#### GENERAL SUBMISSIONS

General submissions are open January-March for the Fall issue (closed April-May-June) and July-October for the Spring issue (closed November-December).

January 1 - March 31 general submissions are open to Poetry, Flash Fiction, Short Fiction (March 1 -31).

July 1 - October 31 general submissions are open to Poetry and Flash Fiction.

October 1 - October 31 general submissions are open to Short Fiction.

#### FEE FREE WINDOWS

Open on Duosuma for the following:

Dec 10 - Dec 25 submissions are open to poets who are experiencing a financial hardship.

June 1 - June 30 we allow fee free submissions for our flash fiction contest.

Nov 1 - Dec 31 we allow fee free submissions for our Dlgiorno multi-genre and our Laux/Millar contests.

#### FEE FREE SUBMISSION WAIVER

We do not offer submission waivers because we offer fee free periods, see those windows above.

We are open to any and all fee free queries from any writer who truly cannot swing the small convenience fee to submit short fiction during the months of March and October. You may keep your specific demographic information and reason to yourself. We just want to see quality work, your reasons if you choose to offer them, etc. These should be sent to the attention of our publisher at [info@raleighreview.org](mailto:info@raleighreview.org)

Also note that we offer a fee free window that opens in December. You may also try the magazine project Raleigh Review helped to launch and continues to sponsor, The Fool's World, when they are open to submissions.



#### CONTEST SUBMISSIONS:

Submissions for our Laux/Millar RR Poetry Book Prize is open during Even Years.

Submissions for our Flash Fiction Prize are open Every Year.

Submissions for our Multi-Genre Geri Digiorno Prize is open during Odd Years.

For the Digiorno Prize (odd years) and The Laux/Millar Prize (even years) – Nov - Dec are fee free.

Raleigh Review is a nonprofit magazine of poetry, fiction, and art. We believe that great literature inspires empathy by allowing us to see the world through the eyes of our neighbors, whether across the street or across the globe. Our mission is to foster the creation and availability of accessible yet provocative contemporary literature.

We are looking for poetry, flash fiction, and short fiction that is emotionally and intellectually complex. We read every piece for its intrinsic value, so new/emerging voices are often published along nationally recognized, award-winning authors.

#### General Guidelines

Submissions are welcomed via [Submittable](#). There is a small fee for submitting online. Including a brief cover letter and/or bio is fine, but not required. Simultaneous submissions are acceptable and encouraged. For fiction especially, if your work is accepted elsewhere (congratulations!), please withdraw it from [Submittable](#).

For poetry, there is no need to withdraw your submission unless multiple poems have been placed elsewhere. You always have the option to decline a contract. If you feel you must notify us, please send us a message via [Submittable](#).

#### Further Clarification Regarding Reprints on Poems

We want to be the first magazine to publish your work, and we want all new work. That said, if a poem has only appeared in your book or chapbook or is set to appear in your book, those works may still be submitted to us just so long as you have the rights to your own work. Please note, we only allow reprint rights for poetry not found in other magazines. We aim for First North American Rights on everything we publish. While fiction and poetry as well as our contests are all First North American Rights opportunities, all rights revert back to the author on publication.



We publish the hard copy magazine twice a year, with the Spring issue available in April and the Fall issue available in October.

#### Response Time

Response time is typically 1-3 months, but occasionally may be as long as 3-6 months. Fiction currently has a longer turnaround time than poetry. Please feel free to query after 6 months by logging into your Submittable account and sending us a note from the system.

If your work is accepted for publication by us, please refrain from submitting again for a year.

#### For Poetry

Send up to five poems in ONE file (.doc, .docx, .pdf only). We latch onto novel language and images, skilled awareness of sound, visceral reactions. We love a lyric poem and are equally impressed by strong narratives. We want to remember your lines, days later. We want to be surprised and envious.

#### For Flash Fiction

- Works of fiction up to 1,000 words (.doc, .docx, .pdf only).
- We prefer flash fiction with narrative elements (i.e., not only images).
- While we are not looking specifically for speculative and genre fiction, we are open to literary stories with genre elements.

#### For Short Fiction

Works of fiction 1,001 to 7,500 words (.doc, .docx, .pdf only). Note: While we accept up to 7,500 words, stories at the 4,000-5,000 word mark are more likely to be accepted than those that are longer, simply due to space constraints. Please do not combine multiple submissions in one file. While we are not looking specifically for speculative and genre fiction, we are open to literary stories with genre elements. We delight in stories from unique voices and perspectives. Any fiction that is born from a relatively unknown place grabs our attention.

#### For Visual Art

Outside of our Digiorno Multi-Genre Prize, we are currently not accepting submissions for visual art.



#### Book Review Consideration

We occasionally review collections of poetry or short stories (usually no more than 1-2 per issue), which have been recently published or are forthcoming. To request consideration of your book for review, send one copy to Raleigh Review, Box 6725, Raleigh NC 27628. We will notify you if we do choose to review your book. Review copies will not be sold nor returned. Review copies will be donated to readers throughout our region and within the Free Little Library system.

#### Rights and Payment

Optional payment is currently \$15 per work used and one copy of the magazine. Due to the recent changes in the banking industry of validating and over-verifying each payee electronically, as of March 2023 for Raleigh Review, all payments to our poets and writers are now being paid via Paypal on publication. Except in the cases where a poem has appeared in your book or chapbook (and no other magazine), we request First North American Rights on works we publish, and all published content will be included in one or more EBSCO databases and will be available in mobile apps that feature literary works. All rights revert back to the author on publication.

If your writing conveys an emotional and intellectual complexity, submit to Raleigh Review, a mighty fine accessible magazine with an edge at the radical dark of duende!
