JACKSON DALTON NAMED 2023 LILLY ENDOWMENT COMMUNITY SCHOLAR

Jackson Dalton, a senior at Springs Valley High School, has been named the 2023 Lilly Endowment Community Scholar for Orange County.

The son of Joel and Amanda Dalton, Jackson plans to attend Rose Hulman Institute of Technology to study Mechanical Engineering. “For nearly as long as I can remember, one of my favorite pasttimes has been building. Some of my earliest memories are of erecting Lego sets with my grandfather and completing Tinker Crate projects with my sisters. As I have begun the process of narrowing down the direction I would like my path to take, it has become increasingly obvious to me that I would like to pursue a career in engineering,” Jackson wrote in his Lilly Scholarship application essay.

An active member of both Orange County 4-H and the OCCF Youth Council, Jackson has helped at local holiday markets and collected donations for local charities and school activities. He volunteers with Youth Football Camp, served as model leader for a team that designed and presented an affordable house for a Veterans Living Area, and has helped at

Habitat for Humanity building sites.

While attending high school, Jackson played football and golf, and served as a lifter for the cheer squad. A member of the National Honor Society, Spanish Club, Pep Club, and FFA, he also serves as Senior Class President.

Jackson is the 42nd Lilly Scholar from Orange County; and the opportunity provides full tuition, required fees, and a book stipend for four years of undergraduate study at any eligible Indiana public or private college or university as a full-time student.

Those eligible to apply for the 2023 scholarship were required to have an SAT score of 1200 or higher, rank in the top 25% of their class, and be on track to earn an academic honors diploma. They must be residents of Orange County and attend one of the three county schools, or have attended an Orange County for all four years of high school. Only US citizens are eligible.

The application process for Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship is lengthy and arduous. After all personal identifying information is removed, applications are evaluated by the

OCCF Lilly Scholar Committee based on academic skills, character traits, and involvement in community and school. Financial need is also considered. Once the field is narrowed down, finalists are subjected to timed essays and personal interviews. Once evaluations are complete, candidates’ names and evaluation scores are submitted to Independent Colleges of Indiana for final approval of the recipient. Since its inception in 1997, the Lilly Community Scholarship program has provided more than \$486 million in assistance to more than 5,000 students.


