership's preferences whilst leaving her the room to select her own choices too. The 4 week consultation opened on 15th May 2019.
